Coach Rafael Benitez would consider leaving Liverpool for a job in Italy, stated his agent on

The Spanish tactician, who is considered one of the best Coaches on the market, is happy to stay at Anfield, although he would consider a Serie A switch in the right circumstances.

"Benitez is a Coach ideally suited to Italy and the country's style of football and he is one of the best three Coaches in the world." said agent Manuel Garcia Quilon to The Sun.

"If he receives an interesting offer from a club with a serious project, he will certainly consider t and in this case he could even leave Liverpool," continued Quilon.

"Benitez is a highly prepared Coach, he works 24 hours a day and is able to train in a way few others in the world can you just need to look at what he has won to see that."

Benitez joined Liverpool from Valencia in 2004, having led the Spanish side to the title and UEFA Cup.

Since then he has won the Champions League, European Super Cup and FA Cup with the Reds, although he has come under fire for his rotation policy

Poll in new controversy

Graham Poll, England's top referee, has found himself embroiled in a fresh row over the way he runs matches after issuing his second bitterly-contested red card in the space of three days.

Everton boss David Moyes was incandescent after Poll issued a straight red card to James McFadden after only 18 minutes of Wednesday night's League Cup tie at home to Arsenal, who went on to win the match 1-0. McFadden was dismissed over

his verbal reaction to Poll's decision to reject Everton's appeal for a penalty following what they regarded as a Philippe Senderos foul on striker Andy Johnson. It later emerged that Poll

believed McFadden had called him "a ... cheat." The Scots winger told reporters he had said Even if he had not been

labelled a cheat, Poll was within his rights to dismiss the Everton

forward for using foul and abusive

language But the suggestion that Poll might have got the wrong end of the stick could not have come at a worse time for him following a similar dispute over his sending

off of Chelsea captain John Terry

during their defeat by Tottenham

on Sunday. Terry has claimed he was given two different versions as to why he received a second yellow card and other Chelsea players have claimed that Poll's comments during the match indicated that he was determined to "teach them a lesson.

The Football Association are examining whether there is any substance to that claim.

Moyes suggested that Poll may have been influenced by the attempts of rival managers, including Arsenal's Arsene Wenger, to suggest that Johnson goes down too easily in the box.

"Andy told me afterwards that he felt he was fouled in the box and it was a penalty," said Moves, "I now feel he is being punished for what other people are saying about him.

"He is being punished because other people are talking about our player when they should be keep-

ing their mouths shut.' Wenger made no comment after the match, opting to deny the media the opportunity to question him over last weekend's touchline

Valencia to keep Tavano

Valencia have turned down several offers for striker Francesco Tavano, revealed the Spanish club's sporting director Amedeo Carboni.

The 27-year-old has struggled to settle in Primera Liga since his 7million-pound summer move from Empoli and has recently been paired with a move to Roma, with Inter and Milan also interested.

"He's been here three month and hasn't had a chance to play, but despite this we have received some incredible offers from some very important clubs," said Carboni.

"However, we have refused them all because we want the chance to see him in action here. Tavano must understand that he has to adapt to the team, not the team adapt to

The striker, who has been competing for a spot on the starting lineup, but David Villa and Fernando Morientes have been preferred to him by Coach Quique Flores so far

However, he finally made his debut with the Spanish outfit on Wednesday, when he was fielded in the Copa del Rev match against Portuense which ended with a 2-0 win.
