## Blockade to be relaxed on CG's positive decision

Decides 14-party

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The Awami League (AL)-led 14-party alliance may relax the ongoing blockade programme if the caretaker government (CG) gave a "positive" decision over the reconstitution of the Election

Commission (EC).

AL President Sheikh Hasina at an emergency meeting with the liaison committee of the 14-party coalition last night discussed details of the blockade programme and its impact on common people and businesses.

The 14-party blockade programme has almost paralysed the country during the last three days. The coalition enforced the non-stop countrywide blockade programme to press home its 11point demand to create a congenial atmosphere for holding a free and

4-party won't accept any change in EC beyond constitution; advisers sit today to thrash out solution from 2-day talks

All major political parties -- except any changes in the EC," BNP BNP and its allies -- participating in the talks with the caretaker government advisers have strongly rec-ommended reconstitution of the Election Commission (EC) for holding a free and fair election.

On the second day of the diaogue yesterday, the Jatiya Party (JP) and Jatiya Oikya Front (JOF) demanded immediate removal of the chief election commissioner (CEC) by any means, an idea opposed strongly by the BNP-led four-party alliance

"We told them that we would not accept anything done beyond the constitution and there is no scope in the constitution to make Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan told reporters after the meeting between the council of advisers and the delegation of four-

party leaders at the state guest-

house Padma. Asked if they would accept any solution worked out by advisers within the ambit of the constitution, Bhuiyan said, "We will have to see the solution first. We cannot say anything in advance."

Bhuiyan was also critical of the recent transfers of government employees by the caretaker government. "These transfers create

instability in the administration. So, it should be stopped immedi-

Asked about the demand of some political parties to take punitive actions against those involved with corruption, the BNP secretary general said, "The only duty of the caretaker government is to conduct election and execute the routine tasks.

Blasting Awami League's (AL) claim of a "peaceful blockade," he said the 14-party's obstruction to vehicular movement and attacking the police held the entire nation

## Shop owners won't sell to Aziz, family

Shop owners of the capital have declared to stop selling products to Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) MA Aziz and his family if he

does not step down by Friday.

Dhaka Metropolitan Shop Owners' Association (DMSOA) made the unusual announcement at a press conference at the Jativa Press Club yesterday saying that their business is being hampered due to the political crisis centring

The DMSOA leaders also said that they will arrange special prayers in mosque after the next Juma prayers so that the 'Almighty makes the CEC see the point and resign from his post', if he does not stand aside by then.

"We would welcome if you [the CECI resign and play a historic role like the former chief justice KM Hasan, otherwise we would have no option but to boycott you in every respect," DMSOA President Md Helal Uddin said holding the CEC responsible for the current political impasse and consequent SEE PAGE 15 COL 3


## Butenis against street violence, behind-the-scenes manipulation

Apparently referring to both Awami League- and BNP-led alliances, US Ambassador in Bangladesh Patricia A Butenis yesterday asked all political parties to stop "pressuring" and "influenc-ing" the caretaker government through street violence or "from behind the scenes".

"I would like to ask the parties...all of them...to stop pressuring and trying to influence the government and advisers-whether they are doing it in the streets through violence or from behind the scenes--for manipulation," Butenis told reporters after a meeting with Finance and Planning Adviser Akbar Ali Khan.

# Blockade continues AL-BNP CLASH to cripple life

Trading was on, albeit on a smaller scale, in Dhaka and Chittagong stock exchanges, and a little activity was noticed inside the Chittagong port.

But tension was mounting as The third day of the countrywide fear of violence ran high at several indefinite blockade enforced by 14-points in the city and elsewhere in party coalition passed peacefully the country as BNP-led four-party alliance held rallies to counter AL demonstrations

The capital still remains cut off from the rest of the country and land ports are still inactive due to the blockade.

Meanwhile, Mongla port still remains inactive, while no goods were transported at Chittagong port although there was a little bit of activity inside the port.

Train communication was disrupted in different places due to the blockade, while a very few launches left Sadarghat Launch Terminal due to low number of passengers.


