are yet to get security. Judge Abdul Awal of the Sixth Assistant Judge's Court Dhaka, who was the only eyewitness of the bomb attack on the two judges of Jhalakathi district, yesterday shared his traumatic experience of

the incident with the audience. Joint District judges Golam Kibria and Harun-Ur-Rashid urged the government to declare the day

as 'black day' while assistant judges Moiibur Rahman, Khademul Kaves, Fazle Elahi Bhuiyan Mahbubur Rahman Sarker and Shahin Uddin as national mourning day. The BJSA Secretary General

Ataur Rahman conducted the meeting and he urged the government to meet their 11-point Mohammad Rafiqul Islam, also the Dhaka District and Sessions Judge, said government had

On January 15-17, the judges observed a token protest against the government's delay in meeting their 11-point demand. The judges also wore black badges during the court proceedings during the token

BJSA's demands include providing personal armed bodyguards, tax-free vehicles, firearms for all judges, armed guards at judges' residences across the country and compensation of Tk 50 lakh to each of the families of the slain judges in Jhalakati bomb attack on November 14 last year.

In addition to their 11-point demand, BJSA placed a three-point demand to the prime minister on December 21 last year at their 55th annual conference. These demands include appointing assistant judges to the vacant posts, giving the district and sessions judges the status of joint secretary and appointing 50 per cent of High Court judges from lower courts.

# Election commissioners unwilling

The CEC even behaved rudely with an adviser to the caretaker government (CG) who went his residence recently to seek his opinion whether he would resign if requested by the CG. Aziz not only refused to do so, he denied that any adviser met him or made any such request. But the adviser later disclosed that he went to the CEC's residence.

Following this, different political parties, professional bodies and civil society personalities are demanding formation of Supreme Judicial Council for his removal from office for such 'serious misconduct'.

The council of advisers is now discussing with major political parties to find out ways to make the Meanwhile. Aziz on Monday said

he is not worried about the growing crisis in the political arena centring demands for his resignation. He is now preparing to announce the schedule for the next election by November 25.

Responding to a query from reporters while leaving office yesterday, the CEC said he is fine. He however declined to respond any other questions.
