2 commit suicide over family feud | Take steps for free, fair

Two people including a man and a woman committed suicide in the city in the early hours of yesterday. Bina Begum, 25, wife of Asad

Mia, a grocer at Sutrapur, committed suicide by hanging herself from the ceiling of her bed room.

Abdus Sattar, a close relative of Asad has been absconding since the incident.

Police said Bina might have committed suicide following alterca-

tion with her husband. Mejbah Uddin Koraishi alias Tipu, 40, also from Sutrapur, committed

suicide by hanging himself from an overhead pipe of the toilette.

Mejbah, told this correspondent that he had a dispute with his wife for long. Police recovered both the bodies in the morning and sent them to Sir Salimullah Medical College Morgue

for autopsy. Two unnatural death cases were filed with Sutrapur Police Station.

Leaders of Sammilita Karmakarta-Karmachari Oikya Parishad in a
