Bangladesh EC has to work transparently for fair polls

UK minister tells Khaleda

Visiting British Minister of State for Trade Ian McCartney said Bangladesh's Election Commission will have to work in a transparent way for holding free and fair elections in the country.

"The Election Commission will have to ensure an effective and transparent election which will be accepted by the majority people of Bangladesh," said the UK minister while talking to reporters after a meeting with BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia at her Banani office yesterday evening.

Blockade relaxed at **Chittagong Port**

Delivery of goods from the premier seaport Chittagong is going to resume today on a limited scale as 14-party coalition relaxed its blockade on rail, road and waterways in Chittagong.

According to sources, the blockading political coalition will allow the goods laden trucks to move from the port to Chittagong city but will continue the blockade on the highways connecting the port city with the capital and other parts of the country.

Chittagong City Mayor ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury address-ing a rally at Lal Dighi Maidan yesterday afternoon asked his followers to allow transporting of

goods up to Chittagong city. But no transport will be allowed to leave or enter the city, he said.

He relaxed the blockade for three days to clear baby foods and perishable items which have been stockpiling in the port yard, according to sources.

The city mayor also went around the port area several times last night with a convoy of trucks carrying blockade supporters. They chanted slogans announcing continuation of the blockade, according to sources.

Dock workers, however, are determined to continue the blockade on the Chittagong Container Terminal (CCT) demanding cancellation of an agreement signed with a private company.

CCT remained paralysed since November 12, due to the dock workers' opposition to leasing out the operation of sophisticated gantry crane to the private com-

The dock workers said the blockade will continue until the agreement is cancelled. They said the agreement should be cancelled as the company Saif Powertec Limited failed to accelerate handling of containers using the gantry

The private company handles 10-12 containers per hour although it was awarded the job for accelerating the speed and to handle at least 25 containers per hour, said a leader

Bangla Bhai's close aide held in Bagmara



Police arrested an accomplice of notorious Bangla Bhai and one of the organisers of banned Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) in Bagmara upazila yesterday.

The arrestee, Manju, was working on a cropland at Hamirkutsa village in the guise of a labourer. Acting on a tip-off, a team of Bagmara Police Station went to the village and arrested the JMB man. He had been absconding since August 17 blasts in 2005.

Police said Manju was wanted in Jatragachhi Grameen Bank robbery, mugging and murder cases Manju used to distribute books

written by Asadullah Al Galib in Bagmara and became one of the organisers of JMB in 2004.

The change of chief election commissioner is not enough to hold a free and fair election, as the officials appointed under political considerations by the immediate past four-party government are controlling the administration relating to election, Bangladesh Economic Association (BEA) said.

At a press conference held in the capital yesterday, the BEA also urged the caretaker government to publish a white paper on corrup-tion of the immediate past government and the existing Election Commission.

It is not possible to hold a free and fair election if the politically biased officials are not removed from the election process, the association said.

UK minister tells Human Rights Focus **Group Discussion**

Accountability and transparency of the political leadership of Bangladesh should be ensured for establishing human rights in the country, British Minister of State for Trade and Investment Ian McCartney said yesterday.

The international community may write to the political parties asking if their electoral promises, particularly on the human rights issues and the international treaties signed by the country, are implemented or not, he said.

The British minister, whose

portfolio also includes human rights in the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, was speaking at a Human Rights Focus Group Discussion on 'Violence, vulnerable groups and the future of human rights in Bangladesh.' British High Commissioner Anwar Choudhury moderated the discussion that

tookplace at his residence.
The UK minister's visit to Bangladesh, part of a South Asian tour including India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka, is aimed at discussing the prospects of and obstacles to economic, democratic and human development of the country.

McCartney also met the President and Chief of the Caretaker Government Iajuddin Ahmed yesterday and was sched uled to meet the business community of the country.

The British minister noted that Bangladesh is still at a stage of theory with regard to human rights, adding, "The important thing to do is the implementation." 3 outlaws killed in 'shootouts

Banglar Communist Party (PBCP) were killed yesterday in Sirajganj, Pabna and Kushtia in separate 'shootouts' with law enforcement

Two members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab), SI Abdus Salam and ASI Saidur Rahman, were also hurt during the 'shootout' in Sirajganj and they have been undergoing treatment at a local hospital, a Rab press release said.

The victim, Sanowar Hossain, 33, son of late Abdul Zabbar of Kaliaharipur village under sadar upazila, was a leader of outlawed Purba Banglar Communist Party (PBCP). He was accused in ten

criminal cases including two for murder and robbery, reports our

Sirajganj correspondent.
A team of Rab 12, after receiving a tip-off, raided a secret meeting of PBCP outlaws at 12:00 noon by the river Korotoa at Rajapur village under Belkuchi upazila. As the outlaws fired on the law

enforcement agency, Rab returned fire prompting an hour-long 'shootout', said Rab.

Sanowar's body was found on the spot after the 'shootout' was over, claimed Rab.

Rab recovered a revolver and a bullet from the scene and sent the victim's body to sadar hospital morgue for an autopsy, said the press release.
