## Brits to poach Aussie talent

Australian tennis is set to become the target of a poaching raid for its coaching talent by Britain's cashed-up Lawn Tennis Association, reports said Wednesday.

The Melbourne Age newspaper said the LTA has allegedly offered to multiply, even triple, the salaries of at least four Tennis Australia coaching and development staff.

The LTA, having already snared high-profile American coaches Brad Gilbert and Paul Annacone on massive contracts in recent months, has singled out several Australians in its efforts to transform some of the massive annual Wimbledon surplus into on-court British glory.

Tennis Australia's director of player development Craig Tiley said he was aware of LTA offers to at least four key members of a staff that has already experienced an 80 percent turnover since Tiley and

chief executive Steve Wood were installed in July 2005.

The LTA have been very aggressive in recruiting some of our staff and our coaches," Tiley told The Age.

He admitted he was "not that comfortable" with the methods the LTA employed. They've got an international

recruiting agency to find the people who are delivering in the other federations from around the world and they've been heavy on the recruitment of our talented people and just enticing them by money. You saw the Gilbert offer, you'll

soon see some others. They are very, very significant, and it's tough for those people to pass that up. If someone said to you 'do you want to triple your money?' well, you'd think hard about it, wouldn't

Tiley said the offers could not, and would not, be matched, particularly given the strength of the British pound.

Swede Peter Lungdren, whose former clients include Roger Federer and Marat Safin, is the new

British Davis Cup coach.

"It's a constant battle trying to keep (staff) without constantly matching financial offers, because we're not in the position to be able to do that, especially when you're talking about the exchange rate," Tiley said, "And nor do we want to get into that game." Tiley also confirmed he

"I am still very enthusiastic about the game and every time I go out in the middle I want to do well,' said Lara, whose 34th Test century put his team in a strong position for a series-levelling win. "I want to see the West Indies do

well and I still have that energy and that desire to go out there and perform," said Lara, rated as among the greatest batsmen to grace the game. He destroyed Pakistan's bowl-

ing attack with a flurry of strokes after his arrival at the crease in the second Test at Multan Stadium early Tuesday Lara raced to his 49th Test half-
