The Asian Cricket Council has approved special development projects to promote cricket in China. officials said Saturday.

"The ACC development committee meeting has approved a budget of 5.6 million dollars for the next fiscal year and we have special development programmes for China, where the interest is growing fast," ACC chief executive Ashraful

During its development committee meeting here, the ACC chalked out a development plan for the next five years with special emphasis on China, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Singapore and Japan

International Cricket Council (ICC) chief executive Malcolm Speed visited China earlier this year and was impressed with the interest in the game there.

Hug said the ACC had also requested special funds from the

The ICC has also promised help for China and we have also requested for special funds from the ICC. China's school team of under 15 years of age will be among eight teams participating in a school event in Thailand next month," said Huq, a former secretary of the Bangladesh Cricket Board.

Already, 200,000 dollars has been provided by the ACC, a sum which would be matched by a further 200,000 dollars from the ICC,

An under-15s competition among schools was held in Beijing in July this year while the first interuniversity competition was also held there last month

Sports officials in Beijing first expressed an interest in cricket a decade ago. China was admitted onto the ACC in 2004 and joined the ICC the following year.

A Chinese women's team would next year tour England at the invitation of the Marylebone Cricket Club,

The Chinese Cricket Association, headed by Zhang Xiaoning, hopes to have 15,000 cricketers by 2009. Numbers are forecast to rise to 60,000 by 2012 and 150,000 by 2020.

England batsman Paul Collingwood dismissed the anguish of narrowly missing out on a century in the first Ashes Test here Sunday to revel in his team's overdue gutsy fight back against Australia.

Collingwood, cruelly denied a century when he was stumped on 96, was at the heart of England's resurgence on day four at the Gabba that belied the Ashes holder's meek surrender to a firedup Australia in the first three days.

"Today (Sunday) was about fighting, about pride, a bit of passion," he said. "Not just talking about it but going

stonewalling but taking the game to

the Australians, that's the way we need to play." The 30-year-old Durham righthander came agonisingly close to posting his third Test century but was stumped by Adam Gilchrist when he was stranded after jumping
