AL Chief Sheikh Hasina entered Bangabhaban at 10:15pm accompanied by senior leaders of 14-party coalition and the meeting was under way at the time of filing of this report.

Sources in 14-party coalition hinted that their leader would urge the CA to create a congenial atmosphere for holding a free and fair election through realising their electoral demands. Hasina would also protest the recent appointments of two new election commissioners who are, in their words, 'partisan', according to the sources.

"We will reiterate our demands that had been placed to the president and chief adviser earlier," Saber Hossain Chowdhury, political secretary to the AL chief, told The Daily Star before the meeting between lajuddin and Hasina.

laiuddin, who had assumed the office of chief adviser to the caretaker government on October 29 triggering a constitutional debate, failed to create a level playing field for the next election, rather steps taken by him like making decisions unilaterally, appointments of two controversial persons as new election commissioners and the sudden announcement of the election schedule deepened the political crisis.

lajuddin's unilateral moves and decisions however were in line with the demands of BNP-led four-party alliance while most of the demands of 14-party remained unrealised.

In the wake of the prevailing situation, advisers to the caretaker government started expressing their frustration over the ongoing political deadlock and pressures at home and from abroad on the president and CA were mounting for initiating steps to resolve the crisis.

Amid such a situation, the president and CA on last Wednesday sought to initiate dialogues with the two major political alliances led by AL and BNP. He sent his adviser Mokhlesur Rahman to Al President Sheikh Hasina and BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia to discuss different burning issues, including the possibility of

"The death toll has now touched 33 and also 18 other passengers are in hospital with injuries," spokesman Ashok Ganguli told AFP by telephone from the site of the accident in Bhagalpur town.

"Now there are no more bodies in the crushed coach," he said, adding that the rescue operation had also been called off. Rail officials had earlier placed the toll at five dead and 19 injured in the accident at a rail station in the Indian state of Bihar.

"Some of these people are very seriously injured so the death toll could change," spokesman Samir Goswami told AFP by telephone from the site of the accident in Bhagalpur town.

Among the dead were an infant girl and seven women, a senior police official said from Bhagalpur.

On the other hand, the SCBA also begins indefinite boycott of Chief Justice Syed JR Mudassir Husain's court from today in a bid to force him to resign, saving he has lost his neutrality and breached his oath of upholding the constitution by staying the writ petitions minutes before the handing down of ruling, "nakedly involving himself in a conspiracy" to reelect the BNP-led four-party alliance "through a blue-print election.'

The SCBA lawyers will gather at the SC around 9:00am today.

The JAF, meanwhile, will hold a rally around 1:15pm and will announce their next programme later. The JAF will also demonstrate at courts across the country today.

The immediate past government raised the retirement age limit of judges by two years to ensure Justice Mudassir remains chief justice during the caretaker government regime to accomplish their conspiracies, the SCBA leaders alleged at a meeting at the association's hall room.

"To avoid the aftermath of the stay order, the political leaders. who were involved in the conspiracy of getting the stay orders signed secretly by the chief justice, got further violence done by hired goons," said SCBA leader Abdul Mannan Khan.

Former SCBA president Mahbubev Alam claimed Khondkar Mahbubuddin Ahmed's statement about closing the SC proves they were closely involved with the process of the chief justice's passing of the stay order and the following vandalism.

Asking the judges not to sit in a court under the chief justice, he urged the Appellate Division judges to form benches and continue SC activities.

The SCBA leaders demanded arrest of Mahbubuddin and former law minister Moudud Ahmed for their involvement in getting the stay order and thus tainting the image of the SC. They also demanded withdrawal of BNP leaders' and lawyers' statement blaming SCBA leaders and senior jurists for Thursday's vandalism, saying they would otherwise take legal steps against them.

With the SCBA Vice-president

"The false remarks the pro-Awami League lawyers have made regarding the constitutional and legal functions of the chief justice and the attorney general are tantamount to contempt of court," said Mahbubuddin.

About carrying the chief justice's stay orders by the AG himself like a "messenger", he said, "It was due to time constraint."

Around 20,000 members of police, Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) will be deployed in the capital to maintain law and order, DMP sources said.

"We will withdraw the blockade only if the president resigns from the post of chief adviser and appoints a non-partisan person in the post as per the constitution and meet our several other demands to create a congenial atmosphere for a free and fair election." Quader said.

The 14-party alliance has been demanding lajuddin's resignation as the chief adviser accusing him of repeatedly violating the constitution.

Different political parties, ncluding Jatiya Party, Liberal Democratic Party-led Jatiya Oikya Front and a few other Islamic parties that have also brought the same allegations against the president, will also be in the streets during the blockade, Quader said.
