An invincible China added seven more gold medals to its bulging bag of Asian Games titles Tuesday

Japan will be looking to capitalise on its strong showing in the pool, where the spoils have been spilt 9-7 in China's favour so far.

China tops the medals table with 46 gold midway through day four, from Japan's 12. South Korea has nine after adding two on Tuesday on the shooting ranges. But it was again China's day,

But he will have Chinese rival Zhang Lin and Japan's Takeshi Matsuda to grapple with, both of whom were in blistering form in the relay on Monday.

Other gold in the pool comes in the men's 50m butterly, where Japan's Takashi Yamamoto is favourite, 100m backstroke and 4x100m relay. The women race over 100m


