Russian media have hailed Spartak Moscow after they finally snapped a record 22-match winless streak in the Champions League by beating Sporting 3-1 in their final Group B match on Tuesday.

The win in Lisbon allowed the Russians to leapfrog the Portuguese side thanks to their better head-to-head record and finish third in their group behind Bavern Munich and Inter Milan securing a spot in the UEFA Cup.

"The curse has been lifted!" said a front-page headline in the newspaper Sport-Express on Wednesday.

"Spartak brilliantly made use of their last chance to reach the UEFA Cup!" echoed the rival sports daily

Nedved issues ultimatum



Spartak, however, still hold another unwanted Champions League mark for having the worst record in a group stage when they lost all six of their matches in the 2002-03 competition to Valencia, Liverpool and Basel and were outscored 1-18


