One killed in blast while making bomb

Police yesterday recovered the body of an unidentified youth killed in a bomb blast at a house at Ekabbarpur village under Mithapukur upazila on Friday night.

Locals found the body on a paddy field, 500 metres off the explosion site, in the morning and

According to police the bomb exploded with a big bang at about 8:30pm when some unidentified youths were making it at the house incident.

The law enforcers also recovered some bomb-making materials from the tin-roofed house that was

badly damaged in the explosion.

They could not arrest anyone as all members of the house fled the scene immediately after

Officer-in-charge of Mithapukur Police Station said they are investigating the incident and looking for the persons involved.

ALLEGATION OF SEXUAL ABUSE

JU students' memo to VC

General students of Jahangirnagar University (JU) staged a demonstration on the campus yesterday demanding immediate impartial investigation into an allegation of sexual harassment on a female student of Bangla department by a teacher of the same department.

They also submitted a memorandum to Vice Chancellor Prof Khandaker Mustahidur Rahman demanding exemplary punishment to the teacher.

The university administration formed a three-member probe body headed by Prof Sikandar Dara Shamsuddin of Geography and Environment department to prepare a report in seven days.

On November 16, a female student submitted a written complaint to Bangla department Chairperson Prof Sauda Akhter, where she alleged that one of the teachers of the department sexually abused her at his office.

She further alleged that she had to leave the campus in the face of continuous threat on her life and reputation.

Meanwhile, the students of Bangla department will announce protest programmes today to press the demands while Jahangirnagar Sangskritik Jote began signature campaign at all dormitories of the university.

3 killed in road accidents

At least three people were killed in separate road accidents in Tangail and Natore yesterday.

OUR CORRESPONDENT from Tangail reports: A bicycle rider was killed in a road accident at Sadar upazila in the district yesterday.

The victim was identified as Mohammad Moktar Ali, 60, of Golabari village at Sadar upazila.

Police said the accident took place at around 1:00pm when a North Bengal bound speeding bus from Dhaka ran over Mokter Ali on Dhaka-Jamuna Multipurpose Bridge highway at

Gharinda area, leaving him died on the spot.

Police sent the body to Tangail General Hospital morgue for autopsy.

UNB from Natore adds: Two motorcyclists were killed as a bus hit a motorbike at Razzak crossing on Bonpara-Hatikumrul highway yesterday.

Sources said a Rajshahibound bus from Mymensingh hit a motorbike from behind at noon, leaving Swapan and Mannan injured critically.

The injured were rushed to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital where they succumbed in the afternoon.
