Jubilation overshadowed political turmoil yesterday as the nation celebrated the 35th anniversary of victory in the nine-month LiberationWar in 1971

People from all walks of life paid their homage to the martyred war heroes who made supreme sacrifices for liberating the country from the Pakistan military rulers trampling the rights of the Bangalees, the majority in the then

As the countrymen renewed vow to uphold the spirit of the Liberation War, BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami activists clashed with Awami League (AL) men in Moulvibazar, Pabna, Chittagong, and Mymensingh, leaving at least 82

The day in 1971 marked the end of the bloody war as the Pakistan troops surrendered to the joint forces headed by Gen Jagjit Singh

The dead was identified as Montu Mia, 18, of East Kazipara of

Montu went to the military hardware show at the National

Parade Ground with his friend Masud, 20, at 8:00am, said Masud. Police said the gate was not pened until 9:00am and hundreds

of people had been waiting. Montu, Masud, 20, and Masud, 24, were stampeded as they along with many others tried to enter the parade ground. Members of the armed forces

rescued Montu in a critical condition and sent to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital (DMCH) where the doctors declared him dead.

'Informal' move initiated to revive package proposal

Iajuddin to request ECs to go on leave only when BNP, AL agree

A few advisers to the caretaker government have re-initiated negotiations with the two major political alliances about recasting the Election Commission (EC) in line with the advisory council's package proposal. Sources said President and

Chief Adviser Iajuddin Ahmed will request election commissioners SM Zakaria and Modabbir Hossain Chowdhury to go on leave--as per the package proposal--only when

the two alliances led by the BNP and Awami League (AL) agree.

"We are informally consulting with the leaders of BNP and Awami League for a consensus on resolving the ongoing political dead-lock," Agriculture Adviser Shafiqual Haque Choudhury told The Daily Star yesterday.

He said it will take a couple of days to get a result from the negotiation.

Earlier on December 4, the president and all ten advisers signed in the proposals finalised in consultation with BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia

and AL President Sheikh Hasina. The proposals include reconstitution of the EC by sending the two election commissioners on leave and appointing new commissioners.

But Iajuddin suddenly appeared opposed to sending Zakaria on leave. Coincidentally, the BNP-led fourparty alliance also backtracked from its stance and opposed the move.

JP calls hartal in 5 northern dists today

Jatiya Party (JP) enforces a dawnto-dusk hartal in five districts of greater Rangpur today protesting the High Court verdict on Thursday that sentenced JP Chairman HM Ershad to two years' imprisonment in the Japanese boat purchase case.

Announcing the programme on Friday, JP Presidium Member Moshiur Rahman Ranga said that the verdict was 'designed to bar Ershad from contesting the next parliamentary election.

Party leaders from the five districts -- Kurigram, Lalmonithat, Gaibandha, Nilphamari and Rangpur -- were consulted before declaring the programme, our correspondent from Lalmonirhat reports. Awami League (AL) has extended its support to the hartal in the five districts, sources said. The local units of JP organised

Tax exemption facilities misused to make profit

BB study finds welfare organisations encouraging graft exempted, which was 31.3 percent

A number of welfare organisations in Bangladesh misuse tax-exemption facilities by operating profit-driven programmes that do not serve any socio-economic goal but encourage 'corruption-based activities', a Bangladesh Bank (BB)

The study -- Tax expenditures in Bangldesh: An introductory analysis-- by the BB's Policy Analysis Unit also said the 'tax-holiday provided to induce foreign direct investment (FDI) is widely misused and its opportunity cost is higher than its stated objectives.

In the financial year 2005 (FY05), Tk 9,345 crore of tax was

of the total revenue earning and 2.5 percent of GDP, according to figures from the National Board of Revenue (NBR) cited in the study. Tax exemptions in India and

Pakistan make up 4.5 percent and 0.4 percent of their GDP, the study "Income from a few welfare organisations operating with

Thousands in Kamrangirchar left off voter roll

Please register my name on the voter list," Sekandar Ali (65), a resident of ward no 5 in Kamrangirchar in the capital requested The Daily Star correspondent mistaking him for a field level Election Commission (EC)

Like Sekandar, thousands of prospective voters who live mostly in slums of Kamrangirchar were not registered as voters yet on the ninth day of stipulated 11-day schedule for correcting the much controversial voter list already updated once.

About 10 thousand prospective voters of the ward now feel that

names on the voter list as the field level officials left their houses without registering them as voters. Many residents of the area, who

are eligible to be voters, alleged that the field level EC officials did not visit their houses. They alleged that the officials only visited the houses of either BNP or Jaamat leaders or of their relatives and

While this correspondent visited ward no 5 and 4 of the city in Kamrangirchar yesterday, many residents alleged that the visiting EC officials were usually guided and instructed by local people identified as leaders of BNP or its front organisations, and stayed away from the houses or slums they have little hope of seeing their occupied by Awami League sup-

Achia, wife of the owner of a small road side café at Boro Gram under ward no 5, claimed that many people including her and her husband were not registered as voters because the enumerators had not visited their slum although they went to the adjacent slum.

With a sardonic smile Achia said, "Don't you know why they did not register us as voters?"

A rather large number of local residents besieged this correspondent and urged him to register their names as voters, since they mistook him for an enumerator from

After finding out his real identity some of the residents started SEE PAGE 15 COL 4

CPJ concerned at attacks on journalists

The Committee to Protect Journalists (CPJ) sent a letter to President Iajuddin Ahmed on Friday asking him to do everything in his power to ensure that threats and assaults against journalists are investigated and the criminals are

punished. The CPJ said journalists told them threats and attacks on media are on the rise in the run-up to the elections. They said it has been on the rise since the interim government took power in late October.

"We urge you to do everything in your power as leader of the interim government to ensure that assaults on the press are adequately investigated and punished, and that journalists are free to report on the election campaign without fear of retribution," the letter read.

The letter signed by Joel Simon, executive director to the CPJ, was also put on the CPJ website. Bangladesh's vibrant press

corps has been a constant target of attacks in recent years, the letter said giving an instance of the SEE PAGE 15 COL 3

Show of alliance strength

Khladea, Hasina to give poll guidelines from city rallies

BNP-led four-party alliance and Awami League (AL)-led 14-party coalition are set to show off their strengths as both the alliances will hold grand rallies in downtown

AL-led 14-party will hold the rally tomorrow and four-party will hold its on the following day. Khaleda Zia and Sheikh Hasina,

chiefs of the two alliances, will give their activists guidelines regarding the next election scheduled to be held on January 23. The AL-led coalition will

announce three conditions as prerequisites for its participation in the election - rescheduling of the election after correction and publication of the updated voter list, implementation of the package proposal offered to the alliances by the advisers to the caretaker government (CG), and purging the field level administration of 'partisan' officials, according to coalition

But the BNP-led alliance will announce a single condition for its

participation in the election holding of the election within the stipulated 90 days of the CG's

Sources in both the alliances told The Daily Star that the announcements are likely to come from two expanded common Sources within 14-party said

their leaders including AL President Sheikh Hasina, Dr Kamal Hossain, Rashed Khan Menon and Hasanul Haque Inu, Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) President AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury and its Executive President Col (retd) Oli Ahmed, Jatiya Party (JP-Ershad) leaders Ruhul Amin Hawlader and GM Quader, JP-Manju Secretary General Sheikh Shadidul Islam, Islami Oikya Jote (IOJ) Chairman Misbaur Rahman Chowdhury and its another leader Mufti Izharul Islam Chowdhury, Zaker Party Chairman Pirjada Faisal Amir, and Khelaphat Majlish Chairman Azizul Haque are likely to be present at the common rally of the coalition and its allies.

JP Chairman HM Ershad was

also supposed to be there but following the High Court verdict, sentencing him to two years in jail, the possibility of his presence is relatively slim, the sources said.

A senior AL leader told The Daily Star that they are keeping close contact with all the leaders of likeminded political parties in an effort to gather them on a common platform which is likely to make a common announcement. From that common platform, which the coalition is unofficially calling 'the grand electoral alliance', the leaders might urge President Iajuddin Ahmed to step down from the post of chief adviser 'for the interest of holding a fair election in the coun-On the other hand, four-party

the BNP-led rally.

At least six top leaders of JP-Ershad are likely to be present at the four-party-led rally, the alliance sources said.

Senior leaders of 14-party will draw up a list of programmes tonight to follow their rally and Hasina will approve the draft of it tomorrow morning before the rally with a view to keeping the programmes 'a secret till the formal announcement', sources close to the AL president said.

With a view to turning the capital into a 'human sea' by mobilising about two lakh people in its rally, 14-party began massive preparations. Dhaka city AL will hold an extended meeting in the AL central office on Bangabandhu Avenue today. 14-party will also hold a meeting today and senior leaders of the coalition will instruct leaders of different districts adjacent to the capital about their tasks.

Meanwhile, the police and other law enforcement agencies have been asked to stay alert until the two rallies end, according to police Ershad leader Begum Raushan Ershad are likely to be present at
