Hashem Khan In quest of liberty

N all his exhibits, Hashem Khan has painted and sketched on Victory Day with passion and zeal. He works with his brush and pen to create images on his favourite theme. The struggle and strife for liberation has inspired him to fill entire gallery walls on his pet subject.

"I paint from my memory or mingle it with the present times," he says, "The Liberation War was for peace and harmony in Bangladesh. In Victory-1971 (oil), I've used contrasting black and white for symbolic effect. Images of raised waving hands are signs of victory. We have the memory of much pain and bloodshed. The stark black is for blood and agony. Meanwhile, the ruby red, put in ovular splashes, sweeps and lines, represent

hard-earned peace." The shadow, he explains, is for making the composition more interesting and effective

Women's role in Liberation Movement (serigraph print) contains rounded women's visages in the forefront, with Sufia Kamal's portrait in the centre. This piece is dedicated to the poet's role in the freedom movement. Abstract forms in the backdrop, with motifs taken from past war memories, are done in variations of buoyant blue, yellow and black circular splashes. The linear faces are included in vellow-ochre and bright blue. Six flying doves of peace, headed for the sky, bring in the essential element of optimism. The vermilion in the background stands for unquestionable strength. The carefully sketched in motifs, tanks and arms -- carefully juxtaposed

Awards More honours for Abu Sayeed and 'Nirontor'

Shortly after winning a special jury award at the 37th edition of International Film Festival of India in Goa on December 3, Abu Sayeed's Nirontor was adjudged the best movie jointly with Angel's Fall, a coproduction of Turkey and Greece at the International Film Festival in Kerala on December 15.

Sayeed's film also won the FIPRESCI critics award, beating off competition from Japanese movie The Whispering of Gods by Tatsushi Omori. The latter earned a special mention by critics at the eight-daylong festival in Thiruvana-thapuram capital of Kerala.

Sayeed, 43, received Rs five lakh and the Golden Pheasant (Suvarna Chakoram) from Kerala's Chief Minister VS Achuthanandan. The best director award went to Iran's Chahar Shanbeh Souri for Fireworks Wednesday. Sri Lankan filmmaker Prasanna Jayakodi was adjudged the best debut director for his movie Sankara that also got the Netpac award. Mexican director Francisco Vergas' Violin was polled the best film by the audience through a Gallup poll

The awards at the Kerala festival were announced by jury chairman, Palestinian filmmaker Elia Suleiman at the closing ceremony Understandably, Sayeed was elated. After the award presentation, the filmmaker told this correspondent over phone from Thiruvananthapuram that this was a tremendous recognition and encouragement for independent

Bangladeshi filmmakers like him. He said Nirontor featured in the Asian-Latin American-African competitive section in Kerala as it had done in Goa.

However, Sayeed could not be present when the film was screened at the Kerala festival on December 9 and December 11 as he reached there a day late. From Kerala, the movie went to non-competitive Chennai film festival. A bigger test however awaits Saveed when Nirontor travels to Palm Springs International Film Festival, USA next month in the run up to his bid for Oscar award in the

Best Foreign Language film cate-gory. The director said the Palm Springs festival will be held from January 6 to January 14 and it is an event where films submitted for Oscar are screened along with other critically acclaimed movies. Thereafter, Sayeed's film will be screened at the Rotterdam International Festival, to be held from January 24 to February 4.

"Although Rotterdam is a noncompetitive festival, it is an important event for me because some of the best films made around the world will be screened there", he said
