Roman Abramovich, the billionaire owner of Chelsea, has signalled an end to his extravagant spending on new signings but insisted that his passion for English football is stronger than ever. Speaking exclusively to The Observer, the Russian also denied that he ever interferes in team selection and characterised his relationship with manager Jose Mourinho as 'warm enough'.

Abramovich has been accused of distorting the transfer market by lavishing tens of millions of pounds on overpriced players who then languish in Chelsea's reserves. But he claimed the policy would not go on indefinitely. "Our strategy is to bring up our own players through the academy, which we have invested a lot in. and we hope that will give results." he said in Moscow last week. "We will be spending less in the transfer market in future years.

Chelsea's conduct under Abramovich has also been clouded by a series of 'tapping up' allegations. The

club was found guilty of making an illegal approach for Ashley Cole after it met the left-back without Arsenal's permission at a London hotel last year. Asked if his business methods were too aggressive, there was a silence before Abramovich replied: "I don't think so."

Shrugging off the club's unpopularity, he continued: "Everyone likes the situation where the leader loses. We don't have financial problems that's probably also a factor. But you need to give credit: the number of Chelsea fans has increased substantially. There are two groups: ones who love the team and those who don't like it.'

Mourinho said recently that if he was forced by Abramovich to pick certain players he might as well leave the club. The Russian claimed that he keeps his opinions to himself almost. "I'm not involved in team selection. I cannot say I'm completely not involved in buying players, but my role would be significantly lower than that of the manager's. You cannot compare them. To give an example, this would be an impossible situation when a manager does not want a

Manchester United. The prolific Dutch forward left Old Trafford under a cloud in the summer when his extremely productive spell under Ferguson was brought to an end with a transfer to Real Madrid. The two experienced a dramatic

falling out which resulted in Louis Saha taking van Nistelrooy's firstteam place, and the Real new-boy has now explained that his outburst during the 4-0 cup final win over Wigan sealed his departure.

"It started at the Carling Cup final, after an hour we were 4-0 ahead,' van Nistelrooy told the News of the

Berlin's name game

Berlin's historic Olympic Stadium could carry the name of a sponsor as the city's financial bosses look to maximise the cash benefits of the ground which hosted the World Cup final this summer.

A report in the Berliner Morgenpost newspaper claimed that the sale of the rights to the stadium could bring in around eight million euros over an eight-to-ten year period.

"The name of a sponsor for the stadium is in our interests." said Werner Gegenbauer, an official with Hertha Berlin, the Bundesliga football club which play their home games at the ground.

"It's one of the areas where we can improve our financial returns."

The 72,000-capacity Olympic Stadium was the site of Adolf Hitler's 1936 Olympics and as well as welcoming matches in the 2006 World Cup finals, it also hosts NFL Europe matches and the final meeting of the

Golden League athletics.

The money which would be brought in would finance new developments such as a swimming pool a race course and an open-air theatre.

Stadium chiefs also hope that improvements would boost the city's chances of staging another Olympic Games
