Grand alliance to rethink election participation

Jatiya Party (JP) Chairman HM Ershad was declared disqualified from the ballot vesterday, forcing Awami League (AL)-led grand electoral alliance to re-think whether it will compete in the upcoming parliamentary

Returning officers (RO) rejected the five nomination papers Ershad had filed for the constituencies of Dhaka-5, Rangpur-3, Lalmonirhat-3, Sylhet-3 and Habiganj-3, on grounds of the Supreme Court's rejection of his appeal against a High Court verdict that had sentenced him to two years in prison in a graft case popularly known as 'Japanese boat purchase scam'.

Ershad, who could not contest the 2001 lection as he had been convicted in Janata lower case, can now file an appeal against his latest disqualification with the Election Commission (EC) in three days, on which the commission will have to give a decision before January 3.

Sensing the rejection coming his way, Ershad met AL President Sheikh Hasina in her residence at 11:50am yesterday and discussed strategies for the next course of action.

Army rolls out to control

The power was given to the armed forces through a controversial ordinance in 2001

The Armed Forces Division in a reliminary circular dated December 20 said the armed forces will be deployed on January 10 and will remain in the field until January 29 to maintain law and

Referring to a home ministry plan, sources said the army will act as a mobile and strike force along with the police, Bangladesh Rifles (BDR), Rapid Action Battalion (Rab), ansar and the coast guard.

The circular for using the army during the election came a month after their deployment on December 9 through a unilateral decision of President and Chief Adviser lajuddin Ahmed



BNP worried by number of rebel candidates

The BNP high-up is worried by the huge number of dissident leaders across the country who filed nomination to contest the next general election without any consultation with party high command.

According to party sources, the BNP high-up fears that party aspirants might face revolt from many leaders who will not get party ticket when the names of party nominees are announced.

Meanwhile, although BNP leadership is apparently happy over the decision of Jatiya Party Chairman HM Ershad being barred from the poll race, senior leaders are anxious about a possible boycott of the election by the Awami League-led alliance over this issue.

BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan told reporters at a briefing on Tuesday that they would disclose the names of party nominees later. He said most can didates have already been confirmed while nominees for rest of the seats will be finalised soon.

Sources said the BNP high command is trying to convince the disgruntled leaders to withdraw their nominations and Bhuiyan hoped that these leaders will agree

to do it. The BNP-led four-party alliance, however, could not finalise its

candidature as of last night. The dispute over seat-sharing between the BNP and Jamaat-e Islam also was not resolved. Sources said Jamaat demanded at least 40 seats for the next election but BNP does not see any possibility of Jamaat candidates' win in more than 20 seats.

264 nomination papers cancelled

Loan default main reason

The Election Commission (EC) has rejected the nomination papers of at least 264 candidates, including a number of known political leaders and industrialists because of loan defaults and other disqualifying

Nomination papers of 194 of the 264 candidates were rejected for

Out of 4,146 nomination papers, 3,882 were accepted after being scrutinised for disqualifying flaws by returning officers yesterday. The nomination papers that had flaws were later rejected by the returning officer and sent to the EC.

The prominent candidates from the Awami League-led grand alliance whose nomination papers were rejected are former president of Federation of Bangladesh Chamber of Commerce and Industry (FBCCI) Yusuf Abdullah Harun, (Comilla 3), former minister Mayeedul Islam,(Kurigram-4), Nurul Islam Madani Maymensingh-7), Benazir Ahmed (manikgani-1), Ruhul Amin Hawlader, general secretary of Jatiyo Party (Patuakhali-2) and Nasrin Jahan Ratna, wife of Ruhul Amin Hawlader (Barisal-6).
