the vulnerable people. Through this development partnership approach CARE, in collaboration with the GoB and funded by the USAID, has undertaken a five year food security program titled "SHOUHARDO" (Strengthening)

Households to Respond Development Opportunities) starting from October 2004 to September 2009.

The overall GOAL of the program is to 'sustainably reduce chronic and transitory food insecurity of 400,000 households (HHs) in 18 districts of Bangladesh by 2009'. To achieve this goal, four major Strategic Objectives have been set. These are:

SO1: Improved availability/economic access to food through strengthening livelihoods, entitlements and enhancing accountability of

service providers. SO2: Sustainable improvement in the health and nutrition of project participants.

SO3: Enhanced empowerment of 400,000 women and girls from targeted vulnerable HHs.

SO4: Targeted communities and institutions are better able to prepare for, mitigate and respond to natural disasters.

The Program operates in four major regions of Bangladesh namely: Kishorganj, Rangpur, Tangail and Chittagong. The program operates in 2348 of the most remote villages and slums of these regions. One of the major components of this

program is to build the capacities of the concerned local government elected representatives and service providers.

The National Institute of Local Government (NILG) is a national level training and research institute under the Local Government Division of the Ministry of Local Government, Rural Development and

Cooperatives. Its mandate is to impart training for capacity building of the local government elected representatives official functionaries.

Under this collaboration between NILG and CARE Bangladesh SHOUHARDO program, eleven thousand five hundred fifty (11,550) participants of 492 Unions, 18 Pourashavas and 1 City Corporation will be trained and will effectively contribute in areas the sustainability, good governance, transparency and accountability of the local government. This will further lead entitlements and empowerment of the poor people, particularly the vulnerable women

from Union and Upazila levels. and will impact on their lives by reducing poverty and food insecurity.

This initiative will involve a total cost of over US\$ One Million and will be implemented through NILG in collaboration with the Bangladesh Academy for Rural Development (BARD, Comilla). Relevant to mention, BARD will be responsible for Chittagong region, Rural Development Academy (RDA, Bogra) for Rangpur and Bogra and Bangladesh Rural Development Training Institute (BRDTI, Sylhet) for Kishoreganj and NILG Dhaka for Tangail region. On behalf of the ministry of Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives, the Director General of NILG has been entrusted with the responsibility of implementing, coordinating, supervising and monitoring the entire training program.



Message from the Country Director



Capacity strengthening of local government elected bodies is a crucial issue for the development of Bangladesh. Promoting commitment and accountability of these officials promotes good governance and empowerment of the poor and marginalized, especially women. CARE believes that working closely with the government at grassroots, regional and national levels is an effective strategy for sustainable impact on poor peoples' lives. However, the voices of the poor and marginalized are not always heard by institutions and policy makers. In effort to empower and transform the lives of marginalized people, CARE Bangladesh works to bring them into closer contact with local government bodies and institutions.

Strengthening Household Ability to Respond to Development Opportunities (SHOUHARDO) program is one such initiative, which works with 400,000 poor and vulnerable households in 18 districts of char, haor and coastal regions. This USAID-funded project uses an integrated program approach combining health, education, food-security, access to services and common property resources, and disaster preparedness components. Building the capacity of locally elected representatives and services providers is also a major component of the program.

I think the collaboration of CARE Bangladesh and the National Institute for Local Government (NILG) on training of locally elected bodies, service providers and pourasabhas will help poor communities to be heard at the policymaking level. In addition, it will help locally elected bodies be more effective in delivering services to grassroots people. I support this training program and wish it complete

I am very pleased to be a witness and a part of this specific collaboration between the National Institute of Local Government (NILG) and CARE SHOUHARDO Program. Bangladesh's SHOUHARDO is funded by USAID, which began in October 2004, and will continue to operate till September 2009. This is an ambitious program, truly dedicated to reaching some of the poorest and marginalized groups in Bangladesh. The goal is 'To sustainably reduce chronic and transitory food insecurity of 400,000 vulnerable households in 18 districts of the country'. To reach this goal, the Program has four major strategic objectives:

improving availability/economic access to food;

improving disaster preparedness and response. Being true to its commitment of reaching the poorest, SHOUHARDO operates in remote 'char', 'haor' and 'coastal' areas, secondary urban centers, one City Corporation (Chittagong) in the regions of Rangpur (North Chars), Tangail (Mid Chars), Kishoregonj (Haor) and Chittagong (Coastal).

SHOUHARDO is under no illusion that for the program to be successful, we must have the active support of different ministries and departments of the Government of Bangladesh. This collaboration between NILG and SHOUHARDO is one such concrete example of an active partnership aimed at alleviating the suffering of the poor. Through this alliance, NILG will undertake the large task of building the capacity of over 11,550 locally elected and government representatives in both the rural and urban areas where SHOUHARDO operates. This is a critical component of the Program to ensure these representatives are adequately trained and aware of development issues and their respective roles in this area. This will then lead to them becoming more able custodians of the people they represent.

I thank NILG for taking on this important task and look forward to a brighter future for the poor of Bangladesh.
