Tendulkar, who escaped a straightforward catching chance, was unbeaten on 46. India lost their first three wickets

for 61 and it could have been worse if South African captain Graeme Smith had caught Tendulkar when the total was 69 with the batsman on 21.

With India holding a 1-0 lead in the three-match series, Tendulkar and VVS Laxman looked determined to ensure their team would earn at least a draw. They batted cautiously as the light deteriorated to add an unbeaten 42 for the fourth wicket.
