Sibley, Denly stretch England's lead



Dom Sibley and Joe Denly stretched England's lead on an attritional third afternoon of the second Test against

South Africa at Newlands on Sunday after James Anderson had polished off the home side's first innnings in the morning.

England were 109 for two in their second innings at tea, an overall lead of 155 runs.

Sibley and Denly put on 73 for the second wicket before Denly was out for 31 when he hooked a short-pitched ball from Anrich Nortje and was caught by Dwaine Pretorius at fine leg.

It was slow going, with the partnership taking up 33 overs, but it consolidated England's advantage on a pitch where batsmen have struggled to bat fluently.

Denly faced 111 balls, while Sibley was unbeaten on 44 off 127 deliveries at tea.

Anderson completed a five-wicket haul and Ben Stokes set an England catching record at the start of the day when South Africa were bowled out for 223, giving England a first innings lead of 46.

Anderson took both South Africa's

out for 223, adding only eight runs to their overnight total. Stokes set an England Test record for a

With the Sylhet leg done and dusted, the Bangabandhu Bangladesh Premier League (BBPL) will enter its final stretch when the tournament resumes in

Dhaka tomorrow following a two-day break. Chattogram Challengers and Rajshahi Royals have already confirmed their playoff berths while Dhaka Platoon, Khulna Tigers and Rangpur Rangers will vie for the final spot when they get back to business at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium tomorrow.

With the country's top domestic cricket league reaching its climax, now is as good a time as any to reflect on the local players' performances, especially since chief selector Minhajul Abedin said prior to the competition that they were hoping $\frac{Q}{2}$ to unearth a few national team prospects ahead of the T20 World Cup.

One of the most notable aspects of the ongoing BBPL is perhaps the impressive performances of young pacers such as Mehedi Hasan Rana, Hasan Mahmud, Shahidul Islam and Mukidul Islam. However, it should be mentioned here that while the initial sparks were bright, the pacers have since lost their rhythm.

In addition, if the selectors examine how the players who featured in the three-match T20 series in India fared in the ongoing BBPL, then they would not have much to be encouraged about, other than Mushfiqur Rahim's responsible batting that is.

While true that young Mohammad Naim, Mohammad Mithun, Liton Das and Afif Hossain chipped in with runs, there was nothing extraordinary in their efforts. Meanwhile, Soumya Sarkar has

Barca held to 2-2 draw

Barcelona were pegged back by La Liga's bottom club Espanyol on Saturday as Wu Lei struck late to secure a dramatic 2-2 draw in Laliga a thrilling Catalan derby.

Luis Suarez appeared to have inspired another turnaround at the RCDE Stadium after he cancelled out David Lopez's opener with a deft half-volley before digging out an exquisite pass for substitute Arturo Vidal to finish.

But a red card for Frenkie de Jong with 16 minutes left gave Espanyol renewed hope and Chinese forward Wu emerged the hero, firing past stand-in goalkeeper Neto to rescue a point in Abelardo Fernandez's first game in charge.

Barcelona remain top of the table but only on goal difference, their two-point advantage removed after Real Madrid earlier clinched an impressive 3-0 win away at Getafe.

Barca now switch their attention to the Spanish Super Cup in Saudi Arabia next week, where a Clasico final awaits if Real Madrid beat Valencia in the last four and they can overcome Atletico.

But coach Ernesto Valverde will have much to ponder after defensive problems again undermined his team against the league's bluntest attack.

Lopez was unmarked as he headed in Marc Roca's cross in the 23rd minute while at the other end chances were few and far between, with Lionel Messi going closest with a header at the back post.

Vidal came on at half-time for Ivan Rakitic and Suarez worked his magic, angling his foot perfectly to divert Jordi Alba's cross inside the near post before picking out Vidal to make it 2-1 nine minutes later

Bangladesh apparently first want to participate in the T20I series before taking a decision on the Test series following a security assessment since the stakeholders of the series do not want them to play the longer-version of cricket in Pakistan.

Zlatan statue vandalised once again

Zlatan Ibrahimovic's statue in his hometown of Malmo was vandalised overnight Saturday, Swedish police reported.

The statue has been the target of numerous attacks since the Swedish footballer invested in Stockholm-based Hammarby, angering supporters of Malmo FF, the club where he began his professional career.

In November, a day after his investment in Hammarby, Ibrahimovic filed a "hate crime" complaint after the statue was attacked with fire and paint.
