Campaigns officially kick off

A 19-day election campaign for the two Dhaka city corporations polls officially began yesterday with the ruling party candidates pledging to continue the ongoing development work in the capital.

The BNP candidates said they would participate in the elections to Dhaka North City Corporation (DNCC) and Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC) for "re-establishing democracy" in the country.

The election buzz started immediately after the returning officers allotted electoral symbols to the candidates yesterday morning. Candidates and their supporters held street meetings and conducted

door-to-door campaigns. Both returning officers warned candidates that stern actions would be taken if anyone violates the electoral code of conduct.

The campaign will continue until midnight of January 28. The voting will start at 8:00am on January 30.

DNCC returning officer (RO) Abul Kashem said, "Election is a festival We will not allow anyone to resort to violence during the festival.

DSCC RO Abdul Baten urged candidates to remain cautious about the overuse of loudspeakers during electioneering as the SSC exams will start SEE PAGE 8 COL 5

Pak mosque blast kills 14 people

Top cop among dead; 20 injured

At least 14 people were killed and 20 others wounded in a bomb blast during evening prayers at a mosque in Quetta's Satellite Town area yesterday, police and a doctor said.

Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) Amanullah was among the deceased, said Quetta Deputy Inspector General (DIG) Abdul Razzaq

The nature of the explosion, which took place inside the mosque in Ghousabad neighbourhood, has yet to be determined, police said. Rescue services are at the scene to attend to the injured, many of whom

TV footage of the explosion's aftermath showed debris and shattered glass strewn on the floor at the scene.

No one immediately claimed responsibility for the bombing. Balochistan Chief Minister Jam Kamal Khan, while condemning the incident, said that those who targeted worshippers have no religion or

"They are only terrorists and deserve the harshest punishment," he said, situation in Balochistan.

Winds fan Australia bushfires

Govt urges quarter of million to flee, prepares military backup

Australia urged nearly a quarter of a million people to evacuate their homes yesterday and prepared military backup as authorities said the next few hours could be "very, very challenging" even as rain poured down in some parts.

Gale-force winds merged two enormous fires into a megablaze spanning an area four times the size of Greater London yesterday.

"The conditions are difficult today," said Shane Fitzsimmons, rural fire service commissioner for New South

"It's the hot, dry winds that will prove once again to be the real challenge.
