In 2018, with a revamped line-up, the band launched their self-titled debut album. Today, the legendary band will celebrate 48 years of their first formation, which is a landmark in Bangladeshi band music. "We are planning a physical release of our album, in light of the 100th birth anniversary of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibor Rahman," said Nazim, the vocalist and percussionist of the band, carrying on the legacy from his father, Firoz Shai. 7th death anniversary of Suchitra Sen today

Today marks the 7th death anniversary of legendary actor Suchitra Sen. The actor breathed her last on January 17 in 2013 in Kolkata. The star originally hailed from Pabna. The district's administration, in collaboration with Suchitra Sen Smrity Shangrakhhan Parishad, have organised various programmes, commemorating the diva's life and works.

Born on April, 6 in 1931, Suchitra Sen grew up Gopalpur, in a small district town and started her academic journey with Mahakali Pathshala. She later pursued education from Pabna Govt Girls High School, where she studied until class-IX. Her family shifted India long before the liberation. "Suchitra Sen had no touch with Pabna since her departure from the ancestral house till death. However, she still lives in our hearts," says Dr Noresh Chandra Modhu, Secretary of Suchitra Sen Smrity Shangrakhhan Parishad, Pabna.

Suchitra's ancestral house in Pabna was illegally occupied since three decades until it was finally freed in 2014 and opened to visitors. "After a long smuggle, we have finally managed to free the historic house of Suchitra Sen. We wish to establish this place as a museum, treasuring her memories, he adds."

Pabna district administration plans to start the day by garnering statue of Sen with flowers at her ancestral house. This session will be followed by a rally, discussions and a cultural programme at the Pabna Govt Girls High School.



DIFF 2020 hosts 'West Meets East' conference

"At the end of the day, filmmaking is an expensive business. So, how the investment in this sector will return has to be decided in advance," renowned Bangladeshi filmmaker and producer Abu Shahed Emon commented at an interactive conference, titled 'West Meets East' at Dhaka Club, recently.

With the participation of local and international filmmakers, the conference was held as part of the 18th Dhaka International Film Festival 2020. The daylong event was attended by internationally acclaimed filmmakers Rubaiyet Hossain, Prosun Azad, Meenakshi Shedde, South Asia delegate of

Berlin Film Festival and Suli, programmer of Busan Film Festival, among others.

At the beginning of the conference, Meenakshi Shedde discussed the techniques of the selection of films for the festivals. Then, Abu Shahed Emon and other directors discussed the filmmaking, investment and its challenges.

According to the discussants, international film festivals may vary according to regions. For example, some aspects are significant for the Europe film festival, which may not significant for Asian festivals and the focus point of American film festivals are

different.
So, before making a film, the

filmmakers or affiliates have to decide where they will screen the film or in which festival it will be participating. They also have to be careful about selecting festivals. For an example, Meenakshi said, "Only the best films of the Busan Film Festival in Asia are the focus of the Cannes Film Festival".

Rainbow Film Society, one of the most active film entities in the film society movement of Bangladesh, has organised 18th Dhaka International Film Festival' with the motto 'Better Film, Better Audience and Better Society'. 220 films from around 74 countries are being screened under different categories at the event, which concludes on January 19.
