## Fees taken, service not ensured

BRTA took Tk 560cr from vehicle owners in 4 years

When the Bangladesh Road Transport Authority introduced what is popularly known as digital number plate in 2012, it made promises of gaining the ability to track vehicles that have been stolen or used in criminal activities.

For the mandatory plates and radiofrequency identification (RFID) tags, motorcycle or three-wheeler owners have since been paying Tk 2,260 and four-wheeler owners Tk 4,628.

In the last four years alone, the BRTA raked in Tk 560 crore for providing 16.12 lakh plates and tags, according to BRTA documents.

But vehicle owners have hardly ever enjoyed the benefits because there are only 12 check posts to read the tags and all of them are in Dhaka.

The BTRA also does not engage anyone to monitor the system round the clock. "They took our money in the name of service. I have

never heard anyone getting the service," said Ahmed Rafi, whose uncle's motorcycle was stolen a few months ago.

Many owners do not even know about the system. Masuk Rana, a private employee, said he filed a case with Mirpur Police Station after his motorcycle got stolen from his home in Mirpur-2 in October last year. Whenever he contacted the police, they told him to wait. SEE PAGE 2 COL 3

### Stop recurrence of scams in banking sector

Full text of HC judgment stresses accountability of bank boards

The High Court has stressed the need for preventing financial scams in the banking sector.

In the full text of a verdict, it said some sensational financial scams involving a few banks have surfaced recently.

"It is appreciable that specific measures have been taken by the government organisations, including Bangladesh Bank, and that the Anti-Corruption Commission are investigating the scams. But we have to think and analyse [information] on the scams to prevent such crimes in the future," the HC said in the text, which has been released recently.

Putting emphasis on the modernisation of banking policies, the court also observed that bank managements, including the board of directors, must be transparent and accountable to the

## EC doubles the budget

The Election Commission will spend around Tk 40 crore for holding the Dhaka city polls on January 30, almost double the amount spent in the previous elections in 2015.

Nearly half of the agencies, including the police and Rapid Action Battalion, said EC officials.

**Election Commission** Senior Secretary M Alamgir said, "We have finalised the budget for the polls to Dhaka north and south city

The finance ministry has already approved the budget proposal, he told The Daily Star.

Alamgir said the budget went up as the EC had to arrange mock voting with Electronic Voting Machine and carry out campaigns

# Russell scripts Rajshahi's BBPL triumph

The Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur erupted with fireworks last night moments after Rajshahi Royals skipper Andre Russell erupted with a roar. He had bowled the last ball of the match, and in the process ensured that he became the first foreign captain to get his hands on a Bangladesh Premier League

trophy in the tournament's seventh edition. In a pulsating final

of the special edition of the tournament, named the Bangabandhu BPL to commemorate the birth centenary of father of the

nation Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, Rajshahi beat Khulna Tigers by 21 runs to win their first BPL trophy. Russell, who had singlehandedly carried the team to the final with a 22-ball 54 against Chattogram Challengers in the second qualifier on Wednesday, was adjudged the player-of-the-match. The West Indian hit a muscular 16-ball 27 to help lift the total to 170 for four, before taking two wickets for 32 runs - including the prize scalp of Khulna skipper Mushfiqur Rahim

to help restrict Khulna to 149 for eight. Khulna started badly in chase of the challenging total, losing both openers inside two overs after adding just 11 runs. Khulna's resurgence was then ensured by Shamsur Rahman and Rilee Rossouw. The duo strung together a crucial 74-run thirdwicket stand before Rossouw was dismissed

> in the 11th over, leaving Khulna at 85 for three.

The chase lost steam once again after Shamsur fell to a Kamrul Islam delivery in the 14th over after scoring a valiant 52 off 43 balls, which included four boundaries and two maximums.

However, as long as Mushfigur was at the wicket, Khulna had a chance. That is why Russell celebrated with vigour when he bowled his opposite number with an inch-perfect yorker in the 18th over to cut Khulna down to 134 for six.

Rajshahi pacer Mohammad Irfan also powled brilliantly, allowing just 18 runs from his four over while taking two wickets. He ensured that there would not be any late surge from Khulna by conceding just one

## It's a case of harassment

Noted personalities express concern over case against Prothom Alo editor, 9 others

Forty-seven noted citizens yesterday protested and condemned the filing of a case against Prothom Alo Editor and Publisher Matiur Rahman and nine others over the death of Naimul Abrar Rahat, a student of Dhaka Residential Model College.

"We consider this case to be motivated based on the manner in which various important government persons have made statements regarding this case, and the manner in which the editor of Prothom Alo has been implicated in this case," they said in a statement.

Even though the legal proceedings could have continued with issuance of a summon, an arrest warrant was issued,

By issuing the arrest warrant a few hours before the weekly holiday, the opportunity to seek protection from a higher court has been significantly reduced, they added.

"There is no way of considering this case as separate from the attacks one after another on freedom of expression in the country."

They demanded that the Prothom Alo editor and all other accused get complete legal remedy.

They urged all to refrain from using such cases to curb

### Punjab passes anti-CAA resolution

CM says draft sent to Centre to make changes to new law NDTV ONLINE


The Congress-led Punjab government yesterday passed a resolution against the controversial Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) in the state assembly, becoming the second state in the country to do so after Kerala.

"We have sent a draft to Centre to make changes necessary to make Citizenship Amendment Act acceptable to everyone. Census is being carried out now, it will be done on old level. Every citizen will be counted whether he is Muslim, Hindu, Sikh, Christian or anybody,' Punjab Chief Minister Amarinder Singh was quoted as saying by news agency ANI after the resolution got passed in the assembly.

Minister Brahm Mohindra moved the resolution in the Assembly by saying that the new
