

Ensure no attack on free speech

were issued

The opportunity to seek protection from a higher court shrunk as the arrest warrants were issued right before the weekend began, they added.

A Dhaka court on Thursday issued the arrest warrants in a case filed by the father of Naimul Abrar Rahat, a ninthgrader of Residential Model College, who was electrocuted during the anniversary programme of Prothom Alo's youth magazine Kishor Alo on November 1 last year.

The case was filed with the Fourth Chief Metropolitan Additional Magistrate's Court in Dhaka on November 6.

The charges brought against the accused are under section 304(A) of Bangladesh Penal Code. The section deals with deaths caused by "rash or negligent act".

According to the section, a person may face up to five years in jail if charges are proven against him or her.

'WARRANTS ISSUED FOR PUBLISHING TRUTH'

BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir yesterday said there is no freedom of expression in the country as the government is "oppressive".

"The government is repressing those who are engaged in writing and speaking the truth..." Fakhrul said at a programme at the Jatiya Press Club in the capital.

"What is the offence of Matiur Rahman? The offence is he wrote something. His newspaper publishes the truth and thus, he has been implicated in an unnatural death case," he said.

JOURNO BODIES VOICE CONCERN Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ) and Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ) in a joint statement yesterday called upon the government "not to repress, harass or arrest editors and journalists".

The statement was signed by BFUJ President Ruhul Amin Gazi, its Secretary General M Abdullah, along with DUJ President Kader Gani Chowdhury and its General Secretary Shahidul Islam.

INTERNATIONAL OUTCRY

The issuance of arrest warrants against Matiur and nine others hit the news in various countries on Thursday.

Washington Post, New York Times, Voice of America and Washington Times carried the AP news agency report on their online news portals.

The report said that the court had issued an arrest warrant against renowned editor Matiur Rahman and nine others regarding an incident where a schoolboy was electrocuted and died during an event.

In Canada, the Toronto-based news portal City News and the Vancouverbased radio channel News 1130 also carried the AP report. Turkey-The signatories to the statement based news agency Anadolu Agency published its own report regarding the arrest warrants.

Election now on Feb 1

decided to change the polls date. Speaking at a press briefing after the meeting yesterday, Chief Election Commissioner KM Nurul Huda said they shifted the polls date so that no one's religious sentiment is hurt.

He said they had earlier decided to hold the elections to Dhaka south and north city corporations on January 30 after being informed that the puja would be celebrated on January 29.

The CEC also said they talked to Education Minister Dipu Moni and requested her to take steps for deferring the SSC and its equivalent

The EC held the emergency meeting for four hours from 4:00pm with a break for the Maghrib prayers. The meeting was attended by CEC KM Nurul Huda and election commissioners Mahbub Talukdar, Rafiqul Islam, Kabita Khanam and retd brig general Shahadat Hossain Chowdhury. Other top EC officials, and returning officers of the city corporation polls were also present.

Talking to reporters later at her residence in the capital, Dipu Moni said her ministry decided that the exams would begin on February 3, instead of February 1, so that the EC could hold the polls on February 1.

Ziaul Haque, chief of Inter-Education Board Coordination Subcommittee and also the chairman of Dhaka education board, said they would notify students about the changes in the schedule today.

More than two million students are expected to take the exams this

The EC had announced the polls schedule on December 22. Members of the Hindu community were upset after learning that the voting would take place on the day of Saraswati

Saraswati Puja is observed at almost all educational institutions where worshippers gather to offer prayers. Usually, polling centres are also set up at schools, colleges and universities.

Many took to social media to criticise the EC's decision.

Election Commissioner Rafiqul Islam, however, said they had fixed the election date keeping in mind that Saraswati Puja, according to the government calendar, falls on January 29.

STRIKE WITHDRAWN

After the EC announced the new polls date, the DU students on fast-untodeath withdrew the strike last night.

China, Myanmar ink raft of deals
