## Cumilla univ teacher relieved from course

Cumilla University teacher Md Ali Rezwan Talukder, head of English department, has been relieved from all academic activities of evening master's course, after a female student of the programme accused him of sexual harassment.

University authority decided to investigate the matter through it's sexual harassment prevention cell.

Yesterday afternoon, a three-member probe committee was formed, headed by Kamrun Nahar Shila, assistant professor of Bangla department, confirmed Registrar Dr

Earlier, a female student of the evening master's course filed a written complaint to Dr Habibur Rahman, director of the evening programme, and the sexual harassment prevention cell against Md Ali Rezwan, saying he sexually harassed her and destroyed evidence saved in her cellphone.

At a press conference on Sunday afternoon, the accused teacher denied all allegations. He claimed the student was lying and blamed teachers' internal politics for the "conspiracy" against him.

Meanwhile, the complainant student said she filed a general diary with Cumilla Sadar South Police Station.

# Road crashes kill 3

A cattle trader was killed after a "Nasiman" (locally-made battery-run three-wheeler) carrying him plunged into a roadside ditch in Baliadangi of Thakurgaon on Sunday.

The victim, Giasuddin (45), was a resident of Duosuo Amtala village, reports our Thakurgaon correspondent. Md Hasibul Islam, OC of Baliadangi Police Station, said a group of 13 traders were going to Nekmarad Bazar with

their cattle in the afternoon. They were traveling on the Nasiman through Ranisan kail-Baliadangi road. The vehicle plunged into a nearby ditch after a wheel

came off, leaving fifteen people -- including the driver and his helper -- as well as the cattle injured.

On information, firefighters went to the spot and took them to Baliadangi Upazila Health Complex. From there, 10 of the injured were shifted to Thakurgaon Sadar Hospital. Giasuddin succumbed to his injuries in the evening.

In Dinajpur, a rickshaw-van puller was killed after being run over by a truck yesterday morning. The deceased was identified as Jahangir Alam (36),

reports our Dinajpur correspondent. Law enforcers said Jahangir was going to Phulbari area vhen he got hit by the truck on Dinajpur-Gobindaganj road in Baraihat area of the upazila. Jahangir died on the

The truck driver managed to flee the scene, police added.

# Bill placed at JS to open 49pc BRTC shares to public

A bill was placed in parliament yesterday, aimed at offering 49 percent shares of the state-owned Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation (BRTC) to the share market, and modernising the transport sector of the country.

Road Transport and Bridges Minister Obaidul Quader placed the bill -- titled "Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation Bill 2020" -- in the House, which was sent to the parliamentary standing committee on the respective ministry for scrutiny. The committee was asked to submit its report to the House within 14 working days.

In the bill, a new provision has been incorporated among the functions of BRTC. Under it, BRTC will have to render transport services during situations like strike, blockade, national emergency or disaster, Biswa Ijtema, freedom fighters' rally and emergency need of the state.

The bill was placed to update an ordinance promulgated in 1961, which included a provision to offload BRTC shares to the capital market.

The authorised capital of BRTC will be Tk 1,000 crore, which will be divided into 100 crore general shares with Tk 10 being the base price per share. The authorised capital of the corporation under the existing law is Tk 6 crore.

The paid-up capital of the corporation is Tk 3 crore in the existing law. Its new amount will be fixed after BRTC's annual general meeting or special general meeting. Its paid-up capital cannot exceed the authorised capital.

Authorised capital is the amount for which a company can issue shares to shareholders, while paid-up capital is the amount received from shareholders for the shares allotted to them

PRESS ENJOYING FULL FREEDOM: INFO MINISTER Newspaper and electronic media are enjoying full freedom, while the government has also ensured free flow of information to enhance national development, Information Minister Hasan Mahmud told the House yesterday.

In reply to a query from lawmaker Afzal Hossain, he said approval was given to set up 44 private television channels, 22 FM radios and 33 community radios as part of the "media-friendly government's moderate broadcast policy."

In a written answer, Mahmud said the government is not interfering in the freedom of newspapers and transmission of news independently in electronic media.

The minister said so far 3,597 online media has applied for registration since the process began in December 2015. who is not.

### 'Genocide not just about number of people killed'

Dr Ashis Nandy tells IR conference

Atwo-day long international conference on "Revisiting International (IR): Critical Reflections on 100 Years" concluded yesterday at Nabab Nawab Áli Chowdhury Senate Bhaban Auditorium of Dhaka University (DU).

While delivering the valedictorian speech, Dr Ashis Nandy, fellow of Centre for the Study of Developing Societies spoke about genocide, massive brutalisation of minorities, and nationalism.

"Genocide is not only about how many people were killed. It is also about what brutality the people faced; what was the impact on that group of people,' he said.

Nandy, psychologist, theorist and critic, also drew distinctions between nationalism and patriotism.

"Patriotismissentimental and nationalism is an ideology... Tagore wrote over 200 poems imbued with the spirit of patriotism but rejected nationalism, Dr Nandy said.

Addressing the session, former Foreign Secretary Md Shahidul Haque said the recent Rohingya crisis gave the state a chance to see who is its friend and

#### Shut 231 illegal factories along Buriganga: HC

The High Court yesterday asked the Department of Environment to shut 231 factories set up along the Buriganga River without environmental clearance.

Following a writ petition by Human Rights and Peace for Bangladesh, the bench of Justices Gobinda Chandra Tagore and Mohammad Ullah asked DoE to submit a report by February 22, and asked Wasa, Titas Gas and Dhaka Power Distribution Company to sever utility connections after receiving letters.

It directed DoE to submit another detail report in three months if there are any factories in areas around Dhaka without clearance.

On Sunday, DoE submitted a report saying there were 231 factories along Buriganga without environmental clearance.

### Shaheed Asad Day observed


