Tamim breaks silence with triple ton





Tamim was ruled out of action during the following series and did not even speak to reporters upon his return to cricket during the Bangabandhu Bangladesh Premier League. He opted to maintain his silence after the first phase of the tour to Pakistan last month, where his strike rate in the three-match T20I series was widely criticised.

But the 32-year-old finally broke his silence yesterday after a rather special achievement as Tamim registered the highest individual score by a Bangladeshi in first-class cricket. He was unbeaten on

the third day of a Bangladesh Cricket League match against Central Zone.

Tamim became the second Bangladesh player to register a triple hundred after Rakibul Hasan, who was actually the first one to congratulate him on the field after the left-hander took a single off Shuvagata Hom to reach the milestone. Tamim did not stop there and went on to surpass Rakibul's record for the highest individual score, set at 314, which the right-hander had proudly claimed for over twelve years.

All eyes were on Tamim after he resumed the third day on 222 at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur. The southpaw, who played with a rather attacking approach to reach his double ton the previous day, remained calm and watchful while approaching his triple hundred.


As a player you will always want your record to remain right

RAKIBUL HASAN CENTRAL ZONE BATSMAN

Riyad, Nafees and Shamsur tons set up South Zone

Central Zone at the Shere-Bangla National Cricket Stadium in Mirpur and a treble of tons from South Zone's Shahriar Nafees, Shamsur Rahman and Mahmudullah Riyad at the Zahur Ahmed Chowdhury Stadium against North Zone marked day three of the National Cricket League yesterday.

Tamim carried on from his unbeaten 222 yesterday to register the highest individual score in Bangladesh's firstclass cricket with an unbeaten 334 -- only the second batsman from Bangladesh to hit a triple hundred in Bangladesh following Rakibul Hasan's unbeaten 313 in the 2006 season -during a 585-minute stay at the crease over two days

The opener, who had starred in a 296-run partnership with Mominul Haque on the second day, yesterday combined in a an unbroken 197-run partnership for the third-wicket with Yasir Ali, who was on 62 as East Zone

The triple century also saw Tamim enter the seven thousand-run club in first-class cricket.

Central Zone lost three top-order batsmen in Saif Hassan, Soumya Sarkar and Nazmul Hossain -- the latter hitting a team-high 54 -- before reaching 115 for three at stumps with East Zone firmly on top with a 227run lead. East Zone's Nayeem Hasan bagged the wickets of Saif and Nazmul to finish with two for 36 while Abu layed bagged one wicket for 13 runs.

South Zone were in a similarly dominant position after the third day. Opener Shahriar Nafees starred in a 206-run stand with Shamsur Rahman for the second-wicket before the former fell after a 251-ball 111, having entered the eight thousand-run club.

Shamsur Rahman reached his ton before falling one over later for a 218-ball 109. Anamul Haque, who had retired hurt on the second day, came back to the crease to partner Mahmudullah Riyad. The duo upped the scoring-rate, notching a 110-ball 155-run partnership for the fourth wicket, with Riyad hitting an unbeaten

declared at 555 for two after lunch. 70-ball 100 laced with eight fours and five sixes. Anamul scored a 59-ball 64 before South Zone declared at 398 for three. Mizanur Rahman and Rony Talukdar took North Zone to stumps without losing any wickets, trailing by 432 runs.

Bangladesh will play five warm-up matches in Australia before beginning their World T20 campaign proper when they face India on February 24 in Perth.

The Tigresses will then take on hosts

Australia in Canberra on February 27 Salma Khatun and her troop will face New Zealand in Melbourne on February 29 and then Sri Lanka on March 2 at the same venue.
