No high rises along Cox's Bazar coast

PM directs authorities

BSS, Dhaka

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday asked the authorities concerned not to build high-rise establishments along the sea in Cox's Bazar.

"We will not allow construction of high-rise structures along the sea as it will harm the natural beauty of Cox's Bazar," she said.

Speaking at a programme at her office in the capital, Hasina said tourism parks should be developed without spoiling the natural beauty of the region.

The programme was organised to present the master plans of three special tourism parks, to be built in Cox's Bazar, before the PM.

The Bangladesh Economic Zones Authority (BEZA) has been tasked with setting up the Sonadia Eco-Tourism Park in Moheshkhali upazila and NAF and Sabrang Tourism Parks in Teknaf upazila of Cox's Bazar.

The aim of the master plans is to develop tourism-friendly zones protecting ecological balance and biodiversity, national heritage, culture, and tradition.

Hasina directed the authorities concerned to set up structures in the tourism parks by ensuring that those would be tolerant to disasters such as earthquake, cyclone, and tidal surge.

RELIGIOUS, EDN INSTITUTIONS Structures close to city rivers to be relocated

UNB, Dhaka

State Minister for Shipping Khalid Mahmud Chowdhury yesterday said the government would take up a project to relocate religious and educational establishments built within the boundaries of the rivers in and around the capital.

"We don't want to evict religious structures. We have discussed with the government whether it would be possible to build these structures in a planned way," he said at a meeting in this regard.

Khalid said the government wanted to free the rivers surrounding the capital to make the city livable.

The state minister was speaking at the meeting with officials of religious affairs ministry, Islamic Foundation, Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority and two Dhaka city corporations.

He said 113 religious and educational establishments were built along the Buriganga, Turag, Balu, Shitalakkhya and Dhaleshwari rivers.

Of the establishments, 77 are mosques, madrasas, orphanages, and shrines, five graveyards and places for washing dead bodies, an Eidgah, 14 schools and colleges, and 13 temples, bathing places and crematoriums.

"We are yet to make any move against those structures which are related to religious sentiment. A discussion is underway in this regard," the state minister added.

Khalid assured that these structures

'CROSSFIRE THREAT' 7 cops sued for extorting money from businessman

Seven policemen, including two officers-in-charge of Chattogram, were sued yesterday for their alleged involvement in taking Tk 23 lakh from a businessman by "threatening to kill him in a crossfire".

Yasin, 55, owner of M/S Yasin Enterprise in Chattogram city, filed a case with the court of Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Mohiuddin Murad.

The man, a resident of Khulshi, accused Khandokar Ataur Rahman, former OC of Bayezid Bostami Police Station; Pritan Sarkar, incumbent OC of the police station; Sub-inspector Aftab; assistant sub-inspectors Ibrahim and Mitun Nath; and constables Rahman and Saiful of the police station.

Mentionable, Ataur joined Chandgaon Police Station as OC in January this year.

SpaceX to send four tourists into deep orbit

SpaceX announced a new partnership Tuesday to send four tourists deeper into orbit than any private citizen before them, in a mission that could take place by 2022 and easily cost more than \$100 million.

The company signed the deal with Space Adventures, which is based in Washington and served as an intermediary to send eight space tourists to the International Space Station (ISS) via Russian Soyuz rockets.

The first of these was Dennis Tito, who paid \$20 million for an eight hour stay on the ISS back in 2001. The last to go was Cirque du Soleil founder Guy Laliberte, in 2009.

MONEY LAUNDERING Global watchdog to put Myanmar on watchlist

Myanmar is set to be placed on a watchlist by a global finance watchdog this week, amid concerns of money-laundering by transnational drug traffickers and weak regulation of its financial system, two sources familiar with deliberations said.

A decision to put Myanmar on the "grey list" by the Paris-based Financial Action Task Force (FATF) would mean the inter-governmental body had found "strategic deficiencies" in the country's ability to counter money-laundering and terrorism financing.

While being on the list does not carry any sanctions, it could curtail the growth of financial, investment and trade flows to and from the Southeast Asian nation, a high-level official, speaking on condition of anonymity, told Reuters.

Kyaw Win Thein, the head of Myanmar's Financial Intelligence Unit who is attending the FATF meeting in Paris this week, told Reuters that Myanmar "is not on the grey list so far". Its fate will be decided at a plenary meeting on Thursday, he said.

The FATF typically announces its decisions on Friday at the end of its Paris plenary meetings.

Kyaw added that Myanmar's government has developed
