HelloTalk

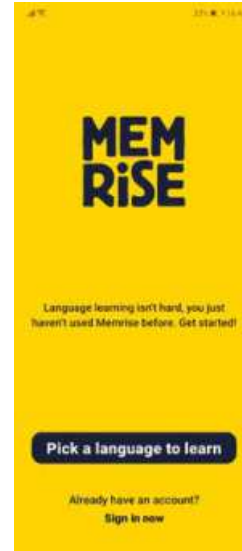

If you're using HelloTalk's voice recognition system, you can record your speech and the app will convert that to text and send it to your language partner.

with the help of the app's new feature, you can exchange doodles and unleash your inner artist as well.

Memrise

With the help of Memrise, you can learn languages through spaced repetition and mnemonics. The courses are often paired with memes and designed to help you remember the vocabulary. The app incorporates questions and quizzes, so it's not just another flashcard app. One of the best features of Memrise is the app using short videos to show how native speakers express different phrases in their daily conversation. It also helps you spot patterns in the language of your choice to make it easier for you to improve your skills.
