'Unwanted obstruction'

BRTC's move to launch inter-district routes hit hard as pvt transport owners continue resisting it citing 16-year-old deal, directives

Private transport owners are obstructing the BRTC initiative to launch new buses, mostly double-deckers, on different routes in the country as they fear this will slash their

In their defence, they also cite a 16-year-old deal and some directives issued by the Bangladesh Road Transport Corporation though there is a huge public demand for BRTC buses on inter-district routes as its services are relatively cheaper.

As per the directives and the deal signed in 2003 between the government represented by the then communications minister Nazmul Huda and Bangladesh Road Transport Workers Federation, the BRTC would not run doubledeckers on inter-district routes.

Rab details how Papia, aided by her husband, ran sex, arms, drugs trades; Jubo Mohila League expels her

Rab yesterday raided two flats belonging to Jubo Mohila League leader Shamima Nur Papia and her husband Mofizur Rahman Sumon after arresting them from Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport on Saturday.

Raiding the two flats on Indira Road in the city's Farmgate area and also a presidential suite at a fivestar hotel, Rab recovered around Tk 58 lakh in cash.

Apart from the lavish flats in Dhaka, Papiya, 28, and Sumon, 38, a former Chhatra League leader, possess two more flats and two plots worth around Tk two crore in Narsingdi and several luxurious cars, Rab said at a press briefing yesterday.

The two were arrested from HSIA when they were trying to flee the country. Rab seized counterfeit notes, foreign currencies

and around Tk 2.5 lakh from their possessions. Their accomplices, Sabbir Khandaker, 29, and Sheikh Taiyaba, 22, were also arrested from HSIA. In addition to the fake notes and currencies,
