

Messi gives troubled Barca hope

well enough to win this season's Champions League but his four goals against Eibar on Saturday

were a reminder that with him there will always be hope

Barca play Napoli in the first leg of the last 16 on Tuesday and will be expected to go through, even if their opponents are on a strong run, having won six out of their last seven matches, including victories over Juventus and Inter Milan.

Yet despite a whirlwind couple of months of political wrangling, remarkably Barcelona approach this tie sitting top of La Liga and with a spring in their step, in large part due to Messi.

His quadruple in the 5-0 rout at Camp Nou on Saturday was cathartic and not only because Real Madrid, whom Barca face in the Clasico on Sunday, failed to regain first place after losing to Levante a few hours later.

"It was a win we needed," said coach Quique Setien.

Messi has scored seven quadruples in his career but none executed amid such an intense time of pressure, with the spotlight on the Argentine.

While other players might have sulked or crumbled, Messi delivered with another breathtaking performance that underlined his ability to drag this troubled team through even the most turbulent of periods.

'He's been in this form for 14 or 15 years and he keeps performing like this," said Setien.

"He's a guarantee for any club and for any coach and that's what makes him the best player in the world. He can do things that others can only dream about.

Messi could have had many reasons to feel upset but he hasn't let them affect his performances.

Barcelona's board sacked Ernesto Valverde last month, despite Messi's public backing three days before, and failed to sign a striker in the transfer window with Luis Suarez and Ousamane Dembele both out injured.

The club's technical secretary Eric

Abidal then said the squad were the main reason for Valverde's departure while the president, Josep Maria Bartomeu, has been accused of hiring a PR company that criticised key players, including Messi, in a bid to improve his image online.

Barcelona have denied the allegations but when asked in an interview with Mundo Deportivo last week if he was convinced. Messi said he would wait to see if they were true.

He also admitted, "the way we are at the moment, I don't think it's enough to win the Champions League" and identified Real Madrid, Juventus, Paris Saint-Germain and Liverpool as greater threats.

Setien was more optimistic on Friday. "There are things that I agree with and others evidently... I have seen every year how Champions Leagues are won and I think we could have the same chance as other teams," he said. Yet if Messi were to win the

Champions League this season, it look to Messi.

would surely represent one of his most impressive achievements.

With the likes of Frenkie de Jong and Arthur Melo in midfield and the excellent Marc-Andre ter Stegen in goal, they do not lack for talent but weaknesses in defence remain, not to mention a fragility against the counterattack.

And by appointing Setien, a coach devoted to a very particular style, Barcelona are having to change midseason, with Setien admitting this month that it would take time for the players to understand his methods.

"It's not easy," said Messi. "We come from playing under Valverde to playing differently now and being asked to do something else. The truth is we are learning and we still have a lot to learn.

But with in-form Napoli fastapproaching and then Madrid to come at the Santiago Bernabeu, time is not on Barcelona's side. For now, they will

Team BJMC opt out of c'ship league SPORTS REPORTER

Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC) has recently withdrawn its football team from the upcoming Bangladesh Championship League, the second-tier professional football league, citing

financial constraints. Team BJMC returned to top-fight football in the 2011-12 season after being relegated from the second division in 1982. Team BJMC played in the Bangladesh Premier League for seven successive seasons before being relegated to Bangladesh Championship League last year.

"In line with a decision of board of directors on April 20, 2019, it is not possible for Team BJMC to take part in Bangladesh Championship League due to financial crisis. The activities of BJMC football team can be resumed from the next season, subject to

availability of sponsors," said a BJMC letter signed by Mohammad Nasimul Islam, director general of BJMC. BJMC placed the letter

to Bangladesh Football Federation on February 10, the day the interclub players' transfer for 13-team Bangladesh Championship League got underway.

Not only the football team, BJMC is set to terminate temporary contracts with nearly 250 athletes who have been representing the company in different disciplines as part of its decision to terminate temporary contracts of some 1800

employees.

Mueller out to show what Germany is missing

A year after being dumped by Germany head coach Joachim Loew, Thomas Mueller is set to showcase why he is so important for Bayern Munich -- and Robert Lewandowski --

at Chelsea in the Champions League. Alongside Erling Braut Haaland, Bayern's star striker Lewandowski is joint top-scorer in the Champions League with 10 goals going into the last 16, first-leg clash on Tuesday.

In order to keep him fresh, Mueller was second-half replacement in Friday's 3-2 league win over bottom side Paderborn when Lewandowski netted twice.

The Poland striker is on a career-high 38 goals after 32 games in all competitions and is happiest with Mueller alongside him.

"It's easier with Thomas next to me, he helps me out a lot," Lewandowski has said of Mueller.

"We always have one player more in the penalty area when he plays, I have more space and not always two or three opponents against me.

It's no coincidence that Lewandowski is enjoying his highest goal tally just when Mueller's 14 assists in Germany's top flight also puts him near his personal best.

The 30-year-old is back to his best after significant setbacks for club and country in 2019.

Alongside fellow 2014 World Cup winners Mats Hummels and Jerome Boateng, Mueller was told last March he was no longer needed by Germany as Joachim Loew rebuilt his squad following the 2018 World Cup debacle.

But when Niko Kovac was sacked in November, caretaker coach Hansi Flick restored Mueller to the starting line-up, often at Coutinho's expensive, and he has flourished.

Mueller was superb in their recent 4-1 win at Cologne, drawing defenders to create goals for Kingsley Coman and Lewandowski as Bayern raced into a 3-0 lead after 12 minutes.

What makes Mueller unique is that he is neither a striker, nor an attacking midfielder, but describes himself as a 'Raumdeuter' -- an interpreter of space.

He is at his deadliest with perfectlytimed runs and quick passes so that his presence in the penalty area creates space for Lewandowski.

Virat refused to excuses for India's CROKET comprehensive

loss to New Zealand in the first Test in Wellington on Monday with the skipper saying his side were simply "not good enough".

The world's top-ranked team crashed to a 10-wicket defeat in the first session of day four to snap a nine-Test unbeaten streak dating back to the 2018 Boxing Day Test in Melbourne.

It was also India's first loss in eight games in the World Test Championship, although they remain at the head of the table, while New Zealand lie fifth with two wins from six matches.

Faced with a first innings deficit of 183 -- after being sent in to bat first on a green wicket and on a windy, overcast day -- India were rolled for 191 in the second innings leaving New Zealand a mere 10 runs for victory.

"We did not show enough competitiveness," Kohli said as his batsmen failed in the face of New Zealand's three-pronged seam attack of senior bowlers Tim Southee and Trent Boult, and newcomer Kyle Jamieson, who took 18 of the 20 wickets.

Player-of-the-match Southee took four for 20 on the final morning to

finish with five for 61 after grabbing four wickets in the first innings.

"We let ourselves down massively in the first innings with the bat," Kohli said.

"You could say the toss played a big role in this Test match but it's an uncontrollable so you can't really focus on that and take that as a massive factor.

"We don't want to make too much of this pitch and what conditions were like. The simple truth is we did not play good enough cricket and that's why we

"Some people might want it to be the end of the world but it's not. For us it's a game of cricket we lost and we move on, we keep our heads high."

New Zealand captain Kane Williamson described New Zealand's 100th Test victory as a "special effort with the ball and some handy contributions with the bat."

With short-ball specialist Neil Wagner unavailable, the New Zealand bowlers were forced to mix up their attack which hindered the Indian batsmen ability to settle.

"We tried doing thing a little bit differently," Williamson said.

"The best part of the bowling performance was their ability to put the ball into an area that creates the most opportunity for dismissals like lbws, bowled or caught behind and

we saw that today with the change of lengths to create that."

Southee said a mix of short balls and swinging deliveries had unsettled India's batsmen.

"It's been about buying into what the team needs ... and being willing to try things and look to break the momentum of the batting side," he said

- 'They outplayed us' -

While New Zealand bowlers made the most of home conditions in their first Test since being thrashed 3-0 in Australia, it was late order batting that made a critical difference.

The last three wickets in New Zealand's first innings produced 123 runs while the last three for India scored 22 in the first innings and two in the second.

Kohli believed if India had been able to post a first innings of around 240 it would have given his bowlers a better number to defend, but they had to accept they were outsmarted by the New Zealand bowlers.

"They get in the mind of the batsmen and then make the batsmen do something that they don't want to," he said

"To be honest they did not give us any room even on the back foot or the front foot so we have to accept they outplayed us in this game and they bowled much better than we did."
