World Bank restores relations with Somalia

The World Bank moved Thursday to reestablish relations with Somalia after a 30-year break, paving the way for the country to have access to lowcost development aid.

Contact was severed in 1991 as the country descended into conflict, but recently it has made efforts to rebuild, even as it faces violence from the Al-Shabaab jihadist group.

"Somalia has made important reforms and has demonstrated strong commitment to staying the course," said Hafez Ghanem, World Bank vice president for Africa.

"These reforms lay the foundation for sustained poverty reduction and better lives for the Somali people, and open the door to private sector investment that can create jobs and drive the economy forward," he said in a statement.

This month the African nation has won initial approval from World Bank and IMF to get hundreds of millions in debt relief.

Earth captures

The quantum of sentence will be pronounced by the court on March 17, they added.

In 2014, the National Investigation Agency (NIA), which is investigating the terror angle of the Burdwan incident on October 2, 2014, booked Rahamatullah, Burhan and a few others under the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) and the Explosive Substances Act.

Alarm after 33 Turkish troops killed

The reprisals killed 16 Syrian soldiers, according to a monitoring group, but there was no immediate confirmation

The repair work was conducted

between April and June in 2014. When the boats were handed to

at least 40 errors, including leakage on the keels and engine malfunction.

Humayun Kabir, master of PB Shomikkha, said it was not possible to buy new boats of the same caliber when the finance ministry allocated Tk 5 crore. Thus, a decision of repairing the boats came.

However, repairing the boats did not make anything better, he added. WHAT HAPPENS NOW? Mohammad Nazmul Karim Kislu,

managing director of Chittagong Dry Dock Ltd, said the boats were repaired long ago and the company was not even under Bangladesh Navy back then. However, if the customs authorities

Muhammad Aminur Rahman, member Customs Audit, Modernisation and International Trade) of NBR, said they had no information about any irregularities in the boats' repair work. "Actions will be taken if anyone is

Israeli ex-general takes third jab at ousting Netanyahu

Former armed forces chief Benny Gantz will take a fresh shot at unseating Israel's veteran Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Monday after two previous electoral showdowns ended in deadlock.

The 60-year-old has been in the public eye since first declaring political ambitions and running against Netanyahu in December 2018.

Within months, his centrist Blue and White party shocked Israeli politics by matching Netanyahu's rightwing Likud in polls last April and then edged it in September.

Three killed

injured. The two were sent to Sonagazi Upazila Health Complex where doctors declared them dead.

Police claimed to have recovered two locally-made arms and several bullets from the spot.

Speaking to reporters, Dr Ismail Hossain of the health complex said police brought the duo dead. The bodies bore marks of bullet wounds, he added.

The bodies were sent to Feni General Hospital morgue for autopsies.

At the hospital, Badsha Miah of Char Krisnajoy village in Sonagazi identified one of the two dead as his son Shamsul Huda Nishan, 23.

Talking to newsmen at the hospital, he said Shamsul attended a court hearing in a robbery case on Thursday and later went to Feni's Boro Bazar area for shopping ahead of his sister's wedding, scheduled for

Around 1:00pm on Thursday, another accused in the robbery case, Sujon, called him out of his home. Shamsul had been missing since then.

The other dead was identified as Shariful Islam, 28. His father Obaidul Haque said they couldn't contact Shariful after he attended the court hearing on Thursday.

Both the families said Shamsul and Shariful were falsely implicated in the robbery case.

'SHOÓTOUT' IN JASHORE

was killed in a "gunfight" with police in Monirampur upazila early

yesterday, police said. The dead, Md Nuruzzaman alias Nurul Haque alias Keru, was accused in 12 cases, Towhidul Islam, additional superintendent of Jashore

police, told The Daily Star. According to the first information report (FIR) filed with Monirampur Police Station in this connection, a mob in Keshabpur upazila caught two people, including Nuruzzaman, around 7:00pm on Thursday when they were fleeing with a battery-run easy-bike.

On information, police rescued the two and later learnt from them that Nuruzzaman was a robber.

Taking Nuruzzaman along with them, police carried out a drive in Kotwali and Monirampur areas around 11:45pm on Thursday to recover illegal arms.

The FIR said Nuruzzaman's associates put up barricades on the road to prevent police from moving ahead. They fired shots at the cops and tried to snatch the detainee. The law enforcers fired back in self defence.

At one stage, Nuruzzaman tried to flee, but he was hit by bullets fired by his associates.

He was rushed to a hospital in Monirampur upazila where doctors pronounced him dead around

Jahangir then helped some of his neighbours escape to the adjacent building's rooftop. Jahangir suffered leg injuries and his wife Umme Kulsum spinal wounds while going to the rooftop of the adjacent building. She attended the funeral on a stretcher.
