A bloody day on roads

16 perish in 4 dists; victims include 7 of a family, 5 SSC examinees

At least 16 people, including seven in a single incident, died and 15 others were injured in different road crashes in four districts yesterday.

In Netrokona, five Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinees were killed and 18 others injured in a road accident in Durgapur upazila.

The accident took place in Shantinagor area on the Birisihi-Netrakona road around 9:00pm, reports our Mymensingh correspondent quoting police.

One of the victims was identified as Ridoy Mia, 16, son of Romzan Ali of Shalihor village in Gouripur. Identities of the four others, all of them male, could not be known

"23 SSC examinations from different educational institutions in Gouripur upazila of Mymensingh came to Birisiri for picnic travelling on two pick-up vans this morning [Saturday]," said Mahmuda Sharmin Nely, assistant superintendent of police (Durgapur-Kalmakanda Circle).

"When they were returning home, a Birisiri-bound truck from the opposite direction collided with the pick-up vans, and another sand-laden truck hit the vans from behind, leaving three dead on the spot and injuring others," said Superintendent of Netrakona Police Md Akbar Ali Munshi. Of the injured, two died on the way to a local hospital,

said the SP. The other injured were admitted to Purbadhala Health Complex and Durgapur Upazila Health Complex in Netrakona. Of them, three were referred to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital as their condition deteriorated, the official also said.

Muggers lurk on city streets

Police on special drive, arrest 42 suspects

Wearing decent clothes and looking like a gentleman, one of them would greet you on the street or at a terminal.

"Assalamu Alaikum, how are you,

The chances are, you would stop for a moment and wonder if you knew him from somewhere. Once you stop, several men would appear at the scene, surround you, and mug you at knifepoint.

"Do not scream. Give us everything you have," they would tell you.

Several groups of muggers in the capital employ many other tricks to mug people.

Detectives in a special drive arrested 42 suspected muggers in different areas in the last few days, Abdul Baten, additional commissioner of Detective Branch of police, told a press conference at the Media Centre of Dhaka Metropolitan Police yesterday.

"Most of the arrestees had been accused of mugging in cases filed earlier," he said. Meanwhile, a middle-aged woman died

in Mugda area yesterday morning after she fell off a rickshaw because muggers in a moving car grabbed and snatched away her purse, causing her to fall from the moving three-wheeler.

Baten said bag snatching had become frequent in the city and the victims were mostly women.

Another trick employed by the muggers is, one of them would bump into a pedestrian and blame them of breaking their phone. The muggers would then corner the victim and rob him, the official added.

Normalcy returns to Delhi

Signs of normalcy returned to riot-hit areas of northeast Delhi yesterday with people venturing out of their homes to buy groceries and medicines from a few shops that were opened amid intensified patrolling by security personnel.

Since early morning, civic workers were seen glass shards and burnt vehicles and tyres in the aftermath of three days violence that left 42 people dead and over 200 injured.

The number of people and vehicles in the streets of Jaffrabad, Maujpur, Yamuna Vihar, Chand Bagh, Mustafabad and Bhajanpura was higher than those in the previous five days.

These are among the areas worst affected by the communal violence that erupted on February 23 over the controversial Citizenship Amendment

Personnel of the Delhi Police and paramilitary forces encouraged people to open their shops and appealed for peace and communal harmony.

Ekushey book fair ends with big turnout

The month-long Ekushey book the country's biggest congregation of booklovers, authors, and publishers, ended yesterday with a massive turnout.

This year the fair, which offers city dwellers an oasis of solace amid the busy urban life, has witnessed the highest number of new books hitting the shelves in the last five years.

Many of the publishers seemed very happy with the sales on the last day of the fair while a few expressed dissatisfactions.

Member secretary of the fair organising committee Jalal Ahmed said the arrangement this time was better than the previous years.

While reading out the closing report, he said a total of 4,919 new titles hit the fair this year with 184 of them on the last day.

Like the previous years, books on poetry, novel and short story dominated the new arrival list.

According to Bangla Academy, the number of new titles was 4,834 in 2019, 4,591 in 2018, 3,646 in 2017 and 3,444 in 2016.

Jalal said according to organisers' estimates, the combined sale at this year's book fair was about Tk 82 crore, a rise from Tk 77.55 crore last year. publishers

US, Taliban sign historic peace deal

Agree 14 months' timetable for a full foreign troops withdrawal AFP, Doha

The United States signed a landmark deal with the Taliban yesterday, laying out a timetable for a full troop withdrawal from Afghanistan within 14 months as it seeks an exit from its longest war. The agreement is expected to lead to a dialogue between

the Taliban and the Kabul government that, if successful, could ultimately see an end to the grinding 18-year conflict. Taliban fighter-turned-dealmaker Mullah Baradar signed the accord alongside Washington's chief negotiator Zalmay Khalilzad, in a conference room in a luxury hotel in the Qatari capital.
