Plea for Khaleda's Release

## Family wrote to home ministry a few days ago

Fakhrul tells reporters STAFF CORRESPONDENT

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia's family members have applied to the home ministry for her "temporary" release, party Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul İslam Alamgir told reporters yesterday.

He said the application was filed a few days ago but did not specify whether the BNP chief had sought

None of the Khaleda's family members could be reached for comments.

Asked whether the party would seek any parole, the BNP leader said, "We repeatedly said seeking parole is completely depending on the choice of Khaleda Zia and her family."

Fakhrul came up with the disclosure when he, along with Gazipur BNP leaders, went to BNP founder Ziaur Rahman's grave to place wreaths.

Referring to GK Shamim's bail, he alleged that a criminal got bail. "It proves that there is no rule of law in the country.

"It also proves that Khaleda Zia is kept behind bars just out of political vengeance. A criminal got bail but a former prime minister did not," he

Khaleda, who is now in the prison ward of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University, has been in jail since she was convicted in the Zia Orphanage Trust corruption case on February 8, 2018. She was found guilty in another graft case later the same year.

"We will continue the Mujib Borsho celebration programmes between March 17, 2020, and March 26, 2021 Considering the prevailing situation across the world caused by the coronavirus outbreak, we are going to rearrange the programmes," he told reporters after a meeting with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at the Gono

Bhaban. "The re-scheduled programmes will be declared tomorrow [today] after a meeting of the committee, said Kamal, a former principal

secretary to the PM. He said commemorative notes, stamps and other publications would be unveiled on March 17.

## Kyrgyz police arrest dozens at Women's Day march

Police in Kyrgyzstan yesterday arrested dozens of protesters -- most of them women -- at a rally to mark International Women's Day after masked men attacked them and tore up their placards.

An AFP correspondent saw dozens of women detained and placed in police vehicles in the centre of the capital Bishkek where women's groups had begun to rally against gender-based violence.

The detentions came after the men wearing face masks and pointed national hats attacked the crowd, tearing up their posters, popping balloons with toy pistols and throwing eggs at the women before fleeing the

Erlan Atantayev, deputy head of the Sverdlovsky police department where the women were taken, told AFP that the protesters had been detained for their own safety and because police had not been warned about the rally.

"Clashes began between the demonstrators and men wearing the face masks," said Atantayev

"We detained (the women) for

violation of public order." Atantayev said that some of the demonstrators could face fines for

resisting police. Police also detained three male assailants but did not chase after those who ran away.

Journalist Nurjamal Djanibekova said that one of the attackers broke her telephone to prevent her filming

Djanibekova said 70 people were being held in the Sverdlovsky police station. Atantayey told AFP police were carrying out "explanatory work" with the detained protesters.

A court in Kyrgyzstan this week banned rallies in the centre of Bishkek until July 1 in response to a request by the city administration.

## First coronavirus cases confirmed

"The situation is not that bad. Officials in hospitals that have no PPE will manage it locally. Maybe they will wear two aprons," DG of DGHS Prof AK Azad told The Daily Star last night.

A local company has started supplying PPE to the government, he

Prof Azad, however, didn't say how many PPEs would be supplied.

Sources said the government has around 3,000 test kits and many more will be needed.

"Since we had no confirmed cases before, the WHO didn't provide us with the equipment. Today [yesterday], we have talked to the WHO officials. They would provide those soon," Prof Azad added. **RESPONSE PLAN HAS HOLES** 

"The main problem with this new virus is it is highly contagious. No patient should be taken to a general hospital; they should be treated in facilities, may be makeshift one, dedicated

only for Covid-19 patients," Prof Muzaherul Huq, founder of Public Health Foundation of Bangladesh, told The Daily Star.

He added, "A single coronavirus patient will put other patients of the hospital at risk. It is a faulty and risky He added that a widespread awareness campaign should be

launched immediately. "Even the healthcare employees

don't seem prepared," the former WHO regional director said.

He suggested that the government inform people about its response plans immediately so that people can

Even a single infection may pose a grave danger," added Prof Huq.

Prof Nazrul Islam, former vicechancellor of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University said, "The government has formed a national advisory committee, but it has no virologist. It seems like the

The government has prepared a fourtier emergency response plan. The country is at level-2 after the cases were confirmed.

If the situation deteriorates and the country has more than 10 confirmed cases with more local transmissions in multiple areas, the emergency would be raised to level-3 and level-4 would mean there is an epidemic.

At level 3 or 4, the administration would lock down areas having high numbers of patients and quarantine the suspected cases.

colleges and Local schools, public institutions would be used as quarantine centres, while the isolation units at hospitals would handle severe

'We have engaged representatives from all departments of the government. The law enforcing agencies would help implementing the plan," Prof Azad said.

He added that it was not necessary to admit all patients to hospitals as 82 percent of the cases are mild and can be treated at home. STAY ALERT

The government has asked people to stay alert, reports UNB.

It also asked people to wear masks in crowded places and avoid contact with pet animals.

Besides, people have been asked to keep their houses clean, wash their hands after returning home, and only eat boiled food.

AG Mahbubey Alam said Deputy Attorney General Md Fazlur Rahman Khan (FR Khan), who is engaged with the HC bench of Justice AKM Asaduzzaman and Justice SM Mozibur Rahman, told him that he (FR Khan) did not know about the HC order that granted bail to Shamim.

Deputy Attorney General Jannatul Ferdoushi Rupa, who is engaged with the HC bench of Justice Md Rezaul Haque and Justice Bhishmadev Chakrabortty, told me that there is a mess-up in the name of GK Shamim in his bail petition on which the bench granted him bail," he added.

DAGs FR Khan and Jannatul Ferdoushi Rupa could not be reached for their comments over cell phones despite repeated attempts.

Meanwhile yesterday, Law Minister Anisul Huq said the government will examine the issues regarding the state counsels' (DAGs) unawareness about the HC's granting bail to GK Shamim.

The HC benches granted bail to Shamim in the narcotics and arms cases as he (Shamim) has been in jail for over five months, while the maximum punishment in the cases is six months' imprisonment, his lawyer Shawkat Osman told The Daily Star on Saturday.

The lawyer said Shamim could not be released from jail following the HC order, as he is arrested in two other

Shamim, an influential contractor of the Public Works Department and an expelled Jubo League leader, on charges of extortion and tender manipulation. His bodyguards were also arrested. On that day, Rab raided his house

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested

and office in the city's Niketan area and seized eight firearms, a huge amount of ammunition, bank fixed deposits worth Tk 165 crore, around Tk 1.8 crore in cash, a large stash of US and Singaporean dollars and some foreign alcohol.

# Shutdown not in consideration yet

He said this while replying to questions about the measures they were taking and whether they would close schools across the country. The education ministry oversees 41,906 schools, colleges, madrasas and universities, with 1.94 crore students and 5.59 lakh teachers.

"We are closely monitoring the situation. We will act according to the situation and take necessary steps, Secondary and Higher Education Division Secretary Mahbub Hossain

"No such situation has arisen for us to close down schools and colleges. But everyone should avoid mass gatherings," Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research Director Meerjady Sabrina Flora said.

Three Bangladeshis, including two of a family who returned from Italy, have been infected with coronavirus, IEDCR confirmed yesterday.

Against this backdrop, many have requested the guardians government to close schools as a precautionary measure to prevent the spread of the virus.

"Many countries have already announced the shutdown of schools.

Our government should follow suit. My children are my biggest priorities. I will not send my children to school," said Jahanara Begum, a guardian in Rampura.

Motijheel Ideal School and College Principal Shahan Ara Begum said that closing schools might cause panic among the citizens. "We have already asked all students to wash their hands properly," she added.

À government hospital pediatrician said although the mortality rate of children due to the coronavirus is low, mass gathering can be a hot bed for the spread of the novel virus.

The shutting down of schools is the best option. But if the government cannot do that, they should instruct all guardians not to send their children to school if they feel feverish or are suffering from a cough or cold," the doctor added. "If possible, school authorities

should sanitise the schools and fumigate each classroom every day," the doctor proposed. Meanwhile in India, some states have closed down schools as the

number of coronavirus cases there reached 31 on Friday. On Saturday, the Jammu and Kashmir

government ordered all primary schools in Jammu and Samba districts to shut down till March 31 with immediate effect as the union territory braced itself for possible coronavirus cases. On Friday, Biswa Bharati authorities

Delhi will remain closed till March 31 to prevent the spread of coronavirus, the Delhi government said on Thursday. The government also asked all schools not to conduct school assemblies. UNESCO said the coronavirus has

hit the education sector hard. A record number of students are not attending schools because of temporary or indefinite school shutdowns mandated by governments in an attempt to slow the spread of COVID-19.

As of March 4, 22 countries in three different continents have announced or implemented school shutdowns.

Thirteen countries have shut schools nationwide, impacting almost 290 million students, who would normally attend pre-primary to uppersecondary classes.

countries are Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bahrain, China [including Hong Kong and Macao], Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Georgia, Iran, Italy, Japan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Mongolia, Republic of Korea and United Arab Emirates.

Nine other countries have implemented localised school shutdowns to prevent or contain the spread of the virus. Should these countries also order nationwide school shutdowns, it would prevent an additional 180 million students from attending school, said UNESCO.

Campaign for Popular Education Executive Director Rasheda K Choudhury said that shutting down schools can hamper the academic calendar.

"The government should take preventative measures, including very strong awareness programmes. They should immediately issue directives regarding the do's and don'ts at schools and those should be properly circulated among students," she said.

"They are making genuine sacrifices. @WHO stands in solidarity with Italy & is here to continue supporting you," WHO Director General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus tweeted.

Pope Francis expressed solidarity Sunday with the victims of the novel coronavirus in his first livestreamed prayer and message from the Vatican, reports AFP.

Two more people succumbed to the coronavirus in Washington state in US, officials said, bringing the nationwide toll to 19, while the number of confirmed cases in New York rose to 89. Governor Andrew Cuomo of New York issued a declaration of emergency.
