

Electric poles in the middle of now widened road

Vehicles face trouble on the regional highway in Barguna; no fund yet to shift the poles to side

Hundreds of electric poles, now standing in the middle of the road due to widening of a 21-kilometre regional highway in Barguna, causes trouble for vehicular movement, in addition to disturbance in the road renovation work.

The road widening work from Purakata ferry terminal to Baroitola ferry terminal began in 2018 and the Tk 100-crore project is expected to be complete by June this year, said sources at Barguna Roads and Highways Department (RHD).

As the road widened, the electric poles adjacent to the old road are now in the middle.

Rural Electrification Board (REB) and West Zone Power Distribution Company Ltd jointly asked for Tk

62 lakh from the RHD to shift the poles to the side but to no effective action yet.

"Electric poles in the middle of the road causes problem for vehicular movement. Accidents often occur on the dusty road," said Abul Kalam, driver of a battery-run auto-rickshaw.

Echoing the same, another auto-rickshaw driver Babul Howladar said the authorities should take steps to complete the road renovation work as soon as possible.

Md Main Uddin, executive engineer of West Zone Power Distribution Company Ltd in Barguna, said, "We wrote a letter to the RHD last year demanding allocation for removing these poles but we are yet to get it. And so, the poles have remained there."

Khairul Islam, site engineer of the contractor firm 'Kohinoor Enterprise', said, "We are facing problems to do the renovation work as electric poles are still in the middle of the road. We talked to RHD officials about the matter on several occasions but no action has been taken."

Barguna RHD's Executive Engineer Md Haider Kamruzzaman said the REB and West Zone Power Distribution Company in last year demanded Tk 62 lakh to shift the electric poles.

"Afterwards, we sent a letter to the ministry concerned on December 24 last year asking for the allocation, but it is yet to be made. We hope to get the allocation soon and then steps will be taken to shift the poles from the middle of the road," he added.



Such electric poles, now lying in the middle of the road from Purakata ferry terminal to Baroitola ferry terminal in Barguna, due to the ongoing widening work of the regional highway, causes problem for vehicular movement. The authorities concerned said the poles cannot be shifted to the side due to lack of monetary allocation for the purpose.

SUFAL Innovation Grant (SIG) Program is a funding window for applied research on forest and biodiversity of IDA financed Sustainable Forests & Livelihoods (SUFAL) Project of Bangladesh Forest Department under the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change. SUFAL project now invites eligible individual(s)/institution(s) to submit preliminary research proposal for awarding grants on thematic areas outlined in SUFAL Innovation Grant Manual, which is accessible at www.bforest.gov.bd. Workshops will be organized with initial applicants to facilitate detail proposal development. We highly encourage female researcher to apply for SIG and expect to award at least 30% SIG to female researcher. Maximum support from SUFAL Innovation Grant (SIG) would be approximately for two years.

Prioritized thematic research areas includes: Collaborative Forest Management; Forest Governance; Climate Change issues on Forest, Forest Species and Biodiversity; Infrastructure Optimization in Digital Forest Monitoring; Development of Cost-effective Rooting Materials; Forest Conservation and Restoration; Choice of Species for Future; Wildlife Habitat Conservation; Wildlife Ecology, Digital Service Delivery; Public Private Partnership in Forestry; Eco-tourism Development; Ecosystem Service Valuation; Site- species matching in Coastal Plantations etc.

The project will strictly follow SUFAL Innovation Grant Manual to SIG award and administration.
