'Bishwo Shundori' to arrive in theatres on March 27

Dhaka Theatre: A legacy

One of the most illustrious theatre troupes in the capital, Dhaka Theatre was predominantly formed by young freedom fighters including prominent filmmaker, Nasir Uddin Yousuff, renowned playwright and theatre artiste Selim Al Deen. Established in July, 1973, the group started their journey by staging two plays later that year. The plays, *Sangbad Cartoon* and *Samrat O Pratidwandigon*, were showcased at the auditorium of Dhaka District Sports Association (Dhaka Jela Krira Samity). *Sangbad Cartoon* was written by Selim Al Deen, and directed by Nasir Uddin Yousuff. On the other hand, *Samrat O Pratidwandigon* was directed by Habibul Hasan. The tickets for the show each cost BDT 2 at the time. With the aim of writing original stories and presenting them in a unique way, Dhaka Theatre has made their journey a successful one for the last 47 years. Yousuff and Selim duo delivered many hit productions through Dhaka Theatre.

world lost the opportunity to be introduced with new characters and stories that he could bring. It is definitely a great and irrecoverable loss.

Some of the popular plays by Dhaka Theatre are *Muntasir Fantasy*, *Dhurto oi*, *Keramot Mongol*, *Trirotto*, *Shakuntala*, *Hathodai*, *kittonkhola*, *Joiboti Konnyar Mon*, *Chaka*, *Bonpangshul*, *Binodini*, along with *Prachchyo*, *Merchant of Venice*, *Ekattorer Pala*, *The Tempest*, and, *Nimajon*, among others. Dhaka Theatre presented *The Tempest*, directed by Nasir Uddin Yousuff, at the Shakespeare Globe Theatre. It was the first play to stage in Bengali language in England.

Currently, the group is actively showcasing three plays -- *Ponchyonari Akhyan*, *Putra* and *Dhaboman*. Popular actor Rozi Siddiqui has been performing in *Ponchyonari Akhyan*, directed by Shahiduzzaman Selim, for a long time. On the other hand, eminent theatre personality Shimul Yousuf directed the plays *Dhaboman* and *Putra*. *Binodini*, another remarkable play by the troupe, was last staged in 2018. The play, which is basically a solo performance by Shimul Yousuf, was staged 130 times.

Two differently abled Bangladeshi artistes to perform in Japan

Two differently abled Bangladeshi theatre artistes will perform in an international disability play, *The Tempest*, which will be staged in Tokyo in May 2020. This collaborative theatre play will be produced by the British Council, in partnership with Owlspot Theater and Graeae Theatre Company, with deaf and disabled artistes from Bangladesh, Japan, and the UK.

The Bangladeshi artistes Saddam and Morshed travelled to London in September 2019 to attend workshops, along with other differently abled artistes from Japan and the UK. The workshops enabled the artistes to overcome the barriers of language and culture, and aimed to unify them under an international disability theatre production. Saddam hails from Madaripur and Morshed is a recent HSC graduate from Narayanganj. The duo was selected for the project as a result of their exceptional performances in *A Different Romeo and Juliet*, which was produced in 2016 by the British Council, in partnership with Dhaka Theatre and Graeae Theatre Company.

British Council Bangladesh, focusing on the theme, 'Arts for Social Change' has created a solid track record of using different art forms to bring about positive social changes. With this objective, in December 2019, British Council Bangladesh has formally launched their initiative, Disability Arts: Redefining Empowerment (DARE). The initiative aims to reach artistes with disabilities from different regions of the country and develop their skills through a series of training and capacity development programmes.
