



ROAD REPAIR FUND COLLECTION Move stalled for years

Law made for this purpose in 2013 remains not implemented

The Ministry of Road Transport and Bridges took steps to collect toll from major highways for road maintenance, but an initiative to raise dedicated fund for the same purpose remained stalled for years.

In July 2013, parliament passed Road Maintenance Fund Board Act to form a board to raise and manage a fund for repairing and maintaining roads.

Although the law came into effect in December 2014, the 12-member board remained largely non-functional for the last six and a half years and managed to raise no fund at all. During the time, the authorities could neither formulate rules nor finalise organogram for the board.

Moreover, they could not fix the process of collecting money for the fund from the Ministry of Finance.

As a result, Roads and Highways Department (RHD) has to collect fund for maintaining and repairing roads following the conventional process which is time consuming. Besides, the fund now RHD gets to maintain around 22,000-kilometre network is very insufficient, said officials.

In the latest development, a committee, formed to review the draft rules prepared in 2018 and prepare an organogram for the board, submitted its report last month.

The board was scheduled to hold its next meeting today to settle this issues, said Anwar Hossain Chowdhury, additional secretary of Road Transport and Highways Division and acting chief executive officer of the board,

"All I want is to get my father back, safe, and unhurt," he said.

"Baba, we want you back very soon. Ma, my little sister and I are waiting for you."

Covering their faces with black cloths, some photojournalists formed another human chain in front of the National Museum.

Coronavirus test in 15 mins for Tk 350!

Gonoshasthaya Kendra claims to have developed a kit; awaits govt nod for going into production

A team of Gonoshasthaya-RNA Biotech Limited, a sister concern of Gonoshasthaya Kendra, claims to have developed an affordable kit that can detect novel coronavirus infection in 15 minutes.

Gonoshasthaya is now awaiting government approval for going into full-scale production.

"It's true. It's a different method of detecting coronavirus. It's called Rapid Dot Blot," Dr Zafrullah Chowdhury, founder and trustee member of Gonoshasthaya Kendra, told The Daily Star yesterday. "Each kit would cost only Tk 300 to Tk 350."

The team consists of Bijon Kumar Sil, the lead researcher, Nihad Adnan, Raed Jamiruddin and Firoz Ahmed. Bijon was among the researchers who had developed a kit to diagnose SARS coronavirus in 2003, he said.

Gatherings at tourist spots banned

Move comes after hundreds crowded beaches

Authorities yesterday imposed a ban on public gatherings at different tourist spots in Cox's Bazar, Sylhet, Chattogram and Patuakhali to prevent the risk of spreading coronavirus.

Cox's Bazar district administration yesterday afternoon imposed restrictions on tourist arrival in the city and all sort of gatherings at beaches.

The district administration and tourist police asked authorities of all hotels and motels not to allow any new guests, said Kamal Hossain, deputy commissioner of Cox's Bazar.

Besides, the visitors, who were staying at different hotels, have been asked to return their respective houses, the DC said.

103-yr-old Iranian woman survives coronavirus

A 103-year-old woman in Iran has recovered after being infected with the new coronavirus, state media reported, despite overwhelming evidence the elderly are most at risk from the disease.

The unnamed woman had been hospitalised in the central city of Semnan for about a week, IRNA news agency said.

But she was "discharged after making a complete recovery", Semnan University of Medical Sciences head Navid Danayi was quoted as saying by IRNA late Tuesday.

The woman was the second elderly patient in Iran to have survived the disease.

The other was a 91-year-old man from Kerman, in the southeast of Iran, the news agency said.

After being sick for three days, he recovered on Monday despite having pre-existing medical

Buet student Abrar Fahad murder case was yesterday transferred to the Speedy Trial Tribunal-1 of Dhaka for quick disposal.

Earlier, the government decided to hold trial of the case at the Speedy Trial Tribunal-1. In line with the government decision, the law ministry on March 12 sent a letter to the Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court of Dhaka that was holding the trial.

The Speedy Trial Tribunal-1 of Dhaka set April 6 for hearing on the charge framing against the accused.

12 fined for violating home quarantine rules

Mobile courts in different districts have fined at least 12 expatriates between Tuesday night and yesterday afternoon for not abiding by the government-mandated home quarantine of 14 days.

In Chattogram, five expatriates, who returned from Oman, United Arab Emirates and Saudi Arabia, have been fined by mobile courts yesterday.

The mobile court ran drives in Hathazari, Raozan, Anwara, Patia upazilas, to check whether people were following the government directive urging all foreign returnees to self-quarantine for fourteen days, said AZM Sharif Hossain, additional district magistrate of Chattogram.

Among them, three returnees from United Arab Emirate, and two from Saudi

Arabia and Oman, were fined Tk 10,000 each, he said.

Anyone coming from abroad are compelled to stay in their homes in quarantine for 14 days, but they (the five men) were walking outside without paying heed to the directive, Sharif said.

The fines were imposed as per Section 269 of the Penal Code, he added.

In Madaripur, two people, one returnee from Italy and the other from Spain, were fined by a mobile court in Kalkini upazila yesterday afternoon.

The mobile court led by Aminul Islam, upazila nirbahi officer (UNO), fined the Italy returnee, who came to Bangladesh on March 9, with Tk 5,000 while the Spain returnee, who landed in the country on
