winning the 'Bangladesh National Film Award' for 'Best
Supporting Actor' for her role in the film, 'Mrittika Maya'
in 2013. In this interview with Rafi Hossain, she talks
about her thoughts on beauty pageant competitions, new

Rafi Hossain: Welcome to Uncensored with Rafi Hossain. Today, we have Aparna Ghose with us. Thank you for giving us your time.

Aparna Ghose: I am happy to be here.

Rafi Hossain: You started your career with a beauty pageant. Generally, people starting like that don't go too far in the industry. What is your take on that?

Aparna Ghose: I do not agree with that. I, being an example, am doing well. I wanted to work in the media, but I couldn't find any proper platform to start my journey. Back then, the *Lux Channel i* beauty contest was looking for a new face for the film, *Daruchini Dwip*. When I saw the newspaper advertisement, I decided to try out. From there, I gradually understood the ins and outs of the industry. I credit my success to this beauty pageant. In our time, the focus was the acting, but now, perhaps the main focus is beauty or modelling. People who have come this far and are still thriving. Bidya Sinha Mim, for example, is still doing well. This is a platform for those who want to learn.

Rafi Hossain: Even though it is a big event, we only see a few faces working in the long run. Why is that so? Aparna Ghose: Willpower is very important. I feel that those who come to this industry need the passion and resilience to work hard. I love acting. I think I am lucky enough that people recognised me because of the competition.

Rafi Hossain: Are you still involved with any theatre group? Aparna Ghose: Yes, I am still involved with Nandikar from Chittagong.

Rafi Hossain: Do you have to mostly stay in Dhaka for your work?

Aparna Ghose: I have to stay in Dhaka for shooting, but when I have a show, I go to Chittagong. I have a show

Aparna Ghose: My parents are insisting on it, but I'm not ready yet. I prefer working more now.

Aparna Ghose: It's not like that. I think that my family will be the most important thing to me then, and I would want to prioritise them. I am not a good multi-tasker, so I cannot balance both aspects of my life.

Rafi Hossain: What are your thoughts on the current situation of the television industry?

Aparna Ghose: A change is coming, I believe. New web platforms are coming out and other platforms like *YouTube* are gaining traction. I also feel that people who have been in this industry for a long time are gradually adapting to the changes.

Rafi Hossain: Do you think this is a positive step?

Aparna Ghose: Yes, of course. We have to look at the bright side. Once upon a time, we only had one channel. Now we have so many options, giving viewers the liberty to choose from a large variety of contents. Now we have platforms like *YouTube*, so content is being made based on that kind of viewership. Many new directors are coming in who are bringing good content. So, I believe that we are heading towards something new.

Rafi Hossain: *Who are some female actors that are doing well?* **Aparna Ghose:** I would say Mamo, Arsha, Mehzabien and Sabila Noor. I love their performances.

Rafi Hossain: *How do you consider your acting?*Aparna Ghose: I don't like my acting at all. Every time I look at myself onscreen, I feel that there is always room for improvement

Rafi Hossain: Whom do you prefer as your co-artists?

Aparna Ghose: There are many: Mosharraf Karim, Nisho and Jon are to name just a few. Tariq Anam Sir is my very favourite. I have learnt many things from him. I would also like to mention Humayun Faridi Sir.

Rafi Hossain: Who are your favourite directors?

Aparna Ghose: I love the work of Iftekhar Ahmed Fahmi. I have not yet met a director as creative as him. I am also fond of the works of Shafayet Mansoor Rana and Ashiq Mahmud. Mostafa Sarwar Farooki's work is my favorite. Zahidur Rahman Anjan and Arefin's works are also my favorites.

Rafi Hossain: I had a great time talking to you. I believe that the next time we meet, you will have more stories and experiences to share with us. Thank you.

UK-Bangladesh joint production 'Sahasa' gets standing ovation in England

For the first time ever, in collaboration with 'Sonia Sabri Company' and 'Shadhona'. two respected internationally renowned art organisations from the UK and Bangladesh, presented mesmerising live dance and musical performance 'Sahasa', at Birmingham Museum & Art Gallery as a part of the 'Transforming Narratives' project on February 28 and 29 this year.

Transforming Narratives is an initiative that aims to establish Birmingham as a global centre for contemporary arts from Pakistan and Bangladesh. The three-year project, initiated in 2018, brings different artists and cultural organisations located in Birmingham, Pakistan and Bangladesh together. Sonia Sabri Company is one of the leading contemporary South Asian dance and music organisations in the UK, and has an international reputation for presenting Kathak in a contemporary context. Sahasa, which means 'The Brave', continues the award-winning company's strive for female empowerment, and their new research and development project focused on women's stories, particularly from the Bengali community in the UK and cities in Bangladesh.

As a part of the two-day event, Sonia Sabri and Arthy Ahmed performed an open rehearsal on February 28 in the museum's Round Room. On the following day, they presented two separate one-hour performances in the museum's Gas Hall. These afternoon performances consisted of short solo recitals from each of the dancer to give the audience an understanding of their different styles of Kathak and Bharatanatyam respectively, before they moved on to *Sahasa*. They were

accompanied by music from Sonia's husband and director of the company, Sarvar, an internationally renowned tabla player and composer who created the musical score, and Sanchita Pal on vocals. Each performance of *Sahasa* was followed by a question and answer session with the audience. Many reacted to the powerful and moving performances with a standing ovation

Sahasa was conceived during Sonia's trip to Dhaka in April 2019, as a part of a research and development project supported by Transforming Narratives. She visited various organisations and connected with women from different backgrounds during that time. She intended to find out about the experiences of women from communities in Bangladesh and see how women who were born and brought up in the country were different from those who immigrated to Birmingham and how their opportunities and challenges were similar. While in Bangladesh, she met Arthy and visited Naripokkho, an organisation that gives refuge to women from challenging backgrounds and restores their confidence by enabling them to find jobs through art and literature. The women shared their stories with Sonia. Arthy came to Birmingham for two weeks and worked

at the *Sonia Sabri Company*'s studio to craft together a piece that would reflect the stories they collected from the interviewees.

The two dancers and their team talked about the stories, their personal experiences and observations. All the artists involved in *Sahasa* are from different backgrounds. "We all took the responsibility to ensure that artistically, we pushed our respective forms outside of the norm, challenge our own selves as artistes and grow as a team," says Sonia.

Sahasa uses the play of symbolism, abstract sketches, subliminal imagery and music to evoke emotions. "There were a lot of teary eyes in the audience, and several people eagerly came up to speak to us at the end. Many of them were emotional and clenched our hands to say thanks," says Sonia.

For Sonia, *Sahasa* is the start of what she envisions will be an international touring production of dance and music in the future. This project from the UK and Bangladesh proved to be a huge success for social dialogue, cultural inclusion and international collaboration.

The Way Back is a sports-drama film, first released on March 6, 2020. It was directed by Gavin O'Connor, written by Brad Ingelsby, distributed by Warner Bros. Pictures, and stars Ben Affleck, Al Madrigal and Michaela Watkins, among others. The storyline follows the life of an ex high school basketball star who, upon becoming a coach, is able to associate with basketball yet again.

GIASUDDIN SELIM

A passionate writer turned director, Giasuddin Selim stepped foot in the world of filmmaking with his debut film, 'Monpura'. His directorial ventures may not be many, but he has left a mark in the hearts of the audience with everything he has directed so far. His accolades include two 'National Film Awards': 'Best Story' for the film 'Adhiar' and 'Best Screenplay' for 'Monpura'. In this interview with Star Showbiz, he talks about his new film, 'Paap Punno' and about how he came where he is today.



Can you tell us about the shooting for your upcoming film, 'Paap Punno'?

It was a great experience shooting the film. We shot it in a village in Chandpur in an abandoned house. While shooting, the whole team staved in Chandpur. We used to drive for one hour each day to go to the shooting spot.

Can you reveal anything about the plot of the film?

I cannot reveal too much about the plot, but it is a story which incorporates love, ego and basic instinct.

What inspired you to start direction? I used to be a professional writer, and while writing, I saw how many directors were unable to visualise my writings in a proper way. I used to think that they could've done a better job, and when I got the opportunity, I started directing. In 1999, I got the first opportunity when I directed my first television serial, called Biprotip. That gained a lot of popularity among the audience.

What struggles have you faced as a director?

I didn't face any struggle as a director. I faced more struggles as writer. A writer has to do everything alone, by sitting down by themselves and coming up with an original story. But, as a director, I get a lot of assistance whenever I go to the shooting spot.

'Swapnajaal' and 'Paap Punno' were both shot in Chandour. Is that your favourite

shooting spot?

It is by pure coincidence that the shooting spot for both films happened to be Chandpur.

What is your advice for upcoming directors? The advice I have for upcoming directors is to enjoy the work they are doing. Without that, they cannot do great projects.

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What expectations do you have from 'Paap Punno'?

I hope that when the audience sees the film, they will enjoy it. That is all that I expect and hope from the movie.

Do you have any message for the readers? I would ask everyone to support Bangladeshi cinema and dramas as our showbiz industry is in a state of crisis. I would ask them to come and watch our movies in theatres.
