DNCC Chief Health Officer Brig Gen Mohammad Mominur Rahman Mamun said they received the list only on March 21, and thus did not have a lot of time to act yet "We're strictly monitoring whether the 31 returnees are following quarantine, he said.

"Some people could not be found on their mentioned address," he added. The Daily Star repeatedly tried to reach senior secretary to the home ministry Mostafa Kamal Uddin over phone for comments, but he rejected the calls.

sector that employs about 40 lakh workers.

Migrant remittance and RMG are the two major foreign exchange earning sectors, contributing heavily to the balance of payment of Bangladesh.

Due to coronavirus, 1.5 lakh aspirant migrants could not go abroad with jobs in the last two months. Meanwhile, Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association said several lakh workers in the sector may be jobless if the RMG importing countries, especially the EU and US, halt import orders.

"Considering all these aspects, Bangladesh government has already informed the European, US and G77 countries to work in unison to tackle the crisis," said the minister.

Bangladesh also requested the migrant-worker receiving countries to take the best care of Bangladeshis during the coronavirus pandemic, which the World Health Organization said could accelerate if appropriate and immediate measures are not taken.

"I have also talked to some foreign ministers. They are also concerned over coronavirus pandemic. They assured Bangladesh of providing all assistance and cooperation." He also said China will provide Bangladesh with

10,000 Covid-19 testing kits; 10,000 personal protection equipment (PPE); 1,000 infrared thermometers and 15,000 surgical N95 respirators under the Chinese Emergency Humanitarian Aid Project.

This will be a gift from China on our independence day. The medical equipment will be coming to Bangladesh on March 26," said the minister. Some local companies may also import medical equipment from China.

Some countries, including the US, also sought medical equipment from Bangladesh, said Momen, adding, "Bangladeshi companies also produce these equipment. They are looking into these demands.

Intern doctors on strike demanding PPE

Intern doctors of Jalalabad Ragib-Rabeya Medical College Hospital in Sylhet are on strike, demanding personal protective equipment (PPE).

Some 150 doctors of Sylhet's first private medical college hospital started the strike on Monday. As of filing this report last night, they were continuing work abstention.

Yesterday, they placed a three-point demand to hospital authorities: ensuring PPE for all healthcare providers at the nospital, taking liability if anyone from the hospital gets infected with coronavirus, and special measures to bar patients' attendants. The protesters said they placed their

demands more than a week ago but only some senior doctors were given PPE. Contacted, Dr Arman Ahmed Shiplu, deputy director of the hospital, said, "PPE are very scarce these days. We got only a few which were provided to doctors at the

with Covid-19 like symptoms." "We're trying to get more PPE soon and urge intern doctors to withdraw the strike."

services at the hospital are not being hampered due to the strike, as the flow of

patients have been reduced to one-third. On March 19, some 200 intern doctors at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital also called a strike over the same demand.

They, however, started attending to patients four hours later, as authorities supplied masks, gloves and sanitisers to those working in vulnerable units, said Iqbal Hasan, general secretary of RMCH Interns' Council.

POOR SUPPLY WORRIES DOCTORS

Many public hospitals across the country have set up isolation units for coronavirus patients, but a lot of them lack resources and equipment to provide services.

Visiting hospitals in 20 districts on March 17-19, this newspaper found that there were not enough safety gears for doctors and nurses. Physicians and nurses said they were worried about being infected.

The medical staff there didn't receive training on how to deal with coronavirus patients. The authorities in those districts were not conducting public awareness He also mentioned that healthcare activities either.

"The thing that matters now is management of the pandemic, and we're running out of time for taking decisions," he said.

"Bangladesh is at high risk of the virus spreading, eminent litterateur Hasan Azizul Haque told this correspondent, "Communities have to take initiative to keep themselves safe until government assistance arrives." Bokhtiar Ahmed, an anthropology teacher at RU, said

people are panicking due to lack of awareness. The testing facility for detecting coronavirus is limited to the capital so far and there is no report of the disease spreading to other parts of the country, he said quoting government claims.

"How do we know this? Unless we test a large number of people, we don't actually have the real picture of the spread," Ahmed said.

"Facts must be produced. Once they have the information, people can have confidence in government's steps, understand the level of risk, and take preventive measures," he said, adding that no campaign, other than facts, can stop people from going outside their homes.

The scholars also urged the government to provide personal protective equipment to doctors, so that they can attend to patients without getting infected themselves.

The equipment was stocked to fight the bird flu epidemic in 2013, and now, as per a DLS instruction, it is being distributed in every district.

Dr Md Aminul Islam, deputy director of DLS in Sylhet division, said as per instructions, 400 sets of PPE were handed over to Habiganj's civil surgeon, 450 to Sunamganj's civil surgeon -- and 65 to deputy commissioner, 65 to upazila nirbahi officers and 10 to a upazila health officer in Moulvibazar."

"In Sylhet district, 50 sets were handed over to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital, 25 to the civil surgeon and 40 to different healthcare establishments. Another 50 will be handed over to the civil surgeon soon," he said.

Dr Debapada Ray, health director in Sylhet division, said, "PPE is essential for doctors and caregivers for the outbreak, and we have to ensure its proper use, as per the given instructions."

On March 15, a directive was released jointly by Directorate General of Health Services, Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research, and World Health Organization about proper use of PPE during the outbreak.
