RISKS OF ECONOMIC DOWNTURN

Bangladesh seeks EU, US assistance

Bangladesh has sought assistance of the European Union, USA and G77 countries to help tackle Covid-19 that raised risks of a global economic downturn with losses of production and jobs

Foreign Minister AK Abdul Momen said this yesterday in a video message to journalists -- first of its kind in the wake of coronavirus.

"Bangladesh's exports have already been hit in a big way because of coronavirus in the European Union and USA. According to BGMEA, order worth two billion dollars has already been halted," the minister said.

There is a possibility that a few lakh workers could lose jobs, while the remittance flow may also be hampered due

Provide detection kits at union level: scholars

Scholars interviewed by The Daily Star in Rajshahi have urged the government to ensure ample supply of testing kits for detecting coronavirus at union level without making any further delay.

They suggested revealing all facts about the spread of the virus and disseminating information on ways to avoid contamination, so that people can keep themselves safe instead of panicking over the pandemic.

They also emphasised the need for engaging concerned communities to aware others about the importance of social distancing and self-isolation, which is required to reduce the spread of the highly contagious disease.

The Daily Star interviewed four scholars

in Rajshahi, as people continued to panicbuy essentials, creating a shortage in markets fearing an impending lockdown over the pandemic. Local administration is struggling to conduct drives for keeping market prices under control while also conducting awareness campaigns for social distancing.

Prof Muhammad Mizanuddin of Rajshahi University's sociology department said testing people randomly was essential as the virus spreads at four levels - first a person is attacked, he infects his family, family affects community and then it becomes an epidemic.

"This pandemic is [one of] the worst in earth's history, but the ways to fight it is not a new phenomenon for Bangladesh. We already have examples from other

Sylhet

Deceased UK-returnee didn't have Covid-19

A 61-year-old UK returnee woman, who died at the coronavirus isolation facility at Sylhet Saheed Shamsuddin Ahmed Hospital on Sunday, was not affected by coronavirus

The test report of Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research (IEDCR) confirmed that she was not a coronavirus patient, said Dr Debapada Ray, director of health at Sylhet division's Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) office.

The woman came to Bangladesh on March 4 and was suffering from fever, cough, and respiratory complications from March 10.

She was admitted to the isolation centre of the hospital as a suspected Covid-19 patient on March 20. Before IEDCR could collect her sample to test, she died in the early hours on March 22.

On Sunday morning, IEDCR collected her sample for test before she was buried at the graveyard of the shrine of Manik Pir in Sylhet that afternoon. Her family members were also ordered to be in precautionary home quarantine.

Some 328 more foreign returnees were taken under home quarantine in the last 24 hours till yesterday afternoon, said Dr Anisur Rahman, assistant director of health at Sylhet division.

So far, 2,176 persons are under quarantine in Sylhet division and 233 were given release orders after their quarantine period ended, he added.

Girl's hanging body found in M'singh

Police yesterday recovered a girl's body hanging from a tree branch from Atharadana village in Gafargaon upazila of Mymensingh.

Although it looked like a case of suicide by hanging, locals found the girl's feet touching the ground, clothes torn, and her cellphone beside the spot, arousing suspicion

among locals and police. The victim was identified as Taqmina (17), daughter of a carpenter of adjacent Parabharot village in Gafargaon.

She completed her SSC from local Atharadana High School last year, but could not get herself admitted to a college due to poverty. She used to do tailoring work to support her parents, locals said.

Locals found her body hanging from the branch of a tree around 6am and informed local Joshora Union Parishad chairman Tariqul Islam Real.

Talking to this correspondent, the chairman said upon being informed by locals, he rushed to the spot and found

Taqmia's body hanging, but with her feet on the ground. Her dress was partially torn off and her phone was

found beside the spot, said the chairman. On information, police recovered the body yesterday noon and sent it to Mymensingh Medical College morgue for autopsy, said Anukul Chandra Sarker, officer-in-charge

of Gafargaon Police Station. "We can confirm whether it's a suicide or a murder after getting the autopsy reports," said the OC. No case was lodged in this connection till filing of this report.

People rush to leave Ctg before 10-day closure

Many say city is 'crowded, expensive' STAFF CORRESPONDENT, Ctg

Yesterday at Chattogram Railway Station, one Mohammad Ariful (33) was running to catch the last train of the day. With his three-year-old in tow and wife right behind, the family of three was eager to leave town, but ultimately they didn't get any space on the train.

Like Ariful, thousands of people thronged the station after the government announced a ten-day closure of public and private offices amid the coronavirus pandemic. Desperate to leave the city, people were buying standing" tickets for train, with no guarantee that they'd

get space in the transportation. However, refunds where

available if they couldn't get on the train. Ariful was planning to take the Dhaka-bound Mahanagar Godhuli. He would get down at a stoppage and take the bus to his village home in Chandpur.

Asked why he is travelling amid the risk, he said, "Our office is closed, and prices of items are increasing.

"We could not get space on the last train. But I'll try to get bus tickets from Kadamtali," Ariful added. This correspondent found extra passengers at every

carriage of scheduled trains. Hundreds stood inside compartments, while others stood by the engine and door. Aman Ullah Aman, chief inspector of security departmen

at Chattogram Railway Station told The Daily Star, "All passenger train services have been halted for an indefinite period from today [yesterday] afternoon following the ministry's direction. The last train, Mahanagar Godhuli left from Chattogram at 3:15pm."

He said there was a sharp rise in the number of passengers after the government's announcement.

Almost all bus counters of the city in Alongkar intersection, AK Khan, Kadamtali, Bahaddarhat, and Notun Bridge areas were crowded since Monday night. Md Tarek (25), works as a chef at a restaurant. He was

looking for a bus ticket to Dhaka, where his family lives.

"The restaurant is part of a hotel. My food and accommodation was provided there. It has closed down for the time being so I don't have anywhere to stay," he replied when asked why he is travelling during a pandemic. Meanwhile Shariful Islam (45), said, "Population

density is lower in the village; so is the price of essentials. I have taken all precautions for travelling. Shariful thinks travelling would make little difference in the coronavirus risk factor. "I'd be at high risk even if I

stayed in the city; it's highly populated," he said.

Four killed in road crashes

Four people were killed in separate accidents yesterday. In Cumilla, two people were killed as a pickup hit a CNG-run auto rickshaw in Chauddagram upazila in the morning. The deceased were identified as CNG driver Pear Ahmed (38) and M Bagar (45).

Police said the accident occurred around 9am in Nankora area on Dhaka-Chattogram Highway when the pickup hit the auto rickshaw, leaving its passenger and driver critically injured.

The injured were taken to Chauddagram Upazila Health Complex where doctors declared dead, police said.

In Bhola, two people were killed as a trolley skidded off the road and overturned in Jangalia area under Sadar upazila in the afternoon. The deceased were identified as Md Joynal (75) and Md Ohid (55).

Officer-in-Charge Bhola Sadar Police Station Md Enayet Hossain said the bodies were sent to Bhola Sadar Hospital for autopsies.

Police seized the vehicle.
