Never Rarely Sometimes Always is a drama film, first released on January 24, 2020. It was written and directed by Eliza Hittman, produced by Adele Romanski and Sara Murphy, distributed by Focus

Features, and stars Sidney Flanigan, Talia Ryder and Théodore Pellerin, among others. The film follows the lives of two girls who, after having an unplanned pregnancy, go to New York City for help.



White House Farm

White House Farm is a crime-drama miniseries, written by Kris Mrksa and Giulia Sandler, directed by Paul Whittington, produced by Lee Thomas under the banner of *New Pictures*, distributed by All3Media,

and stars Freddie Fox, Mark Addy and Gemma Whelan, among others. The plot follows the true events of the murders of five members of a family in an Essex farmhouse in 1985. It was aired on January 8, 2020 on ITV.

Unorthodox

Unorthodox is a German-American drama miniseries, which has been loosely based on Deborah Feldman's autobiography, *Unorthodox: The Scandalous Rejection of My Hasidic Roots*. It has been directed by Maria Schrader, produced by Alexa Karolinski, and stars Shira Haas, Amit Rahav and Jeff Wilbusch, among others. The series tells the story of a young woman who runs away from her arranged marriage and moves abroad, but the life she leaves behind catches up to



her. It was released on March 26, 2020 on Netflix, and is the first series to be primarily in Yiddish.

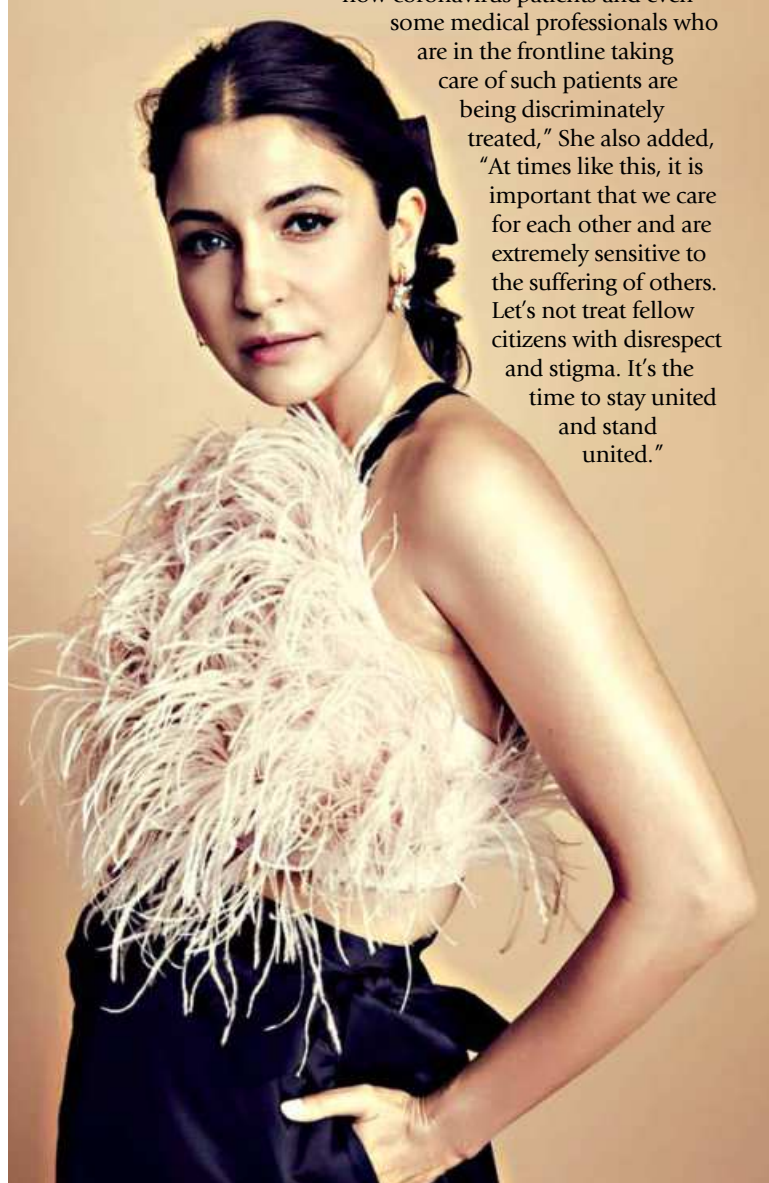


BOBBY APPRECIATES KINDNESS
