Mahfuza Arief, a teacher of SFX Greenherland International

passed away at the age of 61 yesterday, due to a suspected case of Covid-19.

With schools shut down due to the ongoing pandemic, she had been spending her time at home with her family. For nearly two weeks, she had a fever and bouts of coughing that were described as "not alarming"

Yesterday morning, she complained that she was having breathing difficulties, but the situation quickly worsened.

She was rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital, where she was declared dead. Her death certificate read that she was suspected to have been infected by Covid-19.

She left behind three sons, including Abrar Hossain, a journalist at The Daily Star. Her eldest son is a service holder while the youngest resides in the US.

She was laid to rest at Rayerbazar graveyard

Unlike Stamford, the number of students at Daffodil is increasing every year. Asked why the university is still failing to pay salaries, the Pro-VC said they are facing the crunch due to several development projects they have undertaken, like permanent campus, hostels and state-of-the-art laboratory facilities.

Meanwhile, American International University Bangladesh (AIUB) has paid half of the salaries for April.

AIUB pro-VC Tofazzal Hossain said the rest will be paid soon.

Association of Private Universities of Bangladesh (APUB) chairman Sheikh Kabir Hossain, also chairman of Board of Trustees of Fareast International University, said his university could not arrange for full salaries in March and have not paid anything for April so far.

"Taking the realities into consideration, we have sought incentives from the government," he added.

On April 27, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said all educational institutions may stay closed until September if the situation does not improve.

There are 105 government approved universities in the country, of them 96 are carrying out academic activities right now. According to the latest (2018) University Grants Commission (UGC) annual report, there were some 3,62,000 students in these universities, along with about 16,000 fulltime and part-time teachers and 12,960

These universities are not providing salaries, although the education ministry and UGC after a meeting on April 30 asked all private universities to pay salaries to the teachers and staff regularly.

Among others Education Minister

Dipu Moni, UGC top officials, vicechancellors of several public and private universities and leaders of Association of Private Universities of Bangladesh (APUB)

attended the meeting. Private universities have sought a stimulus package from the government so that they can pay salaries to teachers and staff for at least six months. APUB sent a letter to the UGC in this regard on April

The association promised to repay the amount in installments over three years

when the situation stabilises. At least two teachers proposed that the government can allow private universities to use their reserve fund deposited to bank in line with law for six months. The government can set a condition that the amount they are withdrawing from reserve fund will be repaid within a year of

According to the Private University Act 2010, each private university in Dhaka and Chattogram has a reserve fund of Tk 5 crore, private universities in other metropolitan cities have reserve fund of Tk 3 crore each and universities established in other places have reserve fund of Tk 1.5

Private University Division Director Fakhrul Islam said the universities cannot use the reserve fund without an approval from UGC.

Asked, UGC Chairman Prof Kazi Shahidullah appealed all private universities to pay the salaries.

"If they send us any proposal of using reserve fund for paying salaries and repaying it later, we will sit and study their proposal to come up with a solution in this regard," he told this newspaper last

Dr Mahfuzur Rahman, convener of Public Health Rights Protection Committee, Chattogram, said "At least 1,000 beds should be made ready immediately. Railway Hospital and Chattogram Port Hospital can be used in this regard.'

Dr Faisal Iqbal Chowdhury, general secretary of Bangladesh Medical Association, Chattogram unit, said, "The government can also use private hospitals to treat Covid-19 patients."

Contacted, Dr Hasan Shahriar Kabir, Chattogram divisional director of DGHS, said they are aware of this matter and planning to add another 300 isolation beds soon.

"A 100-bed Holy Crescent Covid-19 Hospital has been prepared by private clinic owners and we can requisite it right away," he said. "Besides, a 100-bed Chattogram City Corporation General Hospital can be used. I had a talk with the port city mayor and he has given consent," he added.

"Two other hospitals -- a 50-bed Railway Hospital and a 50- bed Chattogram Port Hospital -- can also be used if needed," said Dr

Mortuz Shikder, a farmer of Jadavpur village under Tangail's Shakhipur upazila, has health safety concerns.

"Even if workers come, if anyone is infected, he will spread the virus among us," he feared. Around two-third of the labourers, who

harvest Boro in Tangail, come from other districts, farmers and DAE officials said. Yet, Deputy Director Abdur Razzak of

Tangail DAE is hopeful that the harvest can be completed in time if the weather remains favourable. Mofazzal Hossain, a sub-assistant

agriculture officer at DAE's Dhaka regional office, told The Daily Star on Saturday that harvest has been done on around 34 percent of the region's total land where Boro was cultivated. The work is yet to begin in many

areas under the Dhaka region including Manikganj, where the activity will start Shajahan Ali Biswas, deputy director of Manikganj's DAE informed that they

Samrat Hossain from Gopalganj Sadar upazila said he received assurance of getting a harvester from the local DAE office, when he requested for one.

Another farmer from Faridpur, Harun Mattabar, is hoping to find workers among those who returned to their village homes from outside the district.

In Faridpur region, which includes Faridpur, Gopalganj, Madaripur, Rajbari and Shariatpur, Boro harvest has begun from early May.

Of the six districts in the Barisal division, where harvest began last week, five do not have any farm-labour shortage. Only Barisal district, where Boro was cultivated in 49,068 hectares of land, needs workers, according to the regional DAE office.

Sources at the local administration and DAE office said around 10,000 workers are being brought to Barisal in phases from other districts.

Farmers in Jashore region, which includes Jhenaidah, Magura, Jashore, Chuadanga and Kushtia, are also worried due to the farm-labour shortage.

Farmhands usually become scarce during Ramadan, when Muslims observe fast from dawn to dusk, Boro growers said. "I have cultivated Boro paddy in four

bighas of land. I am facing difficulty in arranging labourers," said Asman Ali Mollah, a farmer of Katlagari village in Ihenidah's Sailkupa upazila.

DAE officials in the region said the local administrations will arrange transports to bring workers from other districts.

Around 12 combined harvesters have

been arranged for this region, said Partha

Pratim Shaha, additional director at the DAE in Jashore region, where Boro harvest began last week.

Agricultural machines have not reached all the areas in the Rajshahi region.

Nasir Uddin from Rajshahi district's Tanore upazila said he did not get any harvester from the government yet.

He had managed to get only four out of 12 farmhands he needed for the Boro paddy harvest. Sudhendra Nath Roy, additional director

of Rajshahi regional DAE, said of the

around five lakh labourers required for the region, about 3.5 lakh are already working in the fields. Another 45,000 had gone to other districts including the haor areas for harvesting jobs, but are expected to return

in a week or so, he said. Sudhendra said 70 percent of Boro harvesting is complete in the Chalan Beel area of the region. In the rest of the Rajshahi division, 20 percent of Boro harvest has

been completed. DAE officials of Rajshahi said some 213 combined harvesters and 400 reapers may

be provided this season. Harvesting has begun in Rangpur region but ret to start in Dinajpur region. Farmers have not

faced labour shortage in those areas yet. In Cumilla region, Boro harvest has been somewhat delayed this year because of labour shortage due to the shutdown,

said local DAE officials. Farmers in Cumilla Sadar upazila complained of insufficient number of modern harvest machines distributed in their area.

Boro paddies have been cultivated in 5.90 lakh hectares of land in Dhaka region, 1.70 lakh hectares of land in Faridpur region, 1.25 lakh hectares in Barishal region, 4.01 lakh hectares in Jashore region, 3.53 lakh hectares in Rajshahi region, 5 lakh hectares in Rangpur region, 2.59 lakh hectares in Dinajpur region and 3.28 lakh hectares of land in Cumilla region, according to local
