

242 stranded Bangladeshis en route from USA

A special flight carrying 242 Bangladesh citizens stranded in the USA amid the coronavirus pandemic departed for Bangladesh from Washington Dulles International Airport (IAD) on May 15.

The chartered A 350-900 airbus of Qatar Airways took off at 11:04pm (Washington local time) from Dulles International Airport.

The flight is scheduled to land at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport at 4:00am (Bangladesh local time) on May 17, Bangladesh Embassy in the USA and officials at HSLA, said.

The aircraft is scheduled to land at Doha International Airport at 7pm (Doha time) on May 16.

After one-hour technical stopover at Doha airport, the plane will leave Doha at 8pm (Doha time).

Bangladesh Ambassador to the USA Mohammad Ziauddin saw off the passengers and wished their safe flight, the embassy said in a release.

The travelling passengers include mostly Bangladeshi students studying in different colleges and universities in the US, Bangladeshi citizens who came to America on tourist and business visa and some government and non-government officials.

The passengers also include 49 school and college students who came to the US under Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA) program.

Since March 16, Bangladesh imposed ban on schedule passenger flight operation will all countries except for China to contain spread of Covid-19.

In the last week, Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh extended the ban till May 30.

The Bangladesh government has so far operated repatriation flights in different countries including India, Malaysia, Australia and Bangkok.

Workers of 3 RMG factories demonstrate in Savar

Workers of three garments factories in Ashulia demonstrated demanding their salary for April and earned leave allowance yesterday. In addition, worker's leaders formed a human chain in front of Ashulia Press Club to demand immediate welfare measures during the crisis.

Refusing to join work, around 1500 workers of Magpie Composite Textile Ltd and Magpie Sweater Ltd demonstrated twice, once around their factory site in Ashulia's Kathgora area and then around Bishmail area, where they blocked the Dhaka-Aricha highway for a while.

Police charged batons and fired multiple rounds of tear gas to disperse them both times. Five workers sustained minor injuries during the Dhaka-Aricha highway blockade.

Jane Alam Khan, assistant superintendent of police of Dhaka Industrial Police-1, said police had to fire tear gas to free the roads.

Sabbir Hossen Siddique, a general manager of Magpie Composite Textile Ltd, told The Daily Star they could not pay workers' salaries in time due to delay in banking procedures, as salary for April is being paid by government subsidy money. He assured all dues will be cleared by tomorrow or the day after.

Meanwhile, 100 workers of Sarker Steel Ltd in Dhamrai demonstrated in front of their factory demanding three

months' arrears, said workers and police sources.

In another incident, some 400 workers of Food and Fashion Ltd demonstrated in front of their factory in Ashulia's Kaichabari area demanding reinstatement of their jobs and factory reopening.

The unrest began after 800 workers of the factory came to join work yesterday, as per management orders. However, as they reached the premise, they found a notice that said the factory will remain closed for an indefinite period.

Contacted, Tanbir Ahmed, an official of the factory, denied to make

any comments.

In addition, worker's leaders from at least 22 organisations formed a human chain in front of Ashulia Press Club around 10am yesterday.

They demanded waiving of 40 percent house rent for workers, payment of Eid bonus and clearance of all arrears by April 20.

Rafiqul Islam Sujon, President of Bangladesh Garments and Shilpa Shramik Federation said the decision to waive rent was taken at a meeting last week between worker's leaders, industrial police, local administration, and house owners. However, it is yet to be effective.

physical distancing. Unfortunately this intervention measure has not worked out well in Chattogram and so the rate of contamination has been increasing," he also said.

He, however, could not say for sure when the outbreak will reach its highest peak.

Dr Mamunur Rashid, an epidemiologist and associate professor of Clinical and Tropical Medicine at BITID, said the trend of contamination rate in Chattogram is not unusual than that of other places in the world.

"The way the number is increasing, it indicates that it is approaching its peak," he said.

"It cannot be predicted when it will reach its highest peak as the number of testing is still very little," Dr Rashid added.

Contacted, a renowned epidemiologist of the country, preferring anonymity, said had the intervention measures worked out, the number of contaminated cases would have been kept at a nominal stage like in Vietnam, New Zealand, Australia, Bhutan and Nepal.

Prof Dr Selim Muhammad Jahangir, former principal of Chattogram Medical College, said healthcare professionals worldwide are at risk as they have to serve patients from a close range.

"Besides, many asymptomatic infected patients hide their contact history to doctors, which puts doctors at risk" he said.

Contact tracing needs to be ramped up and lockdown has to be enforced more strictly, he said.

Siddique inaugurated the bazar. The bazar started at 10:00am and ended at 11:00am.

Talking to the reporters, Brig Gen Ahmed Tanvir said, "It's not a relief disbursing programme. We are trying to form a model market for the lower-income people so that they can also get bazar like others."

"Earlier, 1,000 more people were the given support through the market on Wednesday", he added.

In the market, tables were set up in a planned manner. At the entrance of the market, several basins with soaps and water were given. Washing the hands, the poor who came to the market entered maintaining proper social distance.

On the first table shopping bags, masks and soap were kept where people were seen to pick the items on the table.

Packets of rice, potatoes, ladies fingers, arum-lobe, and cowpea vegetables were also kept on the

different tables and each person took one packet of each items from tables and completed their shopping within one minute.

Along with destitute people, significant numbers of physically challenged people were seen to get the items from the bazar.

Bangladesh Army's 34 Engineering Construction Brigade's Deputy Director Col Abul Hasnat Mohammed Sayem said, "We have bought the vegetables from root-level farmers and vegetables growers in Chattogram in exchange of proper price with an aim to resume the economy from the ground level during the shutdown."

Army officials have said they prepared a list of the 1,000 destitute peoples from different areas and as per the list token were provided to them.

They were given the food items freely after showing the token. Plus, those who came to the market for help were also given the items.

Under the initiative, 20,000 lower-income and poor people would be given aid, said army officials.

Like the market, Army has a plan to set up few more markets in different points in the city so that the people can respite from the hardships.

Roksana Akhter, 40, mother of three children, who came to the market, said she had been passing hard times for the last one and a half months as her transport worker husband's income went down to zero.

Such kind of initiative brought happiness to her family, she added.

Sakhina Begum, who came to the market boarding on a wheelchair, said "I am very happy to have the items in the crisis moment."

The organisers of the market also said they had a plan to launch "One Minute Eid Bazar" for the poor before Eid so that they can celebrate the holy event too.

that there are 18 more wrecks to be removed to fully activate the port.

multinationals which are seen as symbols of modern capitalism.

Major financial districts, such as London's Canary Wharf and La Defense in Paris, remain extremely quiet, even as governments lift restrictions on social distancing and travel by public transport.

Jes Staley, chief executive of British bank Barclays, has said "the notion of putting 7,000 people in a building may be a thing of the past".

"We will find ways to operate with more distancing over a much longer

period of time," he added.

French car giant PSA, which makes Peugeot and Citroen vehicles, now sees remote working as a benchmark for tens of thousands of its office-based staff.

Twitter has indicated that some of its employees could do their jobs from home on a permanent basis.

WORK REVOLUTION

"The revolution is going to come with a mindset shift," said Cydney Roach, global chair of employee experience at US consultancy Edelman.

US on track to pass 100k deaths by June 1

Manhattan Project during World War 2 that led to the development of nuclear weapons.

Trump added that when a vaccine was ready the military would be enlisted to distribute it -- and evoked a spirit of global cooperation.

"We are working together with many different countries, and again we have no ego," he said.

Scientists have cautioned that it is possible that despite worldwide efforts, it is possible that an effective vaccine may never be found -- or

that some vaccines could backfire and make people more, not less, susceptible to infection.

CDC director Redfield in his tweet shared weekly forecast data the agency culls from models run by 12 top institutions including Columbia University and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. They show the cumulative reported coronavirus deaths since February and made projections for the next four weeks in the United States.

"As of May 11, all [12 models] forecast an increase in deaths in the

coming weeks and a cumulative total exceeding 100,000 by June 1," he tweeted.

The CDC notes that the models are based on varying assumptions about how Americans are following social distancing guidelines and other measures aimed at curbing the spread of the virus, reports Politico.

The coronavirus has already infected more than 1.4 million Americans, and killed more than 84,700, according to tracking by Johns Hopkins University.

The architecture of the application for the airCloud Pro is such that, with a smartphone in hand, the custodian of an air-conditioning system as large as the entire neighbourhood of Banani or as big as the shopping complex of Basundhara would be able to access, manage and troubleshoot the system from anywhere in the world.

The entire operational ecosystem of Hitachi is built as an IoT platform so that millions of devices can be plugged in to be a part of the network, meaning that options are open for air-conditioning systems of multiple networks of apartments and neighbourhoods to get integrated and be managed through a Datasoft developed app.

Maintenance and strategic planning would be carried out through artificial intelligence and machine learning applied to the collected data can further refine operational efficiency.

"It is a proud moment for us here at DataSoft and Bangladesh," Manjur Mahmud, the chief operating officer (COO) of the company, communicated with The Daily Star through WhatsApp, terming it as a very important milestone for Bangladesh's information technology sector.

Known for his penchant for short communications, the shaven-headed COO was in a joyous mood yesterday: "Every single item shown here (in the product launch) is built by our team at DataSoft. A complete team effort, and they all taste success today."

A team of 27 software professionals worked for nine months to architect a solution for the topflight Japanese company in their core product offering.

For Bangladesh, technology inflow from a highly advanced country like Japan is natural but technology outflow to Japan has so far been unprecedented. The solutions that qualify to enter the Japan market have to be cutting-edge technology and with state-of-the-art quality.

"This did not happen accidentally. We have been consistently investing in next-generation technology for years," said the chief architect behind Datasoft's rise in the global market.

Datasoft, the first software company in Bangladesh to be documented as a CMMI Level 5 software development company and among only 377 companies in the world with such qualifications, also made headlines in 2017 when it, as the first Bangladeshi company, sold IoT solutions for 10,000 smart apartments in Tokyo.

When almost all businesses

suffered terribly due to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, Datasoft seemed to have stayed out of trouble and found the future more prospective.

"Fortunately, being a tech company, we are fully functional and in full capacity by letting our colleagues work from home," Manjur said.

"Even in this crisis time, we are getting lots of enquiries: everyone wants to build digital customer engagement capabilities," he added.

Alam, who recorded several hit songs by Azad, said, "He was admitted to the hospital on May 15. He underwent a cardiac surgery at Labaid Hospital in the middle of March."

Azad was buried at his mother's grave at Azimpur graveyard last night.

He is survived by wife singer Selina Azad, and three daughters currently living in Sydney, Australia.

Azad won the National Film Awards as a singer once and as a music director twice. Bangla Academy published two volumes of his work "Bangla Khayal" in 1999.

Born in Bardhaman in 1944, he studied Indian Classical Music at the Rabindra Bharati University, Kolkata from where he received a gold medal.

Apart from being a virtuoso singer, Azad was pianist, with which he blended both the Eastern and the Western music.


He embarked on his career as a music director in the film "Miss Priyongboda" in 1962 where famous singers Hemanta Mukherjee, Sandhya Mukherjee, Pratima Bandopadhyay and Shyamal Mitra recorded songs.

After the Kolkata riots, Azad came to Dhaka and joined the then Radio Pakistan as a composer and music director. Simultaneously, he taught classical music at Chhayanaut.

Renowned Nazrul singer Sadya Afreen Mallick said, "We learnt classical music at Chhayanaut under the tutelage of Azad Rahman, who contributed a lot to music. He is a pioneer of Bangla khayal, which was supported by Channel i. He also served as the DG of Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy for two terms."

Mahbub ur Rahman said, "I am deeply saddened at the demise of the music maestro. Azad Rahman composed, sang and directed music for many famous patriotic and film songs, including 'Jonmo Amar Dhonno Holo', 'Bhalobashar Mullo Koto', 'Monero Rang-e Rangabo' and 'Shob Kota Janala Khule Dao Na.'"

Singer Khurshid Alam said he recorded several hit songs -- "Bondi pakhir Moto", "O Chokhe Chokhe Porechhe Jokhoni" and "Tomar Duhaat Dhore Shopho Nilam" -- composed by Azad, who made his debut in the movie "Gopon Kotha" and sang some powerful songs like "Bagh Chena Jaay".
