### 17 Gaibandha lawyers get HC nod to practise

The High Court yesterday cleared the way for 17 lawyers of Gaibandha to practice law. The court stayed the Gaibandha Bar

Association's decision that suspended the memberships of 17 lawyers for participating in the virtual court proceedings.

The HC also ordered the bar association not to restrain any lawyer from participating in the court functions.

The bench of Justice JBM Hassan passed the order on a suomuto (voluntary) move after Attorney General Mahbubey Alam placed the issue before the court and prayed for necessary directives.

The attorney general told the court that the courts of the country have started virtual functions through using information and communication technology in line with the ordinance issued by the president.

There is no illegality in running the virtual court proceedings and participating in the court functions by the lawyers, he said, adding that no bar association can prevent lawyers from joining the court activities.

Attorney General Mahbubey Alam told The Daily Star that Gaibandha Bar Association on May 17 suspended it's 17 members as they joined the virtual court functions through video conference.

The bar association has sent the resolution containing the suspension decision to the Supreme Court Bar Association president, he said.

## Ctg cop tests Covid-19 positive after death

Sub-inspector Ekramul Islam of Sitakunda Model Police Station under Chattogram district police, who died with Covid-19-like symptoms on Saturday, later tested positive. Police officials received his results on Saturday night.

Additional Superintendent of Police of district special branch, Mohiuddin Sohel said, "SI Ekramul Islam, 48, who died at his residence with fever and cough, was found positive for Covid-19. His sample was collected after death.'

According to the district police, 127 police personnel were infected till June 6. Before Ekram, a constable of Chattogram district police died of Covid-19 on May 21 at Chattogram General Hospital.

SI Ekramul had been suffering from fever and other Covid-19 symptoms since June 3 and taking treatment at his residence alone.

Apart from that, three police personnel of Chattogram Metropolitan Police have died from Covid-19 so far.

A total of 13 RT-PCR machines are working in all CMHs, including the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, to test samples of Covid-19 for members of the armed forces, their families and retired members. In addition, all CMHs have adequate stocks of PPE, masks, gloves and essential medicines and other medical equipment.

To date, a total of 17,151 samples from 10,378 members of the armed forces, 2,120 members of their family and 4,653 civilian members, have been tested in the PCR laboratory of the army.

Round the clock treatment of Covid-19 infected patients is being ensured by the trained army doctors in line with the guidelines of the health ministry, added the release.

Two more workers, who suffered burns in an accident at Bangladesh Steel Re-Rolling Mills (BSRM) on Saturday, died while they were being shifted to Dhaka from Chattogram for better treatment yesterday.

The deceased are Gias Uddin (24), and Nazrul Islam (35).

Earlier on Saturday, another worker --Abul Kashem (50) -- died when a fire broke out at BSRM factory in Jorarganj area of Chattogram's Mirsarai upazila.

Three other workers -- Nur Hossain (30), Mohiuddin (28), and Sikander -- were also injured in the incident.

Of them, Nur Hossain and Mohiuddin were undergoing treatment at the Burn and Plastic Surgery unit of Dhaka Medical College Hospital in critical condition.

Nur Hossain suffered 98 percent burns while Mohiuddin 80 percent, hospital sources said.

The BSRM authorities said the workers had been working inside the factory when molten iron accidentally fell on them.

Immediately, the workers were admitted to the Burn and Plastic Surgery Unit of

Chattogram Medical College Hospital. As their condition deteriorated, they were referred to Dhaka Medical College Hospital, they said.

Tapan Sen Gupta, deputy managing director of BSRM, told The Daily Star yesterday, "As per doctors' instruction, we were transferring the injured workers to Dhaka. But when the ambulance reached Cumilla, Nazrul Islam and Gias Uddin succumbed.'

We are trying to identify the cause behind the accident, he said. "BSRM always commits to safety on its premises and have created a team to investigate this unfortunate accident. BSRM Group extends its sincere condolences to the bereaved families of the victims and conveys its sympathy to those affected from this incident," said the BSRM official

Azizur Rahman, assistance director of Agrabad Fire Service and Civil Defence, said, "The accident took place around 3:15pm. When we rushed to the spot, we found that the factory workers had brought the fire under control around 3:40pm. We rescued the victims and sent them to CMCH.

IOM Iraq on Thursday delivered the first round of cash assistance in Erbil to vulnerable Bangladeshi and Filipino migrants, who have lost their jobs and income due to the pandemic, according to a report published on its official website.

Each received USD 182 to enable them to meet essential needs such as food, rent, and utilities, said the report. The recipients were referred to IOM Iraq by their respective embassies.

It commenced screening of over 100 individuals in late April using a vulnerability assessment tool, and expects to receive further referrals.

After getting approval, they started their endeavour with 32 volunteers and five ambulances, he said.

He said they also wash, clean and dress the bodies.

"In many cases, locals appreciated our initiative when we went to bury a deceased in their locality while some did not want us to be there. But we continued with our efforts," he added.

Farid Uddin urged people to donate them PPE, masks, gloves and face shields so that they can perform the burial works efficiently in the coming days.

Arshad Ali, a member of the foundation, said in a crisis, everyone should try their best to help others any way they can.

Contacted, Sheikh Fazle Rabbi, surgeon of Chattogram district, said are grateful to the foundation. "Wit their support, the task of mana coronavirus related deaths would been really difficult for us," he added.
