Injured in BSF firing, youth dies

A Bangladeshi youth, who was shot and wounded allegedly by the Indian Border Security Force (BSF) in Sunamganj's Tahirpur upazila on Saturday afternoon, died at a hospital in Sylhet the same

deceased identified as Jewel Miah, 29, son of Afzal Miah of Badaghat area in Tahirpur upazila.

Maksudul Alam, director of BGB 28 Battalion, said during flash flood timbers and tree trunks are being smuggled from India through the Jadukata river.

On Saturday afternoon, deceased Jewel some of his cohorts were collecting the timber and tree trunks from the river, boarding on an engine boat, he said, adding that, as they crossed the border and entered around 100 metres inside the Indian territory Indian border guards opened fire on leaving them, critically injured.

Later, injured Jewel was admitted to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries around 9:00pm the same night, Lt Col Maksudul said.

From parlour to plantation

Indigenous beauticians of Madhupur now toiling at fruit orchards for survival

Only three months ago, Thanchi Mri would spend her days giving women beauty treatments in air-conditioned rooms of a parlour in Dhaka.

The hours were long but each month she made around Tk 17,000 enough to support herself in the capital and her grandparents in Chunia village of Tangail's Madhupur upazila.

However, the coronavirus pandemic changed everything in a jiffy. On March 15, the parlour closed down to stem Covid-19 and Thanchi returned home penniless.

Now she toils as a labourer under the blazing sun in pineapple and banana plantations of the upazila.

"I have become used to working in airconditioned rooms for the last seven year. Now working at plantations with a spade and a sickle is proving quite difficult," cried the 24-year-old beautician.

Thanchi now makes only Tk 250 a day, that too only four days a week.

Beautician Lakkhi Rani, who returned from a parlour in Jamalpur to Madhupur's Maguntinagar village, could not even manage plantation work.

With a sick mother at home and a debt to repay, she is grappling to make it through every day.

Lakkhi, who used to earn Tk 14,000 per month, came back home emptyhanded on March 13 without any salary.

"I couldn't find any job in my village. I have heard that many other girls like me are working as day labourers in the banana and pineapple orchards. But no one gave me work," Lakkhi told The Daily Star on Wednesday.

She said her parlour owner contacted her recently and told her to look for work

Now Lakkhi is worried about repaying a loan that she took from a NGO for her mother's ulcer treatment. "Although I did not pay the loan

else gave us anything. I can't describe how our days are going by," she added.

Several hundred beauticians from the indigenous communities of Madhupur upazila, returned home after losing their jobs due to the coronavirus situation. They don't know when their beauty parlours will open. Most of these women are very poor and have nothing but a

The hands that once applied make-

up on women's faces now cut through the hard earth with spade and sickle at banana and pineapple orchards or paddy fields for nominal wages.

Eugin Nokrek, a indigenous leader in Madhupur and also president of Joinshahi Adivasi Unnayan Parishad, told The Daily Star that about 1,100 indigenous women of about 40 villages in the Madhupur forest area used to work in various beauty parlours across the country including the capital.

Swelling Teesta floods peanut fields in Rangpur

A large portion of the peanut fields in the raised sandy basin of the Teesta river in three upazilas of Rangpur has been flooded due to the sudden rise of water level, only a few days before the usual harvesting time.

"But, half of the peanut field has A large number of poor landless already gone under water. Many farmers of the area collected peanut from under the water to minimise their loss," he said, adding that water level of the Teesta started rapidly swelling on June 20.

Usually the Teesta swells in July, but this year it happened early due to heavy rain across the region, which areas of the three upazilas have been caused massive losses to the crop,

Through peanut farming, the

It is possible to produce 25 maunds (a maund = 40 kg) of peanut in an acre and a kg of peanut sells at Tk 80, said the farmers.

Many farmers harvested the peanut in premature condition as the water level of the Teesta started rising, said Sirajul Islam of Dhusmara Char.

"We are more worried as wholesale buyers from other districts are not coming this season to buy the peanut due to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic," he said.
