Testing fee for whose benefit?

Covid-19 testing fees at govt hospitals will discourage poor to get tested, help the virus spread further, experts fear

A little over two months ago, the chief of the country's health directorate in an interview with an Indian magazine narrated Bangladesh government's position on Covid-19 testing, saying the tests were free of costs.

"Our government policy is that anyone who gets infected with Covid-19 -- rich or poor -- is a government patient. We will take care of them, for free. Our priority is to test everyone," Prof Abul Kalam Azad, director general of the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), told The Caravan in late April.

"To make sure that happens, we have provided PCR tests to private laboratories for free on the condition that they would not charge the patients," he added.

Highest 64 deaths in one day

Covid-19 death toll now 1,847

The authorities yesterday reported 64 more Covid-19 deaths, the highest in a single day, and 3,682 new cases of infection.

The death toll has now reached 1,847 and total cases jumped to 145,483, Prof Nasima Sultana, additional director general of the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS), said during yesterday's briefing.

The previous highest single day death cases -- 53 -- were reported on June

Budget passed amid pandemic challenge

Analysts still observe it's difficult to implement

The Jatiya Sangsad yesterday passed the Tk 568,000-crore national budget for fiscal 2020-21, which, according to experts, may prove difficult to implement amid the coronavirus pandemic.

With the theme "Economic Transition and Pathway to Progress," the budget was passed by voice vote with Speaker Shirin Sharmin Chaudhury in the chair. It comes into effect today.

Earlier on June 11, Finance Minister AHM Mustafa Kamal placed the budget in the House with an ambitious GDP growth target of 8.2 percent, focusing on health sector development and economic recovery amid Covid-19 pandemic.

Many experts, however, termed the GDP growth target impractical.

Health minister under fire at JS

Health Minister Zahid Maleque yesterday came under fire in parliament from opposition BNP and Jatiya Party MPs due to his ministry's alleged failure to tackle the Covid-19 pandemic and ensure treatment and testing facilities to the coronavirus infected people.

Participating in a cut-motion discussion on the Health Services Division's demand of Tk 22,883.86 crore from the budget allocation, a JP lawmaker even demanded that the prime minister replace Zahid Maleque with former agriculture minister Matia Chowdhury.

Refuting all allegations, the health minister said his ministry had taken proper measures to tackle the Covid-19 and that was the reason for lower death rate in Bangladesh
