# Life expectancy at birth rises

Life expectancy at birth for Bangladeshis has risen to 72.6 years because of what experts said was progress made in health care and economy.

This marks a rise of 1.7 years since 2015, according to the Sample Vital Registration System (SVRS) 2019 launched yesterday by the Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS).

It was 72.3 in 2018, said the report unveiled by Planning Minister MA Mannan.

Women's life expectancy in 2019 was 74.2, higher than men's 71.1.

Experts attribute these to economic development, expansion of health services, better access to health care facilities and improvement in nutrition. SEE PAGE 10 COL 5

# Jute workers postpone demo

Decide to start work today, wait for official word

Workers of nine state-owned jute mills in the Khulna region last night postponed their demonstrations demanding cancellation of the decision to close all government jute mills.

Bangladesh Jute Workers Protection CBA and Non-CBA Sangram Committee said workers would join their work today as they did not receive any letter from the authorities concerned regarding closure of the jute mills.

Earlier in the day, the workers staged a sit-in with their family members in front of their factories. They demonstrated for the second consecutive day.

Over 30,000 permanent and temporary workers of five jute mills in Khulna city, two mills in Khulna's Atra industrial area and two mills in Jashore are taking part in the protest.

There are 8,100 permanent workers in these jute mills, while the number of temporary workers is 30,000.

Visiting at least four jute mills, including Crescent and Platinum, in the city's Khalishpur area, this correspondent found hundreds of workers were demonstrating on their respective mill premises.

They were chanting slogans against the government decision.

### Wasa to collect raised water tariffs

The Supreme Court has cleared the way for the Dhaka Water Supply and Sewerage Authority (Wasa) to collect the hiked price of water it had fixed earlier.

The apex court yesterday stayed a High Court order for 16 weeks that issued injunction till August 10 on the Dhaka Wasa's decision of hiking the water tariff to 25 percent since April 1 this year.

Chamber judge of the Appellate Division of the SC Justice Md Nuruzzaman passed the order following a petition filed by Dhaka Wasa seeking stay on the HC order of injunction. Following a writ petition, the HC bench of Justice M Enayetur

### Anger as China | Indian vaccine gets approves HK nod for human trials security law

Modi extends free ration scheme till Nov as some cities extend lockdowns

Bharat Biotech's Covid-19 vaccine has been approved for human trials, making it India's first domestic candidate to get the green light from the government's drug regulator as cases surge in a country with more than 1.3 billion people.

The Drug Controller General of India has approved the company's application to conduct a Phase I and II clinical trial of Covaxin, which was developed along with the Indian Council of Medical Research's National Institute of Virology, the company said in a statement on Monday.
