Community clinics provide helpful service in remote areas

More people in Bagerhat approach the local treatment facilities, avoiding distant hospitals during Covid-19 pandemic

The number of patients in the community clinics sees a steady rise as the common people prefer to get health services at the locality instead of going to upazila and district hospitals during the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic.

There are 205 community clinics, mostly in remote areas, in nine upazilas of Bagerhat district.

Of them, 32 community clinics are in Bagerhat Sadar, 51 in Morrelganj, 19 in Sharankhola, 13 in Mongla, 12 in Kachua, 24 in Rampal, 16 in Fakirhat, 19 in Chitalmari and 19 in Mollahat upazila.

In each of the clinics, a community health care provider (CHCP) gives regular services five days a week from 9:00am to 3:00pm while a health assistant and a family welfare assistant are employed for field level service three days a week.

Rasul Islam Rubel, CHCP at Tengrakhal Community Clinic in Kachua upazila, said 35 to 40 patients come to the clinic on an

average every day. "I have got two PPEs, five masks and hand sanitizer from the upazila health office.

We are providing regular services to the grassroots people amid risk as many patients have a lot in common with the symptoms of a coronavirus infection.

"Patients come to us with fever, runny nose, cough, sore throat, stomach ache, headache, vomiting and diarrhoea. We try our best to serve them, along with giving awareness advice," he said.

Runa, 36, of Tangrakhal area, said she got medicine for fever and runny nose when she went to the community clinic.

"This community clinic gives much service when we do not want to go to the upazila health complex in the time of corona. We get medicine free of cost here," said a woman who came with her two-year-old baby suffering from fever.

Malina Biswas, CHCP at Malipatan Community Clinic, said, "I have got PPE but as our clinic has no electricity it is impossible to

wear it during the hot weather. We are serving around 40 patients daily, most of them women and children."

Kachua Upazila Health and Family Planning Officer Md Monjurul Alam said they provided PPEs, masks, and hand sanitisers to CHCPs of 12 community clinics in the upazila for protection from coronavirus infection.

"In this critical period, the community clinics are providing regular health services to the grassroots people. Our health complex has also continued treatment. Two Covid-19 patients have already cured and three others are under treatment here. Our pharmacist Abul Kalam Azad, who regularly served the patients, has been tested Covid-19 positive," he said.

Bagerhat Civil Surgeon KM Humayun Kabir said, "Safety equipment has been provided by the district health office as staff of the community clinics are serving the people in remote areas during the coronavirus outbreak. We are also trying to increase the capacity of community clinics."

Kuakata Rakhine market's field remains inundated for half the year

The only ground in front of Kuakata Rakhine Mahila Market in Kalapara upazila of the district remains under water for six months of the year due to lack of proper drainage system. The field is used for public meetings, cultural functions and as helipad. Different political parties also arrange their party meetings here.

Apart from this, local youths use the field for playing cricket, football, volleyball and badminton.

The field remains inundated in the rainy season, especially from May to October every year, much to the trouble for tourists and locals. Tourists from home and abroad visit the area as there are several hundred of shops including the stores of Rakhine around the field.

The problem mainly arose during monsoon as the water cannot go outside due to lack of proper drainage system, said locals.

Local cultural organisation arranges different programmes on the ground marking the Victory Day and Independence Day as Kuakata municipality has built a stage on the eastern side of the field.

Uchuw, a female trader at the mahila market, said the field was open earlier and rainwater could drain away easily, but recently many structures have been built around the field, blocking the flow of water.

Customers feel uncomfortable while visiting the market during the time as their dress often get wet, she added.

Asadul Haque, a tourist from Pirojpur,

said it is very sad that the field now remains under rainwater but when he visited the area during summer two years back, it was very attractive spot.

Lucky Begum, another tourist from Barisal, said many people visit Kuakata and buy different goods from the Rakhine mohila market but now it is very difficult to buy anything from the market as the field is filled with rainwater.

The authority concerned should take immediate steps to remove water from the field considering interest of local businessmen including Rakhine community, she said.

Locals said, Kalapara upazila administration built two separate helipads on the field but these helipads lie useless during monsoon as the ground remains under rainwater.

Rumman Intiaz Tushar, owner of Kuakata Elish Park, said despite repeated pleas, the authorities concerned are yet to take any steps to remove water from the field.

Hossain Amir, a cultural activist in Kuakata area, said they cannot arrange cultural function here as the field remains under water for six months of the year.

Contacted, Kuakata municipality Mayor Abdul Bareq Mollah said they are implementing a drainage project in the municipality area, but its work has been hampered due to rainfall for several weeks.

Once the drainage work is completed, waterlogging problem in the area will reduce significantly, said the mayor.
