

WATERLOGGING DUE TO POOR DRAINAGE Mother plants dying at Savar horticulture centre

Heavy downpour in the past few weeks has brought many problems for the government-run Horticulture Centre in Savar's Rajalakh, an institution that has been instrumental for widespread tree plantation in the area.

The centre provides saplings at low prices to encourage people to plant and grow trees. However, due to heavy water logging after rain, the mother plants at the nursery are dying.

Savar municipality's subpar drainage system has caused the waterlogging problem, according to Horticulture Centre staff.

Sheikh Iffat Ara Islam, a horticulturist at the centre said the institution was established in 1972 and since then it has been providing grafted and other saplings to people at a low price. "We have given Tk 10 lakhs and 10 thousand as revenue to the government by sailing grafting and other saplings last year," she said.

But since last year, water logging has hampered production and many mother plants including dragonfruit, rambutan, pink jackfruit and orange (locally called malta) have died due to water logging, said Iffat Ara Islam. She says the unplanned drainage system of the municipality is to blame for this.

The centre currently has no mother plants left for rambutan and pink jackfruit, while the dragonfruit and orange plants are severely damaged. Centre personnel estimate that over 100 plants have suffered in this time.

"We have requested the mayor to solve the drainage issue in a letter last month, but there has been little progress," she said, "This is dangerous for the plants."

The centre's revenue will decrease if this continues.

On a visit to the centre last week, this correspondent found at least 6.72 acres submerged in knee-deep water. Many mother plants were severely damaged or on the verge of dying.

Enamul Haque, a returning customer of the centre, said, "We buy both grafting and other saplings at Tk 15-100 from here. It's prices are very good and people can easily take up gardening using these saplings."

However Enamul hasn't been able to collect a few saplings of choice as the mother plants are too damaged.

Shariful Imam, executive engineer of Savar Municipality said about a week ago, "After receiving the letter we visited the horticulture centre and already setup a pipe to remove the water logging problem."

However, the pipe could do little for the centre. The engineer explained that there is another drain, but it has not been effective as it is at a higher ground level and water from the centre doesn't flow in that direction.

"Setting up the correct drainage system can be the permanent solution for the horticulture centre," he said, "I will visit again and try to make better arrangements."

Secy denies

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shifted to Rail Bhaban. Currently, the ministry is working on one floor, with some rooms on two other floors.

Talking to this correspondent, a mid-level BR official said: "In my personal opinion, it would be good in the long run if the ministry is shifted from Rail Bhaban. However, it would reduce BR officials' access to the minister."

Explaining the matter, he said ministry officials think as minister is readily available at Rail bhaban, BR officials can go to him and change their decisions easily, which is undermining the ministry officials. So they wanted to move the office to the secretariat. "But BR has to wait for more time to get any final decision," he said wishing anonymity.

On the other hand, high-ups of BR are in dilemma over the issue, as they would lose the easy access to the minister if the ministry is shifted.

But they support the move to shift the ministry as their subordinates can now directly talk with ministry officials, even "lobby" to change BR decisions, which undermines high-ups' authority, he said.

"So, they support the move for establishing strong chain of command. A strong chain of control in BR is need for its betterment in long run," he said.

A joint secretary, who was present at the meeting, said: "The discussion to shift

the ministry [from Rail Bhaban] has been going on for long. Now it comes to the fore again. But it would take quite long time to implement the decision."

Contacted yesterday, BR's Director General Md Shamsuzzaman said, "I have no idea about it. Besides, I have no jurisdiction to comment over it. You better talk to the secretary [of railways ministry]."

INCREASING MANPOWER
Besides, the ministry is also going to take a move for increasing its manpower and restructuring its organogram, the meeting minutes said.

According to the ministry's annual report for 2018-19, it has a 135 officers and staffers. This correspondent could not know whether the number has been changed in last one year.

"Manpower of the ministry has to be increased. A new cell -- Reform Management and Policy Research -- has to be established and the organogram of the ministry has to be restructure after increasing manpower. Quick steps have to be taken to reshape the manpower structure," reads the meeting minutes.

Officials concerned were asked to take immediate steps in this regard.

The meeting also asked the officials concerned to take steps for publishing ministry's activities through its website and Facebook page.

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Contacted, the administrator reiterated his zero-tolerance stance against corruption. "During my short tenure, I would like to bring some positive changes to the city," said Sujan.

COVID-19 INFECTIONS

66pc recovery rate among lower court personnel

The rate of recovery from Covid-19 infection among lower court personnel and staff is 66 percent, while there have been less than one percent fatal cases.

The recovery rate in the lower judiciary is eight percent higher than that of the national recovery rate and the death rate in this sector (lower courts) is 0.75 percent less than the national death rate, according to the information provided by the coronavirus monitoring desk under the law ministry.

It said a total of 73 lower court judges and 277 staff members have been infected with Covid-19 and among them 46 judges and 185 staff members have recovered till Saturday.

Currently, 27 judges and 102 employees are suffering from Covid-19. Of the infected judges, 25 are receiving treatment at their homes while two are receiving treatment at hospitals, law ministry sources said on Sunday.

Law Minister Anisul Huq has been observing and giving necessary directives to the ministry's monitoring desk, which assists infected judges and staffers by facilitating proper treatment.

Law Secretary Md Golam Sarwar reports to the minister periodically regarding this matter, according to sources.

Engage youths

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to the theme of this year's International Youth Day, "Youth Engagement for Global Action".

TIB also demanded a corruption-free recruitment process in all public and private sectors, and ensuring an equal competition on the basis of merit and qualities.
