### Turkey must drop 'threats' for talks to begin: Greek PM

Greece denied late Thursday that it had agreed to hold NATO-brokered talks with Turkey to de-escalate tensions over maritime borders and gas exploration rights.

The draft policy says from now on, a newspaper will need registration to run its online version if its contents in the online and the print editions are

Licensed television and radio channels will also require the registration to run their news online.

"If contents of the print and online versions of a newspaper are the same, it won't need approval [registration]. If newspapers bring variation [to the contents] in the online version, they will require to get registered," Cabinet Secretary Khandker Anwarul Islam had said at a briefing at the secretariat after the cabinet meeting.

"Newspapers are usually doing this [changing contents in the online version from the printed one]," he

Political parties and different organisations, including Transparency accepting applications for registration International Bangladesh, expressed grave concern over the government's directive to separately register all online portals of the country, particularly those of the long serving national dailies and TV channels.

# Australian writer detained in China denies spying: lawyer

An Australian writer detained in China for 19 months on spying charges has insisted he is innocent, his lawyer told AFP yesterday, after being allowed to see his client for the first time. Beijing has said little about the case

of Chinese-born Yang Jun -- who also goes by the pen name Yang Hengjun since he was taken into custody in January last year during a rare visit to China, prompting Australian government protests.

Yang's case is one of many points of tension between China and Australia, with the two sides at loggerheads over trade and the coronavirus, and competing for influence in the Pacific. "He denies the prosecution's
