# Watermelon on canopies around fishing ponds: a success story

Many farmers in Bagerhat's Sadar upazila are raking in good profits, sometimes up to 120 percent, by growing an off-season variety of watermelon on the banks of fishing ponds.

Under a project titled 'National Agricultural Technology Programme (NATP, Phase 2)', the Department of Agricultural Extension (DAE) in the upazila is providing technical know-how and assistance to farmers in cultivating the watermelon variety named 'Black Horse'.

Taking advantage of easy access to irrigation water from fishing ponds, a farmer can make a profit between Tk 30 thousand and Tk 35 thousand out of an investment between Tk 25 thousand and Tk 30 thousand on one bigha of land.

Enticed by the prospect, a growing number of farmers are trying their luck on the 'Black Horse' in the district.

Currently, the 'Black Horse' is being cultivated on 10 acres of land in Bagerhat Sadar upazila alone, said Sadiya Sultana, agriculture officer in the upazila.

They have been providing all sorts of support to interested farmers as the variety is less prone



to diseases, delicious and most importantly, profitable, she added.

Bibha Mandol, from Purbo Sayera village in Sadar upazila, is among the farmers who found success in cultivating 'Black Horse' watermelon on three and a half bighas of land around two fishing ponds.

She said her total expense on the garden was Tk 7 thousand as she was able to save some money that she would otherwise need to spend

on mesh canopies, supported by bamboo, around the ponds. She already had the canopies set up on the banks of the ponds from one of her previous farming projects. Besides, she saved an additional amount by not engaging any paid labourer at the garden.

She succeeded in growing 350 plants of the 'Black Horse' variety and the plants started to bear fruits 45 to 60 days later. She so far sold nearly 70 maunds of

the watermelon, which weighed between three and seven kilograms each. Each of the fruit is selling for about Tk 100 to Tk 280, depending on weight.

Since the profit margin on 'Black Horse' watermelon is higher than that of many vegetables such as cucumber or pumpkin, she is planning on planting more of the variety, she also said.

Another farmer, Joydeb Das, from the same village, spent Tk 25 thousand to grow the watermelon on nearly 33 decimals of land surrounding his fishing pond.

This is a more convenient way of looking after the fish farm, while at the same time, irrigating the watermelon garden with water from the pond, he added.

Farmer Nazmul Alam, who cultivated the variety on four bighas of land in the same village, said he would grow 'Black Horse' watermelon in a larger area next year as market response he received toward the variety has been quite positive.

After learning about the prospect of making higher profits, many farmers growing other crops are also expressing interest in cultivating 'Black Horse', he added.

# Carron trade changes his lot amid pandemic

Parvej earns Tk 30,000 from selling the boards per month

A carron factory owner in Jhenidah is earning good profit by making boards amid coronavirus situation as the game of carron has become very popular in the district during the current ongoing pandemic situation.

Workers of the factory said they are busy making carron boards all the day long amid the pandemic as its demand is very high now. They work till 10:00pm at the factory every day.

Parvej Hasan, 26, son of Md Reazuddin of Arpara village in Kaliganj upazila, is the owner of the factory named 'Reazuddin wood house'.

While talking to this correspondent on Monday noon, the factory owner said due to extreme poverty, he had to give up his study in 2008 when he was the student of Class VIII and started to work at a local furniture factory.

He further said his father has no land and it is tough for his father to run their eight-member family. They live on three decimals of land. In 2009, he was again admitted at Class IX under Open University. He will sit for the degree exam this year.

He added that he set up this factory in

2019 where seven workers work every day.

Before March 8, he sold only 60 carron boards but during the pandemic, he is selling 100 pieces per month. During this time, the demand of carron has increased surprisingly. Especially the students are buying carron boards as their schools and colleges remain closed due to coronavirus outbreak. They pass time at home by playing carron.

Besides, the traders of Dhaka and Chattogram are purchasing a good number of carron boards from him during the situation, said Parvej.

They make carron boards in different sizes. A small sized board costs around Tk 800/900 to make and they sell at Tk 1200/1300 while a large sized board costs at Tk 2500/2600 to make and it is sold at Tk 3000/3500.

He added that he earns Tk 25000/30000 from selling the carron boards per month.

Arafat Hossain, a student of class nine at Government Naldanga Bhusan Pilot Secondary School, said he has bought a carron board from Parvej.

He along with his sisters play carron during the time as their school is closed, said Arafat.

# EPZ workers suffer as bridge lies with no approach roads

Nearly six thousand workers of different factories at Uttara Export Processing Zone (EPZ) in Nilphamari are suffering immensely while communicating to their destinations as a bridge on Chandrakura Canal is lying without approach roads for a year.

The 33-foot-long and 18-foot wide bridge on Darwani-Khansama road at Joychondi village under Sonarai union of the district is the only way of communication for hundreds of workers from surrounding 20 villages and it is only 400 metres from the boundary wall of Uttara EPZ.

Sadar Upazila Engineer of Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) Nuruddin Ahmed said Shah Anwar construction, a private owned company, was given the work order to construct the 33-foot-long and 18-foot wide concrete bridge on Chandrakura Canal along with 1,800 metre approach roads on both sides at a cost of Tk 1.53 crore.

Although the contractor concern completed the bridge construction work about a year ago, but kept the approach roads on both ends incomplete due to unknown reasons, causing untold suffering to thousands of villagers, especially the EPZ workers.

Shah Ahasan Habib Babu, convenor of Jagrato Sonarai, a voluntary organization, said this is just an utter negligence of LGED as they are yet to take any action against the contractor concern though the deadline of the work expired over a year ago.

Seventy-year-old Naliny Roy of the area said as this is the only way of communication for them, local people built a makeshift wooden-bridge six months ago.

Mousumi Akhtar, a worker of a factory at EPZ, said they often have to face odd situation while crossing the makeshift wooden bridge as both ends remain crowded during office time.

She said sometimes they even fail to attend their workplace in time.

#### 2. Scope of Services:

The Financial Management Specialist (FMS) will assist the Project Director and Project Implementation Unit by providing requisite services with regard to the management of the financial aspects under the preparation of BEST project.
