Presidential candidate Badal Roy reiterated his withdrawal from the upcoming Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) polls, citing illness, and apologised to the organisers at the grassroots level.

"I am announcing again that I have pulled out of the elections because the condition of my health is not good. The organisers at grassroots level are really helpless and my mind cries for them. I don't know how they will take it, but I feel they will be hurt. Despite that, I am officially withdrawing from the elections," incumbent BFF vicepresident Roy said at a press briefing in Motijheel yesterday, six days after first announcing that he would not compete in the October 3 polls.

The former footballer added: "Today I have come here with a broken mind. I have been with football for a long period and I always talk, criticise and protest in regards to football. But I never spoke against any person. I could not give much time to my family due to football. I cannot live without football. I have no allegations against anyone. The only allegation is that the responsibility of failure has to be borne by everyone but unfortunately there is no such responsibility at the BFF."

After allegedly facing pressure from some quarters to pull out, Roy, one of three candidates for the post of president, applied for a withdrawal on September 12. However,

he submitted his withdrawal form after the deadline and so it was not considered by the election commission.

There were also whispers that pressure from those quarters had forced Roy to appear before the media to declare his withdrawal officially.

"There is no pressure on me from any quarter. It is a personal problem. I recovered from Covid-19 recently and am facing health pressure," said Roy, who however later pointed a finger at incumbent president Kazi Salahuddin.

"There may be a legal problem because I withdrew after the deadline. Mr Salahuddin has a lot of power and he could have solved this problem but I don't know why I am being harassed. I think everyone has to contest in the elections and the councillors will take the final decision," said Roy. "But I am pulling out with a lot of pain because everyone know I wanted to contest in elections because the BFF needs change in its leadership. Although we had before started work with Salahuddin bhai with pride, he never took advice to work at the grassroots.

IPL starting without the buzz

After months of uncertainty due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the delayed season of the Indian Premier League will kick off in the UAE on Saturday with a clash between defending champions Mumbai Indians and Chennai Super Kings.

The 2020 edition of the T20 league was originally scheduled to begin on March 29 in India but had to be postponed indefinitely by the country's cricket board due to worsening situation of the pandemic.

IPL's cancellation would have meant a potential \$534 million loss in revenue, leading the board to shift the tournament out of India. The postponement of this year's Twenty20 World Cup in Australia because of the pandemic also helped. It

It will not be the first time that the competition has had to be held outside India. The 2009 edition took place in South Africa as it coincided with India's general elections and the UAE hosted the early matches of the eight-team tournament five years later for the same reason.

But finding a host country was not the only challenge in organising the IPL for the Indian board as the tournament lost its title sponsor a month before its scheduled start.

Amid a growing backlash against Chinese companies in India and a weak business environment following the pandemic, smartphone maker Vivo pulled out of this year's edition. Fantasy gaming company Dream11 came in as a replacement, paying the league 50% less than Vivo, which had secured the 2018-2022 rights for nearly

"When you encounter such challenging times and the tournament faced such impediments, you are bound to lose on certain revenues," BCCI treasurer Arun Sigh Dhumal told Reuters. "Looking at the overall picture, one should be happy that at least something is happening in this environment."

There will, however, be some notable

absentees at this year's event.

The English duo of Chris Woakes and Jason Roy and Sri Lanka pacer Lasith Malinga have all pulled out.

Rohit Sharma will lead defending champions Mumbai Indians to the field against Mahendra Singh Dhoni's Chennai Super Kings in the opening match of Dream 11 IPL 2020 in Abu Dhabi today.

Age is just a number

While male cricketers have returned to training with a set target in mind, the same cannot be said about women cricketers as the Bangladesh Cricket Board is yet to schedule a series for the Tigresses in the pandemic era. Since the halt in cricketing activities, The Daily Star has been talking to women cricketers to learn stories of their early days. In today's instalment, we talk to Shamima Sultana, the wicketkeeper batter who was the top scorer for Bangladesh during their 2018 Asia Cup triumph.

How often is it that people shy away from something doing because they

think they are too old to do that? Bangladesh wicketkeeper batter Shamima Sultana is different from everyone in that regard. And hence, Bangladesh -- fifth highest overall her story of emergence is also unique and different from most of her teammates.

Shamima never thought of age as a barrier. The now 32-year-old made her debut for the national side back in 2014 at the age of 26 -- an age by which most cricketers already make a name for themselves. Shamima's late entry to the international stage was owing to the fact that she had not even started playing professional cricket before she was 22.

"If you are persistent and have immense love for what you do then you can succeed in that at

any age -- be it sport or any other work," Shamima said during an interview with this reporter.

Even after starting later than usual, Shamima's persistence and love for the sport did bear fruit. The girl from a small village named Kamlapur in the Sreepur upazila was the highest run scorer for -- when they etched their names in the history book by winning the Asia Cup in 2018 -- first major international trophy won by a Bangladeshi side. Before that, Shamima also became the first Bangladeshi player to have scored a half-century in their South Africa tour in 2017.

Shamima's love for the sport has however remained since her childhood. But her path that led to the international stage had been a bumpy one due to injuries.

"I used to play different kinds of sports since I was four or five. I remember playing with bats made



from tree branches with the local boys in my village. Although my father was a farmer, he or any of my family members never stopped me from playing with boys.

"In 2008, I went to Dhaka

to play in the national league. I was then asked to play as a wicketkeeper but I had never even touched gloves prior to that. In 2011, I was a stand-by as a wicketkeeper-batter for the national side. I got called in the national side the following year. Since 2013, I had been called and dropped from the national side a number of times, mostly due to injuries. I suffered from a torn ligament in 2014 and I was not directly called back in the side after recovering. I was only called after I played well in the Premier League in 2015. But again I was dropped before the 2016 World Cup," Shamima told about her struggles.

There were a lot of ups and downs in Shamima's career. But one thing that the 32-year-old never did was giving up. And as she opined, age could never be a barrier for her as she was persistent about pursuing her dream.

BCB asks McMillan, Vettori to fly to Dhaka

The Bangladesh Cricket Board has asked the national team's spin bowling consultant Daniel Vettori and newly appointed batting consultant Craig McMillan to come to Bangladesh ahead of the upcoming Sri Lanka tour.

Both Vettori and McMillan were previously expected to travel directly to Sri Lanka from New Zealand and join the Tigers, but BCB CEO Nizamuddin Chowdhury said the board has asked both Kiwi coaches to first arrive in Bangladesh.

"As there are some complications regarding the flights for Colombo, we have asked Vettori and McMillan to first come to Bangladesh and then travel with the team together," Nizamuddin told The Daily Star yesterday.

The fate of the upcoming Sri Lanka tour is still uncertain as the BCB is yet to get any update regarding the revised health protocols.

Inter's mission to end **Juventus** domination

Antonio Conte begins his second season as Inter Milan coach with a mission to stop SERIE A his former club Juventus winning a 10th consecutive Serie A title.

Conte led Juve to the first three of their current run of nine straight league crowns starting in 2012 before moving on to coach Italy and Chelsea, taking over Inter in May last year.

The 51-year-old's turbulent first season with Inter was played out against a backdrop of the coronavirus pandemic which caused havoc in northern Italy before spreading across Europe.

The fiery Italian looked poised to leave after a dramatic outburst following Inter's Europa League final loss to Sevilla, despite finishing just one point behind Juve in the league.

"Î'm not going backwards. I don't want another year like that," he said, blasting lack of support from team management.

Clear the air talks persuaded him the club's Chinese owners shared his burning ambitions to lift a first Serie A title since 2010, the year of their historic treble under Jose Mourinho.

"I have never seen someone who works so hard, with such intensity, like Conte, this characteristic also unites us," said Inter president Steven Zhang. "Reflection was necessary, I found our coach serene, constructive, far from the

moods we were told by the media.

"Inter have a mission, a plan, strategies aimed naturally towards victory... I really believe that the path taken is the right one."

As Serie A returns behind closed doors this weekend, both Inter and Atalanta have been given a one-week delay because of their European exertions last month.

Inter's first match will be against Fiorentina on September 26, followed by a trip to newly-promoted Benevento in their rescheduled

opening day fixture four days later. Gian Piero Gasperini's Atalanta meanwhile start at Torino a few hours before Inter begin their season and then travel to Lazio in their postponed

first round match.
