Meanwhile, some traders are selling onions at a low price at Ghojadanga port to minimize their losses, said Kanti Dutta, general secretary of C&F agents association in Ghojadanga, over phone.

In Dinajpur, at least 11 trucks carrying 246 tonnes of Indian onion entered Bangladesh through Hili Land Port in Hakimpur Upazila on Saturday.

But most of the onions have been rotten, said Harun Ur Rashid president of Importers and Exporters Group of the port.

Trucks were stranded for a few days. These onions have been rotten due to hot weather and rain during, he told The Daily Star.

In Chapainawabganj, at least eight onion-laden trucks entered into Bangladesh through Sonamosjid Land Port on Saturday.

Around 10 percent of these onions have been rotten, said Babul Hasna Durul, an onion importer.

health condition, as a final health check-up will be held before the take-off.

"We will be able to tell exactly how many will return after their boarding tomorrow [today]," he told this newspaper by phone.

Confirming IOM's assistance in the repatriation process, the ambassador said previously a primary health check-up of the returnees was completed after they got registered with the embassy.

He said because of a deteriorating political situation, direct international flights had not been operated from Libya for quite long. The coronavirus pandemic has worsened the situation.

Amid this, the Bangladeshis who wanted to return home and also got stranded for past several months sought the embassy's help for the flight arrangement, said the ambassador.

The embassy then registered them and sought help from IOM in this regard, he said.

IOM will soon arrange another chartered flight for a similar repatriation, he added.

According to the ambassador, Libva is home to about 20,000 to 25,000 Bangladeshis.

On the other hand, different

international organisations, especially IOM, assessed the number could be nearly 20,000.

Libya was plunged into chaos when a NATO-backed uprising in 2011 toppled longtime ruler Muammar Gaddafi, who was later killed, according to Al Jazeera.

The Tripoli-based Government of National Accord was founded in 2015 under a UN-led agreement, but efforts for a long-term political settlement failed after a series of military offensives by forces loyal to Khalifa Haftar.

When the current conflict in Libya began in February 2011, many of the migrant communities were left to fend for themselves, some abandoned by their employers in remote areas with limited supplies.

In May this year, 26 Bangladeshi migrants were murdered by alleged human traffickers in the city of Mizdah

Meanwhile, conflicts between the Myanmar military and insurgent group Arakan Army (AA) have escalated in Kachin and Rakhine states in recent months, which rights groups say amounts to war crimes and crimes against humanity.

Experts say Myanmar could use the conflict with AA as a pretext to drive out Rohingyas ahead of the national elections in early November.

In the letter to the UNSC, Bangladesh Permanent Mission to UN said on September 10 that four Myanmar Navy logistics ships anchored off the coast of Inn Din village and disembarked the troops, who were then carried overnight by 20 civilian fishing boats along the Naaf River to locations as far as Ngar Khu Ya village, 20km north of Maungdaw Township and close to the Myanmar-Bangladesh border.

In the early morning of September 11, around 1,000 Myanmar troops landed in different locations. Some of the disembarking points, such as Ka Nyin Chaung, Min Ga Lar Gyi and Ngar Khu Ya, are close to the international border. The route used during the troop mobilisation was as close as 200 meters to the international boundary at least at one point

loaded with non-perishable items have to wait a long time for their turn. Taking the chance, some unscrupulous employees of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Corporation (BIWTC), a government organisation authorised to operate the ferry service, are allegedly taking extra from the lorries and getting them on ferries quickly.

Usually, around 2,500 vehicles cross the Padma daily via the Paturia-Daulatdia route, says BIWTC sources. According to the organisation, it charges trucks depending on their sizes. It takes Tk 1,460 for heavy truck, Tk 1,060 for medium ones and Tk 740 for mini-trucks.

On Friday, this correspondent talked to around 20 truck drivers, who paid the additional amount ranging from Tk 500 to Tk 1,500.

A truck driver said, "I had to pay Tk 1,000 extra to get the ferry quickly." Asked about the role of law enforcement agencies, Rifat Rahman Shamim, superintendent of Manikganj police, said BIWTC is responsible for ferry operation and maintaining queues of vehicles. Police are deployed at the ferry terminal only to prevent any kinds of criminal activities there, he said.

Contacted, Khandaker Tanvir Hossain, assistant general manager in Aricha regional office of BIWTC, denied the allegations and said he had not yet received any complaint in this regard.

"Stern actions will be taken against the responsible persons, whoever they are, if the allegations of overcharging are found true," he told The Daily Star.

In another development, ferry services on the Shimulia-Kathalbari route resumed through an alternative channel on a limited scale on Saturday. The channel was made by the

Padma bridge authorities for transporting construction materials. "As operation of ferry is not possible

through the regular channel, we will use this Padma bridge's channel on a temporary basis," said Shafiqul Islam, assistant general manager of BIWTC at Shimulia ferry terminal.

"We are working to bring back navigability in our regular channel. We will resume the service via our previous route after restoring navigability.'

Four out of 20 ferries are being operated on the Shimulia-Kathalbari route.

On September 13, the authorities concerned suspended the ferry services on the route due to poor navigability. [A correspondent from Munshigan] contributed to this report].
